

JURISDICTION

The Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the statutory authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by section 4(e) and 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act ("act") 415 ILCS 5/4(e), 5/31.1, and delegated to Vermilion County Pursuant to section 4(r) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/4(r).

FACTS

1. That Respondent, Charles Long, is, and was at all times relevant to this Administrative Citation, the owner of property located at the area of 133 West Williams Street, Danville, more particularly Latitude 40.1340, Longitude - 87.6515.
2. That said property is operated as a mobile home park and vacant land which is not permitted as a sanitary landfill or dump area.
3. That on 11-10-2009 Douglas Toole of the Vermilion County Health Department inspected the above-described property. Douglas Toole's Affidavit and a copy of his inspection report are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

VIOLATIONS

1. On the basis of direct observations personally made by Douglas Toole, the County of Vermilion has determined that on 11-10-2009 :
  - A. The Respondent was allowing the open dumping of waste which resulted in litter in violation of Section 21(p)(1).
  - B. The Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste which resulted in open burning in violation of Section 21(p)(3).

1 C. The Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of any waste which results  
2 in the deposition of general construction or demolition debris and clean  
3 construction and demolition debris in violation of Section 21(p)(7).

5 **CIVIL PENALTY**

6 Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4), Respondent herein is  
7 subject to a civil penalty of \$1,500.00 for each violation of each provision under  
8 subsection p of Section 21, plus any hearing costs incurred by the Board should the  
9 Respondent elect to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board under the review  
10 process described hereinbelow.

12 **PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION**

13 You have the right to contest this Administrative Citation under Section 31.1(d) of  
14 the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d). If you elect to contest this Administrative Citation, you  
15 must file a petition for Review with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control, at  
16 the State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph Street, Suite 11-500, Chicago,  
17 Illinois 60601. Such Petition for Review must be filed with thirty-five (35) days of  
18 the date of service of this Administrative Citation, or a default judgment will be  
19 issued by the Illinois Pollution Control Board. A copy of the Petition for Review  
20 should be filed with the Vermilion County State's Attorney's Office, Courthouse, 2<sup>nd</sup>  
21 Floor, 7 N Vermilion Street, Danville, Illinois, 61832.

22 If you acknowledge the violation herein, the civil penalty specified above shall be  
23 due and payable no later than 2-8-2010. If you do not petition the Illinois Pollution  
24 Control Board for review of the Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days  
25 of the service hereof and have not paid the civil penalty by the due date stated  
26 above, or if you elect to contest this Administrative Citation, any judgment rendered  
27 shall specify the due date of the statutory civil penalty and any costs assessed  
28 against you.

29 When payment is made, your check should be made payable to the County of Vermilion,  
30 Illinois and mailed to the Vermilion County Health Department, 200 South College  
31 Street, Danville, Illinois, 61832, together with a completed copy of the remittance  
32 form attached hereto.

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If any civil penalty, by reason of acknowledgment, default or finding after hearing, is not paid when due, the Vermilion County State's Attorney may initiate proceedings in the Circuit Court to collect said civil penalty. In addition to the previously assessed civil penalty and any hearing costs of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the State's Attorney's Office will seek to recover its costs of litigation

## OPEN DUMP INSPECTION NARRATIVE

This unpermitted open dump was reinspected on November 10, 2009 by Douglas Toole of the Vermilion County Health Department. The weather was overcast, dry, still and about 55 degrees Fahrenheit. Nineteen photos were taken of the site.

The site is located in Vermilion County, in a ravine south of the mobile home park at 1330 West Williams Street in Danville, Illinois.

## INSPECTORS FINDINGS

By way of history, this file was originally opened by me on August 30, 1994 regarding an area on the southwest corner of the park that had appliances, roofing material, scrap metal and other refuse on it. The owner, Charles Long, abated that nuisance in November, 1995. I am not aware of any inspections performed at that site between November 3, 1995 and August 31, 2006.

On the morning of November 10, 2009, I received phone calls from two people who said they lived close to Mr. Long's property on West Williams Street in Danville, Illinois who complained about waste-burning in the low-lying area south of Mr. Long's mobile home park. The complainants said that the burning had been going on for days, had produced a foul-smelling smoke, and that the local fire department had been called to the scene.

I arrived on the site to perform an inspection at about 11:00 a.m. on November 10, 2009. No one accompanied me at the start of the inspection.

I parked my car at the south part of the park, and walked down to the bottom area on foot. At the time of my inspection, the cable across the access road was down.

As I walked down the access road, I passed by a trailer filled with appliances, vehicle mufflers, and other refuse, as well as piles of remodeling waste, tires, roofing shingles, wooden fencing, wooden pallets and other refuse.

At the bottom area, I turned east at a fork in the access road, and walked to the large dumpsite on the northeast part of the site. The whole area smelled smoky.

