JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by 415 ILCS 5/1 *et. seq.*, specifically 415 ILCS 5/31.1.

FACTS

1. The Respondent, Phillip Qualls, is the present owner, occupant and in control and possession of a facility located in the County of Jackson, State of Illinois.

2. The facility is an open dump, operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit, and designated with the Site Code # 077 040 5038. The facility is known to the Agency as the Grand Tower/Phillip Qualls site.

3. The Respondent has owned, occupied, controlled and/or operated the facility at all material times hereto.

4. On November 8, 2018, Deborah Johnson, Environmental Compliance Inspector, Jackson County Health Department, inspected the facility. A true and correct copy of the inspection report, along with her affidavit, are attached and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.

VIOLATIONS

Based on Environmental Compliance Inspector Deborah Johnson's direct observations she has determined the Respondent has caused or allowed open dumping at the above described facility in a manner that resulted in the following violations:

That on November 8, 2018, an inspection of the facility disclosed the following:

 The Respondent has caused or allowed litter at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1).

 The Respondent has caused or allowed open burning at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3)

3. The Respondent has caused or allowed the deposition of general or clean construction or demolition debris at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>FOUR THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$4,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than January 18, 2019, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1, and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois

Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1), if Respondent fails to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, checks shall be made payable in equal amounts (50% of total penalty each) to:

- County of Jackson, c/o Jackson County Treasurer, Jackson County Courthouse, Murphsyboro, Illinois 62966; and
- (2) Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276.

Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Forms with payments to ensure proper documentation of payment. If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Complainant may either initiate proceedings against the Respondent in Circuit Court or other debt collection actions to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

You have the right to contest this Citation, pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/31.1. If you elect to contest this Citation, you must file a Petition For Review with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board. A copy of the Petition For Review shall also be filed with Daniel Brenner, Assistant State's Attorney, Jackson County Courthouse, Third Floor, Murphysboro, Il 62966. <u>YOUR PETITION FOR REVIEW MUST BE FILED WITHIN 35 DAYS OF THE DATE OF SERVICE OF THE PRESENT CITATION ON YOU. YOUR PETITION MUST STATE THE REASON(S) YOU BELIEVE THE PRESENT MATTER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED. IF YOU FAIL TO FILE YOUR PETITION AND STATE THE REASONS THE PRESENT MATER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED. A DEFAULT ORDER AGAINST YOU WILL BE ENTERED BY THE POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD.</u>

Background Information

A file was opened for this site pursuant to a complaint received at the Jackson County Health Department (JCHD) on July 5, 2016 alleging the open burning of building materials. An inspection, conducted on the same date, revealed open dumping and open burning were occurring on the property. An Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) was issued on July 14, 2016. JCHD did not receive any response from the property owner. Another complaint was received at JCHD on November 1, 2016 indicating continued burning of construction debris. An inspection on November 1, 2016 verified continued open dumping and open burning of construction debris, and a final ACWN was issued on December 19, 2016.

This site was re-inspected on August 2, 2017. Previously noted apparent violations were continuing and another cycle of ACWNs was initiated; a subsequent inspection on October 16, 2017 resulted the issuance of a Final ACWN. Again, JCHD did not receive any response from the respondent.

On January 25, 2018, the site was re-inspected – resulting in an issuance of an Administration Citation (AC) due to continuing apparent violations. However, the Jackson County Sheriff's Department was not able to serve the AC. Pursuant to another complaint of open burning of building materials, the property was again inspected on November 8, 2018.

According to the records of the Jackson County Assessor's Office online property tax inquiry, the site is still owned by Phillip Qualls located at 110 Main Street, Grand Tower, IL 62942 (Attachment: Pages 1 & 2). Also, noted on page 2 of the Attachment, in 2016, taxes were paid by JC Trustee (verified by a telephone call to the Jackson County Clerk's Office).

General Remark

The complaint alleged open burning of building materials during the night on Mr. Qualls' property. On the morning when the complaint was received at JCHD, I contacted the

Jackson County Sheriff's Department to request a deputy to accompany me on an inspection of the property. I arrived on-site and waited for Deputy Mark French. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were: overcast with moderate to low winds and an air temperature of approximately 39°F. All photographs are identified on the site sketch.

Once Deputy French arrived on-site, we started towards the front door of the residence when a "pitbull" barked and tried to jump out of an opening of the adjacent shed. The dog seemed to be contained so we continued to the front door and knocked. I noticed the front door was ajar and several vehicles were on the property. I knocked on the door several times, but no one would come to the door. We left the front porch and walked towards the driveway. From this location near Main Street, I observed vehicles in various stages of disrepair (Photos 1 & 2). The right vehicle in Photo 1 was the only one that had a current license. Surrounding the vehicles was open dumped waste that included, but was not limited to: demolition and/or construction debris, car parts, various metal and plastic items, insulation, plastic sheeting, ropes, chains, a softball, tools, tool belts, and other items not readily identifiable.

