JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by 415 ILCS 5/1 et. seq., specifically 415 ILCS 5/31.1.

FACTS

1. The Respondent, Gary Clover, is the present owner and in control and possession of a facility located in the County of Jackson, State of Illinois.

2. The facility is an open dump, operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit, and designated with the Site Code # 077 814 5117. The facility is known to the Agency as the Murphysboro/Gary Clover (2) site.

3. The Respondent has owned, occupied, controlled and/or operated the facility at all material times hereto.

4. On July 20, 2016, Don Terry, Field Inspector, Jackson County Health Department, inspected the facility. A true and correct copy of the inspection report, along with Mr. Terry's affidavit, are attached and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.

5. The Respondent had been previously found to have violated §21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act. Those cases are AC 04-37 and AC 10-5.

VIOLATIONS

On the basis of Field Inspector Don Terry's direct observation he has determined that the Respondent has caused or allowed open dumping at the above described facility in a manner that resulted in the following violations:

That on July 20, 2016, an inspection of the facility disclosed the following:

 The Respondent has caused or allowed litter at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1).

2. The Respondent has caused or allowed the deposition of waste in standing or flowing waters at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(4).

3. The Respondent has caused or allowed the deposition of general or clean construction or demolition debris at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the §21(p)(4) violation and Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) each for the §21(p)(1) violation and the §21(p)(7) violation because the latter are second violations for the same offenses, for a total of <u>Seven Thousand Five</u> <u>Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than October 1, 2016, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1, and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the

Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1), if Respondent fails to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, checks shall be made payable in equal amounts (50% of total penalty each) to:

- County of Jackson, c/o Jackson County Treasurer, Jackson County Courthouse, Murphsyboro, Illinois 62966; and
- (2) Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276.

Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Forms with payments to ensure proper documentation of payment. If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Complainant may either initiate proceedings against the Respondent in Circuit Court or other debt collection actions to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

You have the right to contest this Citation, pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/31.1. If you elect to contest this Citation, you must file a Petition For Review with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board. A copy of the Petition For Review shall also be filed with Daniel Brenner, Assistant State's Attorney, Jackson County Courthouse, Third Floor, Murphysboro, Il 62966. <u>YOUR PETITION FOR REVIEW MUST BE FILED WITHIN 35 DAYS OF THE DATE OF SERVICE OF THE PRESENT CITATION ON YOU. YOUR PETITION MUST STATE THE REASON(S) YOU BELIEVE THE PRESENT MATTER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED. IF YOU FAIL TO FILE YOUR PETITION AND STATE THE REASONS THE PRESENT MATTER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED, A DEFAULT ORDER AGAINST YOU WILL BE ENTERED BY THE POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD.</u>

GENERAL REMARKS

NOTE: An inspection was conducted of this site on March 16, 2016 as a follow-up to a phone conversation between this inspector and the site owner, Mr. Gary Clover {Attachment: Page 6]. The site inspection resulted in an Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) being sent to Mr. Clover. The ACWN provided Mr. Clover with direction as to: 1) what actions needed to be taken to clean-up the site, 2) the definition of "clean fill" and 3) a date by which the clean-up actions needed to be completed [Attachment: Pages 1 – 5]. At the time of this inspection, this office had not been contacted by Mr. Clover regarding the status of the clean-up or what steps he had taken to prevent further violations from occurring.

During the stated date and time, I conducted an inspection of the site listed above. This inspection was made as a follow up to a site inspection conducted on March 16, 2016 during which open dumped waste was observed. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were: Cloudy with calm winds and a temperature of approximately 79°F.

Upon arrival at the site, I went to the area labeled "Fill Area 2" on the site sketch. From E. Industrial Park Road, a public roadway, I observed that the area appeared to have been graded and leveled since my previous inspection (Photo #1, Site Sketch – Fill Area 2). I walked south along the east boundary of Fill Area 2 and observed broken concrete with metal rebar protruding from several (Photo #2, Site Sketch – Fill Area 2 – See Arrows). Along the south boundary of Fill Area 2, I observed open dumped dimensional lumber and more broken concrete with protruding rebar (Photos #3 & #4, Site Sketch – Fill Area 2). I walked to the west boundary of Fill Area 2 and observed broken concrete with protruding rebar (Photos walked to the north boundary of Fill Area 2 and observed a pile of broken concrete, soil and gravel contaminated with PVC pipe, dimensional lumber and plastic sheeting (Photo 6, Site Sketch – Fill Area 2).

I then went to the area labeled "Fill Area 1" on the Site Sketch. I walked to the east boundary of Fill Area 1 and observed an area of general construction or demolition debris open dumped and mixed with soil and other materials (Photos #7 - #11, Site Sketch – Fill Area 1). The waste consisted of but was not limited to: dimensional lumber (pieces and whole), metal conduit with protruding electrical wiring, broken concrete with protruding rebar, painted concrete blocks, vinyl siding, a cloth cushion and scrap metal (Photos #7 - #11, Site Sketch – Fill Area 1). I observed that soil and gravel had been placed on and around the waste; in what appeared to be an attempt to bury the waste (Photos #7 - #11, Site Sketch – Fill Area 1).

