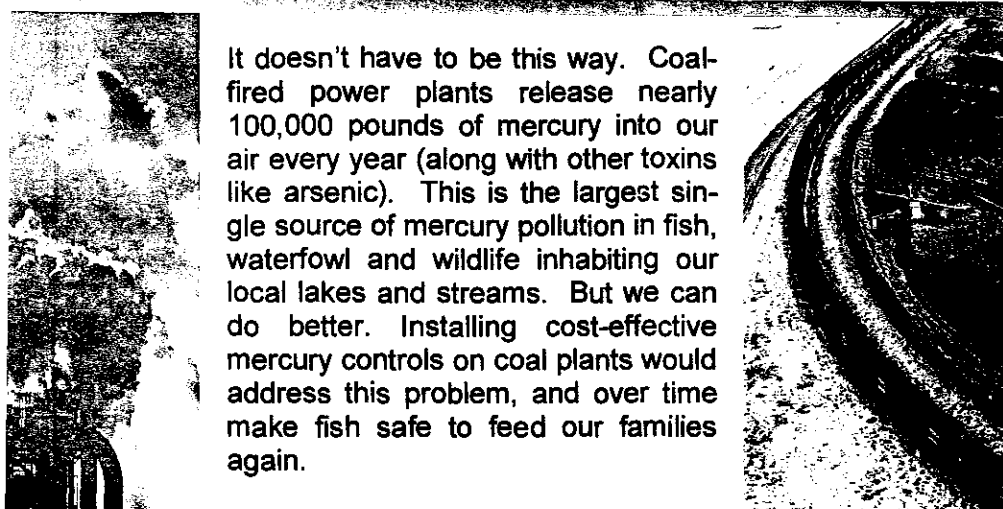

It doesn't have to be this way. Coal-fired power plants release nearly 100,000 pounds of mercury into our air every year (along with other toxins like arsenic). This is the largest single source of mercury pollution in fish, waterfowl and wildlife inhabiting our local lakes and streams. But we can do better. Installing cost-effective mercury controls on coal plants would address this problem, and over time make fish safe to feed our families again.



Illinois Governor Rod Blagojevich has proposed cutting mercury pollution from Illinois coal plants by 90% by 2009. We have the technology to meet these levels and protect our families' health, but the out-of-state companies that own these plants are fighting to derail the plan instead.

Illinois sportsmen and women can add their voices to those who want clean air, clean water, and healthy wildlife populations. Use the postcard attached to tell the Illinois Pollution Control Board to support the Governor's proposal. Send the other card back to us and we'll keep you posted on the proposal and other opportunities to help enact it.