We continued to walk around the vehicles when I noticed additional open dumped waste in front of the vehicles and adjacent to the garage. Based on the items I observed in and in front of the garage, it appeared some repair or maintenance activities had been conducted on the vehicles. However, I noted items surrounding the garage appeared to be discarded haphazardly and were not protected for future use (Photos 3 & 4). Open dumped waste in this location included, but was not limited to: demolition and/or construction debris, used/waste tires, tools, metal items, plastic/product containers, extension cords and hoses, equipment, a motor bike frame, used oil with pan, and other items not readily identifiable. In this area, I observed discolored, dark soil surrounding the oil pan indicating the contents had spilled onto the ground. I also noticed an open, plastic container with an unknown amber colored liquid not protected from potential spills or from the weather.

Along the southeastern side of the building adjacent to the garage, I observed a stockpile of various open dumped items including, but not limited to: various metal and plastic items, a wooden "saw-horse", and demolition and/or construction debris (Photo 5). We walked back towards the building near the southeastern portion of the property and noticed several stockpiles of demolition and/or construction debris (Photos 6 – 9). Some of the piles were organized, others were haphazard and had other items dumped within the piles. Additional open dumped items in these areas included, but was not limited to: a "john boat", various plastic and metal items, a broom, a metal "saw-horse", an abandoned truck, and an ATV frame. I also observed a partially tarped trailer filled with unknown items and protruding demolition and/or construction debris (Photo 9 & 13).

Further back and to the northeast of the property, I observed a large fire "ring" constructed with concrete blocks (Photo 10). At the burn location, I noticed a strong

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"burning smell" indicating material had recently been burned, and I observed partially burned shingles, charred wood and plastic items, in addition to the ash in the burn pile. In **photo 11**, a truck and trailer filled with plastic, cardboard, and demolition and/or construction debris was backed up and adjacent to the burn pile.

Walking back towards the road, I observed the open dumped items adjacent to and behind the back building. In addition to the abandoned truck and ATV frame shown in photo 8, photo 12 shows a metal storage unit filled with items not protected from the weather. From another view of the partially tarped trailer, I noticed used/waste tires placed on top of the tarps (Photo 13). Packaged roofing shingles were stored on the northeastern side of the building (Photo 14). In this location and along the southern side of the building, I observed open dumped ATV components/engines, plastic and metal items, and used/waste tires not protected from the weather (Photo 15).

Waste material listed in this narrative were not in use, were not usable in their current condition and were not stored in a manner to protect the material for future use. The total volume of waste observed at the time of the inspection was approximately 35 cubic yards which includes the abandoned vehicles, and my inspection ended at approximately 9:28 a.m.

Violations Observed:

(9)(a): Cause, threaten or allow air pollution in Illinois; (9)(c): Cause or allow open burning; (21)(p)(3): Cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site: (3) Open Burning: During the inspection the open dumping of waste that resulted in open burning and which caused, threatened or allowed air pollution in Illinois was observed.

(21)(a): Cause or allow open dumping; (21)(p): Cause or allow the open dumping of any waste in a manner which results in any of the following occurrences at the dump site: (1) Litter; and (7) Deposition of general construction or demolition debris; or clean construction or demolition debris: During the inspection, the open dumping of waste that resulted in litter and the deposition of general construction or demolition or demolition debris was observed.

(21)(d)(1): Conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation: Without a permit: : At the time of the inspection, the Jackson County Health Department (Health Department) had not received documentation from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) that the site owner/operator had been issued a permit to conduct a waste-storage, waste-treatment or waste-disposal operation.

observed. During the inspection, the open dumping of waste that resulted in litter was observed.

(21)(e): Dispose, treat, store, or abandon any waste, or transport any waste into the State at/to sites not meeting requirements of the Act or the 35 Illinois Administrative Code (IAC): At the time of the inspection, this site did not meet the Act or regulatory requirements regarding the disposal, treatment, storage or abandonment or transport of waste into Illinois.

(55)(a)(3): No person shall: Cause or allow storage of any used tire unless the tire is altered, reprocessed, converted, covered, or otherwise prevented from accumulating water: At the time of the inspection used/waste tires that had not been prevented from accumulating water were observed.

(722.111): Failure to determine whether a waste is a hazardous waste: At the time of the inspection, liquid waste was not managed to prevent it from being open dumped onto the ground and/or protected from the weather.

(808.121): Failure to determine whether a waste is a special waste: At the time of the inspection, liquid waste was not managed to prevent it from being open dumped onto the ground and/or protected from the weather.

(812.101)(a): Failure to submit an application for a permit to develop and operate a landfill: At the time of the inspection, the Health Department had not received from the Agency documentation that the site owner or operator had submitted an application for a permit to develop and operate a landfill.