I spoke with two men – Chad Ramsey and Chris Toney – who said they lived in Mr. Long’s mobile home park and occasionally worked for him. They said they had been removing items from the property for days, hauling it away in pickup trucks or loading it into rolloff boxes (a full “Thomas Excavating” rolloff box was on-site at the time of my inspection – see photo 18). Mr. Ramsey said that he and Mr. Toney had started one pile of waste on fire towards the southwest part of the area. They did not know how the other several fires in the area had started, though.

From the south part of the large dumpsite, I could see mattress springs, stuffed furniture, boards, remodeling waste, scrap metal and other refuse, mostly organized into small piles (photos 1-19). Mr. Toney was working on the site during my inspection (photos 1, 4, 6, 9), as was Mr. Ramsey (photos 4, 13).

On the south part of the large dumpsite area, I observed a burn pile containing branches, boards and mattress springs (photos 1, 4). Another burn pile on the southwest site of the area contained boards, a partial door, Styrofoam, scrap metal and other refuse (photos 1, 4, 5, 6, 13). Other piles in the area contained partially burned stuffed furniture (photos 6, 9, 12), scrap metal (photo 10), remodeling waste (photo 11), household garbage (photo 12), doors (photo 14), a mattress (photo 15), mattress springs (photo 16), furniture frames (photos 17, 18), and other refuse.

I also observed unburned boards, scrap metal (photo 7), stuffed furniture (photo 12, 14, 15, 19), mattresses (photo 12), boards (photos 14, 19), Styrofoam (photo 19) and other refuse).

Mr. Ramsey said that he and Mr. Toney were told by Mr. Long to burn some of the refuse, so they started one pile on fire (photo 18), but that they did not burn any other waste, and did not know how the other fires started. I told them both that burning waste was prohibited by state law, and that they may be held responsible for the burning that took place at the site.

As I was leaving the site, Mr. Long drove up to me in a pickup truck. He said he was unaware of any burning at the site, and that he had told Mr. Ramsey and Mr. Toney to clean up the refuse from the site, and to burn only bags of yard waste from the mobile home park down in the bottom area. I reminded him that the burning of waste was prohibited by state law, and that he may be held responsible for the burning that took place at the site.

I left the site at about 11:30 a.m.

On my previous inspection – conducted on October 28, 2009 – I walked and inspected about 20 acres of the property. This inspection covers just a small portion of the property, mostly just the large dumpsite on the northeast part of the property. I did not determine if cleanup work had taken place in other parts of the property, or if additional refuse had been added to other parts of the property.

No measurements were performed to determine how much waste was in the area I inspected, only my observations at the time. On October 28, 2009 I measured the refuse and estimated that there were 12,518 cubic feet (about 1,391 cubic yards) of refuse in that area. Some had been removed from that area by the time of my November 10, 2009 reinspection, and some had been burned. I would estimate that two-thirds of the waste had been removed or burned in that area, leaving about 4,130 cubic feet (about 459 cubic yards) yet to be removed. The actual amount of waste on the site may vary significantly from that estimation.

Also, this inspection does not address any liquid-waste or water-contamination issues, which may still be ongoing at the property.

## SUMMARY OF APPARENT VIOLATIONS

### ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT (415 ILCS 5/1 et seq.)

Section 9 (a) of the Act: No person shall ... cause or threaten or allow the discharge or emission of any contaminant into the environment in any State so as to cause or tend to cause air pollution. Contaminants on the site had been discharged into the environment in a manner that tends to cause air pollution.

Section 9 (c) of the Act: No person shall ... cause or allow the open burning of refuse. Evidence of the open burning of refuse was observed on the site.

Section 21 (a) of the Act: No person shall ... cause or allow the open dumping of any waste. Open dumping was observed on the site.

Section 21 (d)(1) of the Act: No person shall ... conduct any waste storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation without ... a permit granted by the Agency. No Agency permit to conduct a waste storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation for the site was issued.

Section 21 (d)(2) of the Act: No person shall ... conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste disposal operation ... in violation of any regulations or standards adopted by the Board under the Act. Violations of the Illinois Pollution Control Board Regulations were observed at the site where waste storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operations were taking place.

Section 21(e) of the Act: No person shall ... dispose, treat, store or abandon any waste ... except at a site or facility which meets the requirements of this Act and of regulations and standards thereunder. The storage and disposal of waste was occurring at a site which did not meet the requirements of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act and the Illinois Pollution Control Board Regulations.

Section 21 (p)(1) of the Act: No person shall ... cause or allow the open dumping of any waste which results in ... litter. Open dumping of waste resulting in litter was observed at the site.

