AMENDED PETITION FOR REGULATORY
HEARING UNDER RULE 203(i)(10)(cc),
CHAPTER 3, RULES AND REGULATIONS,
ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

Now Comes Central Illinois Public Service Company, an Illinois Corporation (hereinafter called "CIPS"), and for its Amended Petition herein states as follows:

- 1. On or about May 31, 1977, CIPS filed its petition for Regulatory Hearing under Rule 203(i)(10)(cc) and thereafter on September 13 and 14, 1977, hearings were held on the aforementioned petition after which CIPS, as Petitioner, and Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, as Respondent, filed their respective Briefs and Reply Brief.
- 2. On or about April 27, 1978, the Illinois Pollution Control Board (hereinafter called the "Board"), after hearing testimony, reviewing the documentary evidence, exhibits and demonstrations presented at the hearing, and considering the Briefs of the Petitioner and Respondent entered an Order, that stated the following:

It is the Order of the Pollution Control Board that:

- (1) For the period of time ending three years from the date of this Order, the thermal discharge to Coffeen Lake from Coffeen Station shall not result in a temperature measured at the outside edge of the mixing zone in Coffeen Lake exceeding 98°F during more than 8.2% of the hours in the twelve month period ending with any month, and in any event shall at no time exceed 108°F.
- (2) If at the end of the three year period noted in (1) above, Central Illinois Public Service presents evidence which convinces the Board that Coffeen Lake meets the criteria of Rule 203(i)(10), the interim limited note in (1) above shall become permanent specific thermal standards for Coffeen Lake.

Note: A copy of the Board's April 27, 1978, Order is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

- 3. Subsequent to the Board's Order, CIPS contracted with the Illinois Natural History Survey to conduct a comprehensive three-year ecological study of Coffeen Lake from July 1, 1978 through June 30, 1981. The primary purpose of this study being to determine whether Coffeen Lake is environmentally acceptable in terms of supporting shellfish, fish and willing, and recreational uses, consistent with good management practices.
- 4. On or about April 22, 1981, CIPS filed its Motion

  to Open Hearing and Take Additional Testimony for the purpose
  of taking additional testimony per the Board's April 27, 1978,
  Order, and extended the interim thermal limits approved by the
  Board on April 27, 1981, until a final resolution of the
  203(i)(10) Regulatory Hearing. This Motion was not objected to
  by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (hereinafter
  called the "Agency") and a hearing was subsequently set by

agreement of CIPS and the Agency for November 30, 1981, at 9:30 a.m., in Springfield, Illinois, Room 122A of the Capitol Building.

- 5. The original 203(i)(10) demonstration for Coffeen Lake requested a specific thermal standard based on typical actual operating conditions experienced at Coffeen Power Station from 1965 through 1976. Those thermal standards are no longer indicative of Coffeen Lake conditions based on temperature data gathered from 1977 through 1981, see the attached Exhibit B (hereinafter referred to as "Temperature Data").
- 6. An analysis of the survey and the temperature data shows that Coffeen Lake is capable of supporting shellfish, fish and wildlife, and recreational uses consistent with good management practices, in accordance with Rule 203(i)(10)(cc)(1) at the temperatures reflected in the Temperature Data.
- 7. It is the position of the Petitioner that specific thermal standards be adopted for Coffeen Lake that are representative of the actual conditions existing in Coffeen Lake prior to and during the course of the three-year environmental study. Accordingly, Petitioner proposes and requests the Board to establish the following specific thermal standard for its Coffeen Lake:

The thermal discharge to Coffeen Lake for Central Illinois Public Service Company's Coffeen Power Station shall not result in a temperature, measured at the outside edge of the mixing zone in Coffeen Lake, which exceeds 104 degrees Fahrenheit as a monthly average and 112 degrees Fahrenheit as a maximum for more than 1% of the hours in the 12 month period ending with any month.
