Pollution Control Board Hearing held, pursuant to notice, on Wednesday, July 21, 2010 at the hour of 1:00 p.m. at 1021 North Grand Avenue, Springfield, Illinois, before CAROL WEBB, duly appointed Hearing Officer.

- 1 HEARING OFFICER WEBB: Good
- 2 afternoon. My name is Carol Webb. This is the
- 3 second hearing for Docket R10-21 entitled: In the
- 4 matter of 10-Year Federally Enforceable State
- 5 Operating Permits (FESOP) Amendments to 35 Illinois
- 6 Administrative Code Part 201.162.
- At this hearing, all references to
- 8 the Agency refer to the Illinois Environmental
- 9 Protection Agency, and all dates refer to calendar
- 10 year 2010.
- 11 At today's hearing, the Board will
- take any testimony on the merits and economic effect
- of the Agency's April 20 regulatory proposal. The
- 14 proposal would extend from five to ten years the
- maximum term for which the Agency could issue a
- 16 Federally Enforceable State Operating Permit known
- as a FESOP. The sole provision of the air rules to
- be amended is Section 201.162.
- With me today is Board Member Carrie
- Zalewski who is coordinating this rulemaking. The
- 21 assigned hearing officer in this proceeding is
- 22 Kathleen Crowley.
- As announced at the first hearing
- held on July 8th, I'm conducting this hearing in

- 1 place of Ms. Crowley to conserve travel costs for
- 2 the board.
- Member Zalewski, do you have any
- 4 opening remarks you would like to make?
- 5 MEMBER ZALEWSKI: Just again to thank
- 6 everyone for their participation.
- 7 HEARING OFFICER WEBB: Thank you.
- At this point, I would like to ask
- 9 the Agency to please make your appearance on the
- 10 record.
- MS. DOCTORS: My name is Rachel
- Doctors, and I am representing the Illinois EPA in
- 13 this matter.
- 14 HEARING OFFICER WEBB: Thank you.
- Before we begin, there is some
- information that must be entered into the record.
- At the July 8th hearing, Ms. Crowley
- stated that the first notice proposal was published
- in the Illinois Register on July 2nd at 35 Illinois
- Register 8508. The 45-day first notice comment
- 21 period required by the Administrative Procedure Act
- expires on August 16th. This is the first business
- 23 day after the 45th day.
- The first notice of publication

- included the dates of both scheduled hearings and
- 2 referenced the hearing officer's June 9th order
- 3 setting deadlines for the prefiling of testimony and
- 4 addressing other procedural points.
- On June 24th, the Board submitted a
- 6 written request to the Department of Commerce and
- 7 Economic Opportunity, known as DCEO, that it perform
- 8 an economic impact study, also known as EcIS, as
- 9 provided for in Section 27 of the Environmental
- 10 Protection Act. The Board asked DCEO to provide any
- 11 response by June 30th.
- No response has been received, and no
- 13 study has been filed.
- Section 27(b) requires the Board to
- hold a hearing on the economic impact of the rules,
- any EcIS submitted, and on any explanation DCEO
- provides for not conducting an EcIS. Section 27(b)
- allows the Board to dovetail the economic impact
- 19 hearing with any other hearing. Any DCEO hearing
- issues can be addressed at today's hearing.
- We'll first allow the Agency to make
- 22 any comments or testimony followed by testimony of
- 23 anyone concerning economic effects of the proposed
- rulemaking and any other matter.

- I will note for the record that no
- 2 members of the public are present. No testimony or
- questions have been prefiled by the Agency or any
- 4 other person.
- 5 Does the Agency have any additional
- 6 testimony or information to present in support of
- 7 its proposal today?
- MS. DOCTORS: No, it does not.
- 9 HEARING OFFICER WEBB: Thank you very
- 10 much.
- As I said before, DCEO has not
- submitted an EcIS or any explanation for its
- decision not to perform one.
- Does anyone have any testimony on
- this or the economics of the proposal?
- I again note that there are no
- members of the public present who may have any
- 18 comments, and there's no one other than the Agency
- 19 present to make any testimony or statements.
- Okay. Our last task today then is to
- set a date for the closing of post-hearing comments.
- 22 As stated previously, the 45-day first notice
- comment period required by the EPA began on July 2nd
- and ends August 16th. Section 102.108(b) of the

- 1 Board's procedural rules also provides that the
- Board will accept comments for 14 days after the
- 3 receipt of the hearing transcript or at any other
- 4 date set by the hearing officer.
- 5 The transcript for this hearing is
- due by August 2nd and the 14-day due date under
- 7 Section 102.108 would be August 16th.
- As the Board will not have sufficient
- 9 time to issue an order for the August 19th Board
- meeting, we will set the date for the end of the
- comment period to August 20th. Comments must be in
- the Board's office by that date, and the mailbox
- rule of 35 Illinois Administrative Code 101.300(b)
- will not apply.
- The Board will consider any requests
- 16 for extension of the comment period in light of the
- 17 Agency's preference that the rules be adopted as
- soon as possible to save renewal processing costs
- 19 for both the Agency and the regulated community.
- 20 Are there any other questions or
- 21 comments?
- Seeing none, I will thank you all for
- your participation. Thank you very much.
- 24 (Conclusion of proceedings.)
