Hello Don, I write regarding the notice requirement for settlements that involve NPDES permit matters found in Section 103.306 of the Board Procedural Rules and 40 C.F.R. 123.27 (d), both of which are set forth below. The Board Rule, and the regulation from the Code of Federal Regulations, provide that notice must be given, and an opportunity for public comment, for settlements that involve NPDES permit matters. We intend to include in our Notices of Filing of Stipulations that involve NPDES permit matters that the Board will publish Notice for 30 days in the Environmental Register and that the Board may consider any comments submitted during the notice period (see attached samples for notices of filing these matters). Before we do that, we wanted to advise the Board and discuss as necessary. I have attached an IEPA Public Notice that provides some additional information on the subject.

#### Section 103.306 Board Order on Proposed Stipulation and Settlement Agreement

a) The Board will consider the proposed settlement and stipulation agreement and the hearing record, if any. The Board may accept, suggest revisions in, reject the proposed settlement and stipulation agreement, or direct initial or further hearings as it deems appropriate. Where a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit is involved in the settlement, notice of settlement must be published in the Environmental Register at least 30 days prior to the settlement.

40 C.F.R. 123.27 (d) Any State administering a [National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System] program shall provide for public participation in the State enforcement process by providing either:

- (1) Authority which allows intervention as of right in any civil or administrative action to obtain remedies specified in paragraphs (a)(1), (2) or (3) of this section by any citizen having an interest which is or may be adversely affected; or
- (2) Assurance that the State agency or enforcement authority will:
  - (i) Investigate and provide written responses to

all citizen complaints submitted pursuant to the procedures specified in § 123.26(b)(4);

- (ii) Not oppose intervention by any citizen when permissive intervention may be authorized by statute, rule, or regulation; and
- (iii) Publish notice of and provide at least 30 days for public comment on any proposed settlement of a State enforcement action.
