RECOMMENDATION

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA") hereby files its Recommendation pursuant to Section 125.204 of the regulations of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.204.

1. On May 30, 2006, the Illinois EPA received a request from Klean Wash, Inc. (log number TC-26-02, Exhibit A) for an Illinois EPA recommendation regarding the tax certification of water pollution control facilities pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.204.
2. The applicant's address is: Klean Wash, Inc.

Morton, Illinois 61550
3. The proposed water pollution control facilities in this request are located at Section SE ¼, T25, R3W of the 3rd P.M. in Tazwell County, at the above street address and consist of the following:
 1. A 6,000 square foot insulated building and a wastewater collection and pretreatment system consisting of two 5,000-gallon holding tanks; a three stage treatment unit consisting of a 500-gallon oil/water separator, a 375-gallon pH adjustment chamber with sulfuric acid and ferric sulfate addition, and a 375-gallon neutralization system with caustic acid addition; a rotary vacuum filter utilizing diatomaceous earth as a filter aid, and all pipes, pumps, appurtenances necessary for the collection and pretreatment of truck cleaning wastewater.

2. A 3,600 square foot insulated building and a wastewater collection and treatment system consisting of a 1,000-gallon holding tank, a 1,000 pound activated carbon vessel, and all pipes, pumps, and appurtenances necessary for the treatment/recycle of herbicide tank cleaning wastewaters.

These facilities are used for complete interior truck tank cleaning, and are further described in the enclosed application and supporting documents (Exhibit A).

4. Section 11-10 of the Property Tax Code, 35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2004), defines

“pollution control facilities” as:

“any system, method, construction, device or appliance appurtenant thereto or any portion of any building or equipment, that is designed, constructed, installed or operated for the primary purpose of: (a) eliminating, preventing, or reducing air or water pollution ...or (b) treating, pretreating, modifying or disposing of any potential solid, liquid or gaseous pollutant which if released without treatment, pretreatment modification or disposal might be harmful, detrimental or offensive to human, plant or animal life, or to property.”

5. Pollution control facilities are entitled to preferential tax treatment, 35 ILCS 200/11-5.

6. Based on the information in the application and the purpose of the facilities, it is the Illinois EPA’s engineering judgment that the described facilities may be considered “pollution control facilities,” pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.200(a), with the primary purpose of eliminating, preventing, or reducing water pollution, or as otherwise provided in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.200, and are eligible for tax certification from the Board.

WHEREFORE, the Illinois EPA recommends that the Board issue the

requested tax certification.

The Bureau of Water received a request on May 30, 2006 from Klean Wash, Inc. for an Illinois EPA recommendation regarding the tax certification of water pollution control facilities pursuant to 35 Il. Adm. Code 125.204. We offer the following recommendation.

The water pollution control facilities in this request include the following:

1. A 6,000 square foot insulated building and a wastewater collection and pretreatment system consisting of two 5,000 gallon holding tanks; a three stage treatment unit consisting of a 500 gallon oil/water separator, a 375 gallon pH adjustment chamber with sulfuric acid and ferric sulfate addition, and a 375 gallon neutralization system with caustic acid addition; a rotary vacuum filter utilizing diatomaceous earth as a filter aid and all pipes, pumps, and appurtenances necessary for the collection and pretreatment of truck cleaning wastewaters.
2. A 3,600 square foot insulated building and a wastewater collection and treatment system consisting of a 1,000 gallon holding tank, a 1,000 pound activated carbon vessel, and all pipes, pumps, and appurtenances necessary for the treatment/recycle of herbicide tank cleaning wastewaters.

These facilities are further described in the enclosed applications and supporting documents.

Based on the information included in this submittal, it is our engineering judgment that the above proposed facilities may be considered "Pollution Control Facilities" under 35 IAC 125.200(a), with the primary purpose of eliminating, preventing, or reducing water pollution, or as otherwise provided in this section, and therefore eligible for tax certification from the Illinois Pollution Control Board. The Bureau of Water therefore recommends that the Board issue the requested tax certification for these facilities.

Klean Wash, Inc. located at 175 W. Courtland Avenue, Morton, IL 61550, operates Commercial Interior Tank Cleaning Facility permit number 2004-EP-0451 and Dedicated Agricultural Interior Tank Cleaning Facility permit number 2002-EA-2020.

Cleaning Facility permit number 2004-EP-0451 is enclosed in a 6,000 square foot insulated Morton Building with a sloped concrete floor for containment of complete pre-treatment equipment system.

Two 5,000 gallon holding tanks; a three stage treatment unit consisting of a 500 gallon oil/water separator, 375 gallon PH adjustment chamber with sulfuric acid and ferric sulfate addition and a 375 gallon neutralization system with caustic acid addition; a rotary vacuum filter utilizing diatomaceous earth as a filter aid, and all appurtenances necessary to pre-treat interior/exterior truck cleaning wastewater (20,000 gpd. DAF, 50,000 gpd. DMF). Interior truck cleaning wastewater shall be limited to wastewater from tank trucks whose cargo consists of polymers, fatty acids, petroleum based oil, animal/vegetable oil, latex, and resin. Discharge from the pre-treatment system is tributary to Village of Morton Sewage Treatment Plant #3.

Agricultural Tank Cleaning Permit number 2002-EA-2020 is enclosed in a 3,600 square foot insulated Morton Building with sloped concrete floor for containment of a tank rinse recycle treatment system.

A tank rinse recycle treatment system consisting of a 1,000 gallon holding tank, a 1,000 pound activated carbon vessel, and all appropriate pipes, pumps, fittings and appurtenances necessary for the treatment/recycle of 1,000 god DAF (1,500 god DMF) of rinse water associated with the cleaning of tanks used to transport herbicides. First rinse water will be hauled off-site for incineration. All subsequent rinses will be recycled resulting in zero discharge.

