ROLL CALL

The Chairman called the roll. Three Board Members answered present.

Nutrients, Algae Blooms, Dead Zones... Water Quality Trading to the Rescue?— Chairman Keenan, Messrs James and Rao, and Ms. Liu provided a PowerPoint presentation on the fundamentals of water quality trading and how trading might work in Illinois. The presenters first reviewed command-and-control regulation of domestic and industrial dischargers (i.e., point sources of water pollution) and the escalation of compliance costs for these sources under increasingly stringent standards. Beyond driving up costs, existing regulation does not address non-point dischargers, the presenters added; these sources are, however, the primary cause of nutrient loading that leads to waterway impairment. Noting that USEPA policy allows water quality trading and that some watersheds (e.g., Chesapeake Bay) have trading programs in place, the presenters cited trading as a cost-effective way to foster point/non-point source alliances to control nutrient pollution in a particular watershed or within a TMDL (total maximum daily load) boundary. Under a trading program, non-point sources (e.g., farmers) could generate tradable credits by adopting BMPs such as conservation tillage and constructed wetlands and then sell the credits to point sources. Aside from improving water quality, the presenters stated, adopting trading would create habitat, jobs, and a new tradable commodity, and would promote investment in rural Illinois and opportunities to meet corporate sustainability goals. The presenters also emphasized that with a flexible definition of "watershed," trading can leverage economies of scale and scope, making it feasible, for example, for a number of small treatment works to meet effluent limits affecting water quality for downstream public water supplies.