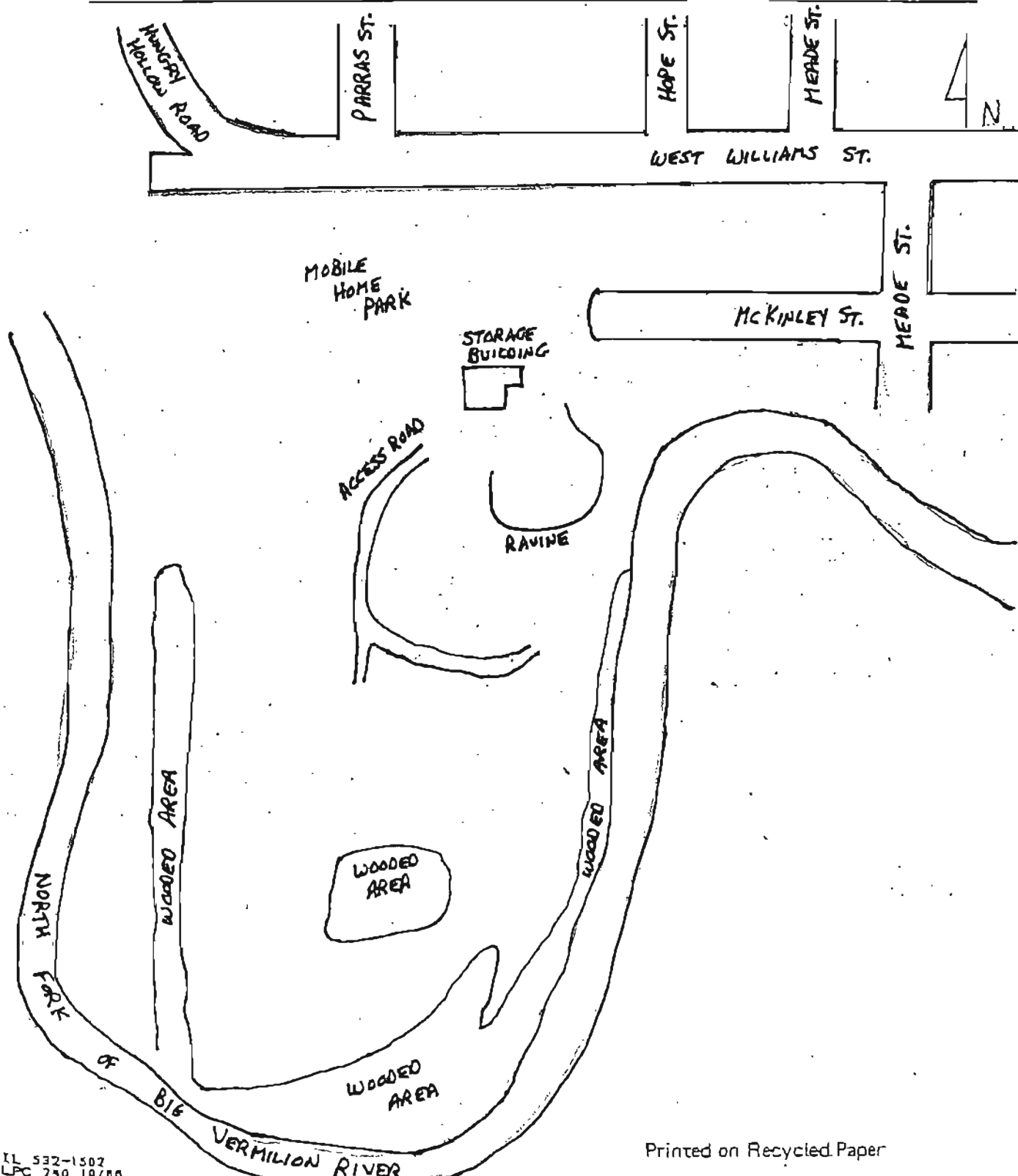

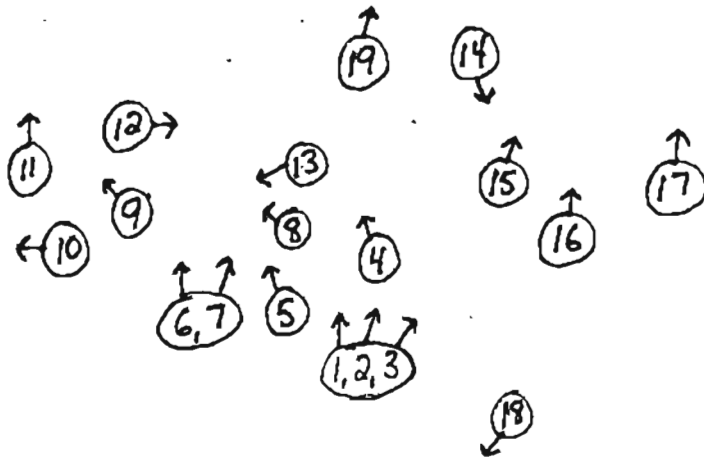