Enclosed is our application for property tax relief assessment.



Permit is hereby granted to the above designated permittee(s) to construct and/or operate water pollution control facilities described as follows:

Two 5,000 gallon holding tanks; a three stage treatment unit consisting of a 500 gallon oil/water separator, 375 gallon pH adjustment chamber with sulfuric acid and ferric sulfate addition and a 375 gallon neutralization system with caustic acid addition; a rotary vacuum filter utilizing diatomaceous earth as a filter aid, and all appurtenances necessary to pretreat interior/exterior truck cleaning wastewater (20,000 g.p.d. DAF, 50,000 g.p.d. DMF). Interior truck cleaning wastewater shall be limited to wastewater from tank trucks whose cargo consists of polymers, fatty acids, petroleum based oil, animal/vegetable oil, latex, and resin. Discharge from the pretreatment system is tributary to Village of Morton Sewage Treatment Plant #3.

This operating permit expires on April 30, 2009.

This Permit renews and replaces Permit No. 1999-EE-3777 which was previously issued to herein permitted facilities.

This Permit is issued subject to the following Special Condition(s). If such Special Condition(s) require(s) additional or revised facilities, satisfactory engineering plan documents must be submitted to this Agency for review and approval for issuance of a Supplemental Permit.

SPECIAL CONDITION 1: This permit allows the pretreatment and discharge of interior truck cleaning wastewater from tank trucks whose cargo consists of polymers, fatty acids, petroleum based oil, animal/vegetable oil, latex and resin. If the permittee wishes to clean the interior of tank trucks with cargos other than those specifically allowed by this permit, a supplemental permit shall first be obtained from the Agency.



Agency permitted facility using the Agency's Supplemental Permit and manifest system in accordance with the Environmental Protection Act. If the sludge is a hazardous waste, the generator must comply with all applicable requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code Parts 702, 703, 705 and 720 to 725.

SPECIAL CONDITION 3:

- A. Accumulation of hazardous waste at this facility (if generated) shall be carried out in accordance with 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Chapter 1, Subtitle G, Part 722: Standards Applicable to Generators of Hazardous Waste.
- B. Transport of all special waste to a permitted treatment, storage or disposal site shall be carried out in accordance with Title 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Chapter 1, Subtitle G, Part 809: Special Waste Hauling.

SPECIAL CONDITION 4: Issuance of this permit does not release the Permittees from any liability for prior violations of the Act or Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder.

SPECIAL CONDITION 5: The operation of the pretreatment facilities must be under the direct and active field supervision of a certified industrial treatment plant operator in accordance with the State of Illinois Rules and Regulations, Title 35, Subtitle C, Chapter 1, Part 312.

SPECIAL CONDITION 6: The issuance of this permit does not relieve the permittee of the responsibility of complying with 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Part 307 and/or the General Pretreatment Regulations (40 CFR 403) and any guidelines developed pursuant to Section 301, 306, or 307 of the Federal Clean Water Act of 1977. The guidelines established for Transportation Cleaning Point Source Category (40 CFR Part 432 Subpart A - Tank Trucks and Intermodal Tank Containers Transporting Chemical and Petroleum Cargos and Subpart D - Tanks Transporting Food Grade Cargos) limit the pollutants from facility as follows:

- B. All sampling and testing shall be in accordance with 40 CFR 136 or other Agency approved methods.
- C. The permittee shall maintain a list of cargos of all the trucks that are internally cleaned at the facility, and the date on which the cleaning took place. Material Safety Data Sheets for the cargos of all the trucks that are internally cleaned shall be retained on site, and made available to the Agency upon request.
- D. Monitoring results and cargo lists shall be submitted on or before February 1st and August 1st each year for the duration of the permit to the Village of Morton and following addresses.

Note: A summary of monitoring results can be sent in spread sheet format to Village of Morton, Peoria office, and USEPA. Lab data shall accompany results sent to Springfield office.

E. ADDITIONAL MONITORING REQUIREMENTS

The permittee shall sample the discharge once per year for priority pollutants listed in 40 CFR 122 Appendix D, Table II under Acid Compounds and Case/Neutral headings. Samples shall be collected from a discharge which contains wastewater from the cleaning of a truck containing a fatty acids product; or from a truck containing glues; or from a truck containing lube oils and additives.

The permittee shall sample the discharge once per year for priority pollutants listed in 40 CFR 122 Appendix D, Table II under Volatiles heading. Samples shall be collected from a discharge which contains wastewater from the cleaning of a truck containing a toluene and xylenes product; or from a truck containing isopropyl alcohol; or from a truck containing latexes and adhesives.

Tests shall be done as described in Part B, with type of wastewater cleaned specified. Results shall be submitted to addresses in Part D along with February 1st report.

SPECIAL CONDITION 9: Within 90 days of issuance of permit the permittee shall be required to redevelop the Heel Minimization Program. The new plan shall be referred to as the Pollution Management Plan and shall follow guidelines as described in 40 CF 442.15(b)(5) section (i) through (x). The Pollution Management Plan shall be submitted to the Agency within 90 days of issue date of this permit to addresses listed in Special Condition 7.


The permittee may be notified by the Agency at any time that the Plan does not meet the requirements of this permit. After such notification the permittee, within an Agency specified allotted time, shall make changes to the Plan and shall submit a written certification stating that the requested changes have been made.

SPECIAL CONDITION 10: The Permittee shall reevaluate its average BOD concentration and reapply for a supplemental permit with a new design average population equivalent based on the estimated/calculated average BOD concentration.






