AC 08-31	<u>IEPA v. Upper Rock Island County Landfill and Dave Geier</u> – The Board granted the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s motion to reconsider, vacated the September 4, 2008 order, and entered a default order against respondents. The Board found that these respondents violated Sections 21(o)(5) and (o)(12) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(o)(5), (o)(12) (2006)), assessing a penalty of \$1,000 in this administrative citation involving a Rock Island County facility.	5-0
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AC 08-32	<u>IEPA v. Joseph Flick</u> – The Board granted the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s motion to reconsider, vacated the September 4, 2008 order, and entered a default order against this respondent. The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2006)), assessing a penalty of \$3,000 in this administrative citation involving a Union County facility.	5-0
AC 08-34	<u>IEPA v. Joseph Combs</u> – The Board granted the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s motion to reconsider, vacated the September 4, 2008 order, and entered a default order against this respondent. The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2006)) in this administrative citation involving a Greene County facility. Because this administrative citation addresses second or subsequent adjudicated violations of Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) by Combs, the total civil penalty is \$6,000. <i>See</i> <u>IEPA v. Joseph Combs</u> , AC 07-60, slip op. at 2 (July 12, 2005).	5-0
AC 08-36	<u>IEPA v. Charles F. Kinsel</u> – The Board granted the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency’s motion to reconsider, vacated the September 16, 2008 order, and entered a default order against this respondent. The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2006)) in this administrative citation involving a Fulton County facility. Because this administrative citation addresses a subsequent adjudicated violation of Section 21(p)(1) by Kinsel, as well as a violation of Section 21(p)(7), the total civil penalty is \$4,500. <i>See, e.g.,</i> <u>IEPA v. Charles F. Kinsel</u> , AC 07-9, slip op. at 2 (Oct. 5, 2006).	5-0
AC 09-2	<u>IEPA v. Theodore & Elizabeth Hollenbeak and Hollenbeak Concrete, Inc.</u> – The Board found that Elizabeth Hollenbeak and Hollenbeak Concrete defaulted by failing to timely to file an amended petition. The Board withheld issuing a final order regarding Elizabeth Hollenbeak and Hollenbeak Concrete, Inc. until the Board makes its final decision regarding Theodore Hollenbeak. The Board directed the hearing officer to proceed expeditiously to hearing on the previously accepted petition for review filed by Theodore Hollenbeak.	5-0

AC 09-14	<u>IEPA v. Reynolds Service Co.</u> – The Board found that respondent’s petition was untimely, denied respondent’s motion to clarify, and entered a default order against respondent. The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1), (p)(5), and (p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(5), (p)(7) (2006)), assessing a penalty of \$4,500 in this administrative citation involving a Union County facility.	5-0
AC 09-19	<u>IEPA v. Donald G. Wilkey</u> – The Board accepted for hearing respondent’s petition for review of this administrative citation involving a Jefferson County facility.	5-0
AC 09-20	<u>IEPA v. Charles Kissick</u> – The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and (p)(7) of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(7) (2006)), assessing a penalty of \$3,000 in this administrative citation involving a Morgan County facility.	5-0
AC 09-21	<u>IEPA v. Darrell Knox</u> – The Board found that respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1), (p)(3), and (p)(7) of the Act (415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1), (p)(3), (p)(7) (2006)), assessing a penalty of \$4,500 in this administrative citation involving a Morgan County facility.	5-0
AC 09-24	<u>IEPA v. Quinn & Glenna Hunley</u> – The Board accepted an administrative citation against these Edwards County respondents.


