

SEP 1.7 2007 STOP PLANS TO PUT GARBAGE ON SACRED SITE

Waste Management and the City of Madison want to put a landfill at a site within 2100 feet of Cahokia Mounds World Heritage Site boundaries. There are at least two mounds at the site eligible for listing on the National Historic Landmarks Registry. Prehistoric remains have been found at the site. The site is considered sacred by Native Americans.

American Bottom Conservancy and Sierra Club have appealed the siting to the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

Waste Management also wants to destroy 18 acres of wetlands at the site to use the soil to cover garbage at the existing massive Milam landfill, which is already taller than Monks Mound.

The proposed landfill would also be 2000 feet from Horseshoe Lake State Park, visited annually by hundreds of thousands of people who fish, camp, hunt, walk trails, play sports, observe nature and picnic at the park.
