This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2004).

FACTS

- 1. That Steve B. and Beth M. Segner are the owners of a facility with the following legal description: Lot 236, BLK 000, PLT 070, Triple Lake HTS Unit 2, 100x221. This property is located located in Carbondale, Williamson County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Carbondale/Segner.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1998525010.
 - That Respondents owned said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on May 18, 2007, Sheila Williams of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of her inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Sheila Williams during the course of her May 18, 2007 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondents have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2004).
- (2) That Respondents caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in Deposition of General Construction or Demolition Debris: or Clean Construction or Demolition Debris a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7) (2004).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2004), Respondents are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondents elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>August 15, 2007</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2004), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondents shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental

Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2004), if Respondents fail to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondents shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondents from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondents in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondents have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2004). If Respondents elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondents shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondents.



GENERAL REMARKS

On May 18, 2007 an inspection was conducted at the Carbondale/Segner site. The previous inspection was conducted on February 13, 2007. Williamson County records indicate that Steve B. & Beth M. Segner receive the tax bill for the property on which this site is positioned. The last inspection resulted in an Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) being sent to the Segners. They responded to the ACWN with a letter in which they indicated they would need until the fall of 2007 to have the site in compliance. Another Illinois EPA letter was sent to the Segners in which a September 1, 2007 extension was granted "contingent upon receipt by this office of bi-monthly reports stating what actions have been taken to bring the site into compliance as well as copies of receipts that show materials have been legally disposed of or recycled". This was to include any items referred to as wastes by the Illinois EPA that the Segners sold. The first of such reports was to be received no later than April 27, 2007. As of May 13, 2007 no such correspondence has been received.

The current inspection was conducted so as to determine what degree, if any, compliance had been achieved. It did not appear as though any progress had been made at the site. Many of the same items were still present as previously observed. As before the gate was closed & signs were posted indicating a flea market at this location. The whole area of debris has been designated as Area A. It is estimated to be approximately 600 cubic yards (180'x90'x1') in size. (Information from the Williamson County Supervisor of Assessments Office indicates the lot is 100'x221'.) Among the wastes observed were numerous wood spools, demolition debris, three grills, a deep

fryer, a variety of metal, four vehicles, plastic buckets, furniture, wood cabinets, bicycles, a weight set & an artificial tree. Some of the items were on pallets & a few covered either partially or wholly with tarps. By comparing pictures taken from the December 28, 2006 site visit & the February 13, 2007 inspection, it was apparent nothing had been done with many of the items. Because much of the refuse was located in the same place & same positions as previously observed going back as early as December 28, 2006, it is apparent most of the waste has been exposed to the elements for quite some time. Because there is such a large amount of debris at the site, it is apparent much of it has been brought from off site.



Dear Bob:

I received your letter dated 11-28-06. I'd like to let you know that I've been cleaning this area, and have made big progress, since your inspection on 7-27-06. I have started several containers; one for alluminum, one for brass and coppper, and three for ferrous metals. When these containers fill up, I take them to the scrap yard. I also have established a trailer, made from a pick-up truck, for refuse collection. When this trailer is full, Burris Disposal picks up this refuse for a flat fee. Since I received your letter 11-28-06, I have reorganized, sorted and removed much of the materials that could have been seen from the road. Also, as from our discussion, I have trimmed the grass in this area as you suggested. The materials I want to keep are on wooden skids, which are held off the ground by bricks. Any materials that may be harmed by the weather, are covered by tarps. The tarps are set up so they shed the rain water and do not bread insects. As you know, there has been alot of rain this fall. This has made the ground very soft. I will not be able to remove some of the larger materials until the ground dries out. Until then, I will continue to clean up the best I can.

Please stop by any time to take a look at the progress I have made.

While making an inspection/evaluation on another case in your area, I noted the condition of your property. Junk and refuse was scattered about over quite a large area. After our discussion of July 27, 2006, you informed me you planned to scrap out much of the metal and discard the rest. You also stated you had a contract with Burris Disposal to remove refuse.

The vegetation around this area has died and the refuse and junk is more easily seen, especially this time of year. The violations have not been abated. You have until January 10, 2007, to clean up the area before citations are issued. No extra time will be given for abatement of these violations. I have discussed this with you several times in the past few months, so at this point in time, it should be clear what steps need to be taken to abate the violation and a court appearance. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