Background Information

A file was opened for this site pursuant to a complaint received at the Jackson County Health Department (JCHD) on July 5, 2016 alleging the open burning of building materials. An inspection, conducted on the same date, revealed open dumping and open burning were occurring on the property. An Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) was issued on July 14, 2016. JCHD did not receive any response from the property owner. Another complaint was received at JCHD on November 1, 2016 indicating continued burning of construction debris. An inspection on November 1, 2016 verified continued open dumping and open burning of construction debris, and a final ACWN was issued on December 19, 2016.

This site was re-inspected on August 2, 2017. Previously noted apparent violations were continuing and another cycle of ACWNs was initiated; a subsequent inspection on October 16, 2017 resulted the issuance of a Final ACWN. Again, JCHD did not receive any response from the respondent.

On January 25, 2018, the site was re-inspected – resulting in an issuance of an Administration Citation (AC) due to continuing apparent violations. However, the Jackson County Sheriff's Department was not able to serve the AC. Pursuant to another complaint of open burning of building materials, the property was again inspected on November 8, 2018.

According to the records of the Jackson County Assessor's Office online property tax inquiry, the site is still owned by Phillip Qualls located at 110 Main Street, Grand Tower, IL 62942 (Attachment: Pages 1 & 2). Also, noted on page 2 of the Attachment, in 2016, taxes were paid by JC Trustee (verified by a telephone call to the Jackson County Clerk's Office).

General Remark

The complaint alleged open burning of building materials during the night on Mr. Qualls' property. On the morning when the complaint was received at JCHD, I contacted the

Jackson County Sheriff's Department to request a deputy to accompany me on an inspection of the property. I arrived on-site and waited for Deputy Mark French. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were: overcast with moderate to low winds and an air temperature of approximately 39°F. All photographs are identified on the site sketch.

Once Deputy French arrived on-site, we started towards the front door of the residence when a "pitbull" barked and tried to jump out of an opening of the adjacent shed. The dog seemed to be contained so we continued to the front door and knocked. I noticed the front door was ajar and several vehicles were on the property. I knocked on the door several times, but no one would come to the door. We left the front porch and walked towards the driveway. From this location near Main Street, I observed vehicles in various stages of disrepair (Photos 1 & 2). The right vehicle in Photo 1 was the only one that had a current license. Surrounding the vehicles was open dumped waste that included, but was not limited to: demolition and/or construction debris, car parts, various metal and plastic items, insulation, plastic sheeting, ropes, chains, a softball, tools, tool belts, and other items not readily identifiable.

We continued to walk around the vehicles when I noticed additional open dumped waste in front of the vehicles and adjacent to the garage. Based on the items I observed in and in front of the garage, it appeared some repair or maintenance activities had been conducted on the vehicles. However, I noted items surrounding the garage appeared to be discarded haphazardly and were not protected for future use (Photos 3 & 4). Open dumped waste in this location included, but was not limited to: demolition and/or construction debris, used/waste tires, tools, metal items, plastic/product containers, extension cords and hoses, equipment, a motor bike frame, used oil with pan, and other items not readily identifiable. In this area, I observed discolored, dark soil surrounding the oil pan indicating the contents had spilled onto the ground. I also noticed an open, plastic container with an unknown amber colored liquid not protected from potential spills or from the weather.

Along the southeastern side of the building adjacent to the garage, I observed a stockpile of various open dumped items including, but not limited to: various metal and plastic items, a wooden "saw-horse", and demolition and/or construction debris (Photo 5). We walked back towards the building near the southeastern portion of the property and noticed several stockpiles of demolition and/or construction debris (Photos 6 – 9). Some of the piles were organized, others were haphazard and had other items dumped within the piles. Additional open dumped items in these areas included, but was not limited to: a "john boat", various plastic and metal items, a broom, a metal "saw-horse", an abandoned truck, and an ATV frame. I also observed a partially tarped trailer filled with unknown items and protruding demolition and/or construction debris (Photo 9 & 13).

Further back and to the northeast of the property, I observed a large fire "ring" constructed with concrete blocks (Photo 10). At the burn location, I noticed a strong

"burning smell" indicating material had recently been burned, and I observed partially burned shingles, charred wood and plastic items, in addition to the ash in the burn pile. In photo 11, a truck and trailer filled with plastic, cardboard, and demolition and/or construction debris was backed up and adjacent to the burn pile.

Walking back towards the road, I observed the open dumped items adjacent to and behind the back building. In addition to the abandoned truck and ATV frame shown in photo 8, photo 12 shows a metal storage unit filled with items not protected from the weather. From another view of the partially tarped trailer, I noticed used/waste tires placed on top of the tarps (Photo 13). Packaged roofing shingles were stored on the northeastern side of the building (Photo 14). In this location and along the southern side of the building, I observed open dumped ATV components/engines, plastic and metal items, and used/waste tires not protected from the weather (Photo 15).

Waste material listed in this narrative were not in use, were not usable in their current condition and were not stored in a manner to protect the material for future use. The total volume of waste observed at the time of the inspection was approximately 35 cubic yards which includes the abandoned vehicles, and my inspection ended at approximately 9:28 a.m.