I walked to the west boundary of Fill Area 1 and observed plastic pipes that were partially buried under soil and gravel (Photos #12 - #14, Site Sketch - Fill Area 1).

The total volume of observable waste was approximately 10+ cubic yards.

My inspection ended at approximately 12:18 p.m.

Violations Observed:

<u>Item #3(12)(a)</u>: Cause, threaten or allow water pollution in Illinois; <u>Item #4(12)(d)</u>: Create a water pollution hazard; <u>Item #8(21)(p)(4)</u>: Cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site: (4) Deposition of waste in standing or flowing waters: During the inspection the open dumping of waste (IE broken concrete with protruding rebar), which caused the deposition of waste in standing or flowing waters and which caused, threatened or allowed water pollution or created a water pollution hazard in Illinois was observed.

<u>Item #5(21)(a)</u>: Cause or allow open dumping; <u>Item #8(21)(p)(1 and 7)</u>: Cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site: (1) Litter and (7) Deposition of general construction or demolition debris; or clean construction or demolition debris: During the inspection waste that had been open dumped and which resulted in litter and the deposition of general construction or demolition debris was observed.

WARNING: CORRECTIVE ACTION REQUIRED

You may be subject to substantial civil penalties if you fail to comply with the terms of this Administrative Citation Warning Notice, and are found to be in violation of the [Illinois] Environmental Protection Act.

FACTS

The purpose of this notice is to inform you of the results of the Jackson County Health Department's inspection, and the corrective action required. This inspection was conducted to evaluate compliance with the requirements of Section 21(a) and Section 21(p) of the [Illinois] Environmental Protection Act. The alleged violations found during the inspection are identified in the attached inspection report.

You must Complete the Following Corrective Actions:

- #1 Cease all open dumping immediately by insuring that all loads of clean fill are inspected for waste co-mingled with the clean fill material. At the time of the load inspection, remove any co-mingled waste and take it to an Illinois permitted landfill or recycling center for disposal.
- #2 Remove all waste (IE materials not permitted to be used as clean fill under Illinois law), from the clean fill areas. Cut off all protruding rebar at the face of the concrete. Remove all waste to a permitted landfill or transfer station by <u>April 19, 2016</u>. Scrap metal not disposed of at a landfill can be taken to a scrap metal facility or recycling center.
- #3 Submit to the Jackson County Health Department copies of receipts that document the proper disposal or recycling of the wastes by <u>May 3, 2016</u>.

REQUIRED RESPONSE

Within fifteen (15) calendar days of the date of this notice, you must submit in writing:

- 1. the reasons for the alleged violation(s),

POTENTIAL SANCTIONS

GENERAL REMARKS

Background: On March 16, 2016 at approximately 1:11 p.m., I received a call from Mr. Gary Clover, a local roofing contractor. Mr. Clover had called to ask if waste from a flat, hot tar roofing job his company was performing could be used as fill at a site on Industrial Park Road north of Murphysboro. Mr. Clover said he had been told that any type of construction material can be used as fill and wanted to know if that was true. Mr. Clover also stated that he took asphalt shingles to a site operated by E. T. Simonds for recycling. I explained to Mr. Clover that the only materials that can be used as fill are concrete without protruding rebar, clean gravel, clean brick and clean asphalt pavement [See Attachment: Page 1; Section 3.160(b) "Clean construction or demolition debris"]. I stated that any other type of construction or demolition debris not listed as "clean" had to be taken to a landfill for disposal. Mr. Clover asked why roofing asphalt could not be used as fill. I explained that it could not because it is not listed in the law as a material permitted to be used as fill. After the site inspection, a review of land tax records from the Jackson County Assessment Office revealed that the site referenced by Mr. Clover during his call is in fact owned by Mr. Gary Clover [Attachment: Page 2].

During the stated date and time, I conducted an inspection of the site listed above. This inspection was made as a follow up to a call from Mr. Gary Clover who referenced a "fill site" on Industrial Park Road which seemed, from Mr. Clover's comments, to be accepting "general construction or demolition debris" as fill. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were: Cloudy with moderate winds and a temperature of approximately 65°F. I was accompanied on this inspection by Henry Mulder of the Jackson County Health Department.

I arrived at the site and observed from E. Industrial Park Road, a public roadway, a fill area containing soil, brick, broken concrete and what appeared to be broken pieces of dimensional lumber scattered around the site (Photo #1, Site Sketch-Fill Area 1). I walked to a location on the west side of the fill area and observed materials (waste) that are not acceptable to be used as clean fill (Photo #2, Site Sketch-Fill Area 1) [Note: for the remainder of this report, any materials that cannot be used as clean fill will be referred to as waste]. The waste I observed in this area consisted of but was not limited to: dimensional lumber, oriented strand board, cardboard and gypsum board. I walked to a location on the east side of the fill area and observed more open dumped waste. The waste in this area included but was not limited to: exposed rebar and a plastic bag filled with trash (Photo #3, Site Sketch-Fill Area 1).

From the area labeled "Fill Area 1" on the Site Sketch, I looked east and observed a second fill area and proceeded to that location to continue my inspection.

