Section 101.304 Service of Documents

- d) Affidavit or Certificate of Service. A proceeding is subject to dismissal, and parties are subject to sanctions in accordance with Section 101.800 of this Part, if service is not timely made. Proof of proper service is the responsibility of the party filing and serving the document. An affidavit of service or certificate of service must accompany all filings of all parties. A sample form of the affidavit of service and certificate of service is available at the Board's Offices (the locations of the Board's Offices are

listed at 2 Ill. Adm. Code 2175.115) and may be obtained electronically at the Board's Web site.

- e) Service of Amicus Curiae Briefs. Any person who files an amicus curiae brief with the Board in any proceeding must serve copies of that brief on all parties in accordance with this Section.
- f) Service of Comments of Participants in an Adjudicatory Proceeding. Participants are required to serve their comments upon the parties to the proceeding. The Board will consider the comments as time and the Act or other applicable law allow.
