## MOTION FOR VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL AS TO BOB DRAKE

NOW COME Complainants, VERNON and ELAINE ZOHFELD, through their undersigned attorney, and move this Board to allow a voluntary dismissal of the Complaint in this case as to Respondent BOB DRAKE, as a result of the settlement of Complainants' claims against Respondent Bob Drake. In support of this Motion, Complainants state as follows:

- 1. Complainants filed their Complaint in this case in 2005, alleging that the Respondents, including Respondent Bob Drake, were responsible for airborne pesticide materials and other agricultural chemicals being transported across property boundaries from land owned at that time by Drake onto land owned by Complainants. The Complaint alleged both personal injuries and property damages as a result of the air pollution, resulting in loss of enjoyment by the Complainants of their property.
- 2. The Complaint requested that this Board order Respondents cease and desist from further violations of the Environmental Protection Act, and the associated air pollution regulations, assess penalties against the Respondents, award to Complainants costs and attorney's fees, and award all other relief available.

- 3. Subsequently Respondent Bob Drake has divested himself of ownership of the parcel of property from which the agrichemicals were transported onto Complainants' property.
- 4. In addition, Complainants have now entered into a monetary settlement with Respondent Bob Drake, by means of which the parties have determined to resolve their differences and pursue no further litigation against one another concerning the agrichemical overdrift at issue in this case, including prosecution of this citizens' enforcement action.
- 5. Consequently, in order to fulfill their requirements under the settlement agreement, Complainants at this time request that this Board dismiss this matter as it pertains to Respondent Bob Drake.
- 6. Counsel for the other Respondents have informed counsel for Complainants and counsel for Respondent Bob Drake that they have no objection to a dismissal as requested by Complainants herein.
- 7. Dismissal as to Respondent Bob Drake, in light of the settlement with Complainants, is in the interests of justice and the environment.

WHEREFORE Complainants, VERNON and ELAINE ZOHFELD, request that this Board dismiss this matter as to Respondent Bob Drake only.