Upon arrival at "Fill Area 2," I observed from E. Industrial Park Road, open dumped waste mixed with clean fill material (Photos #4 & #5, Site Sketch-Fill Area 2). The waste I observed mixed with clean fill material consisted of, but was not limited to dimensional lumber. I walked to a location on the east side of "Fill Area 2" and observed exposed rebar sticking out of broken pieces of concrete (Photos #6 & #7, Site Sketch-Fill Area 2). I walked to a location on the west side of "Fill Area 2" and observed more waste mixed with clean fill material (Photos #8 - #10, Site Sketch-Fill Area 2). The waste I observed in this area consisted of, but was not limited to: a rubber mat of some type, exposed rebar, dimensional lumber, paper and white PVC pipe.

The total volume of exposed waste I was able to observe was approximately 1 cubic yard. Given that much of the waste I observed was partially buried or covered with soil or concrete, it would be reasonable to assume that more waste is buried at this site.

My inspection ended at approximately 2:04 p.m.

Violations Observed:

<u>Item #5(21)(a)</u>: Cause or allow open dumping; <u>Item #8(21)(p)(1 & 7)</u>: Cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site: (1) Litter and (7) Deposition of general construction or demolition debris; or clean construction or demolition debris: During the inspection the open dumping of waste that caused litter and the deposition of general construction or demolition debris was observed.

(a) "General construction or demolition debris" means non-hazardous, uncontaminated materials resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of utilities, structures, and roads, limited to the following: bricks; concrete, and other masonry materials; soil; rock; wood, including non-hazardous painted, treated, and coated wood and wood products; wall coverings; plaster; drywall; plumbing fixtures; non-asbestos insulation; asphalt roofing shingles and other roof coverings; reclaimed or other asphalt pavement; glass; plastics that are not sealed in a manner that conceals waste; electrical wiring and components containing no hazardous substances; and corrugated cardboard, piping or metals incidental to any of those materials.

General construction or demolition debris does not include uncontaminated soil generated during construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of utilities, structures, and roads provided the uncontaminated soil is not commingled with any general construction or demolition debris or other waste.

To the extent allowed by federal law, uncontaminated concrete with protruding rebar shall be considered clean construction or demolition debris and shall not be considered "waste" if it is separated or processed and returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials or products within 4 years of its generation, if it is not speculatively accumulated and, if used as a fill material, it is used in accordance with item (i) in subsection (b) of this Section.

(b) "Clean construction or demolition debris" means uncontaminated broken concrete without protruding metal bars, bricks, rock, stone, reclaimed or other asphalt pavement, or soil generated from construction or demolition activities.

Clean construction or demolition debris does not include uncontaminated soil generated during construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of utilities, structures, and roads provided the uncontaminated soil is not commingled with any clean construction or demolition debris or other waste.

Page

To the extent allowed by federal law, clean construction or demolition debris shall not be considered "waste" if it is (i) used as fill material outside of a setback zone if the fill is placed no higher than the highest point of elevation existing prior to the filling immediately adjacent to the fill area, and if covered by sufficient uncontaminated soil to support vegetation within 30 days of the completion of filling or if covered by a road or structure, and, if used as fill material in a current or former quarry, mine, or other excavation, is used in accordance with the requirements of Section 22.51 of this Act and the rules adopted thereunder or (ii) separated or processed and returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials or products, if it is not speculatively accumulated and, if used as a fill material, it is used in accordance with item (i), or (iii) solely broken concrete without protruding metal bars used for erosion control, or (iv) generated from the construction or demolition of a building, road, or other structure and used to construct, on the site where the construction or demolition has taken place, a manmade functional structure not to exceed 20 feet above the highest point of elevation of the property immediately adjacent to the new manmade functional structure as that elevation existed prior to the creation of that new structure, provided that the structure shall be covered with sufficient soil materials to sustain vegetation or by a road or structure, and further provided that no such structure shall be constructed within a home rule municipality with a population over 500,000 without the consent of the municipality.

For purposes of this subsection (b), reclaimed or other asphalt pavement shall not be considered speculatively accumulated if: (i) it is not commingled with any other clean construction or demolition debris or any waste; (ii) it is returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials or products within 4 years after its generation; (iii) at least 25% of the total amount present at a site during a calendar year is transported off of the site during the next calendar year; and (iv) if used as a fill material, it is used in accordance with item (i) of the second paragraph of this subsection (b).

(c) For purposes of this Section, the term "uncontaminated soil" means soil that does not contain contaminants in concentrations that pose a threat to human health and safety and the environment.

(1) No later than one year after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly, the Agency shall propose, and, no later than one year after receipt of the Agency's proposal, the Board shall adopt, rules specifying the maximum concentrations of contaminants that may be present in uncontaminated soil for purposes of this Section. For carcinogens, the maximum concentrations shall not allow exposure to exceed an excess upper-bound lifetime risk of 1 in 1,000,000; provided that if the most stringent remediation objective or applicable background concentration for a contaminant set forth in 35 Ill. Adm.

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


