BROWN BAG LUNCH SEMINAR MINUTES

That's Sustainability—Cook County Reduced GHGs by 22% in Last Five Years!

Cook County Chief Sustainability Officer Deborah Stone provided a PowerPoint presentation on the County's environmental programs, focusing on sustainability and community solar initiatives. First, Ms. Stone gave an overview of the County Department of Environmental Control's role in regulating, inspecting, and enforcing environmental standards for suburban sources of air pollution (e.g., chrome platers, asbestos removal) and land pollution (e.g., solid waste disposal and transfer, liquid hazardous waste). She further explained that her department monitors criteria pollutant emissions as part of USEPA's and IEPA's Air Monitoring Network. Turning to sustainability programs, Ms. Stone described the County's multi-agency Green Leadership Team and efforts to reduce County facilities' GHG emissions and realize energy savings. She emphasized that the County has already reduced its buildings' GHG emissions by 22% as compared to a 2010 baseline, far exceeding the targeted 10% reduction through 2015 and (to date) the targeted 2% in annual reductions from 2010 through 2050. Also concerning County facilities, Ms. Stone highlighted capital improvement projects at various buildings (e.g., courthouses, hospitals, and the jail complex) that will reduce emissions and generate energy savings, whether under guaranteed savings contracts or otherwise. Regarding community solar, Ms. Stone explained that the County's aim is to make the benefits of solar power including energy savings—available to all Cook County residents, including people who are not able to install rooftop solar panels for one reason or another. To do this, the County has partnered with a number of organizations (e.g., Elevate Energy, City of Chicago) to assess solar capacity, conduct stakeholder outreach, develop financial models and policy approaches, identify pilot case studies, and analyze outcomes and benefits. Ms. Stone concluded with the status of pilot development: 15 of 109 sites across the County have been selected for a case study that will include several components (e.g., structural assessment, financial modeling, marketing and outreach)
