#### JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008).

### **FACTS**

- 1. That Harold Dean Foster is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 42998 County Highway 8, Time, Pike County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Time/Foster.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1490850001.
  - 3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on September 23, 2011, Charlie King of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 1/-8-1/, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7004 8510 0001 8588 4519.

### **VIOLATIONS**

Based upon direct observations made by Charlie King during the course of his September 23, 2011 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2008).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2008).
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in deposition of general construction or demolition debris or clean construction or demolition debris, a violation of Section 21(p)(7) of the Act, 415 ILCS 21(p)(7) (2008).

### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2008), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty

specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>December 15, 2011</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2008), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2008), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

### PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2008). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

#### NARRATIVE RE-INSPECTION REPORT DOCUMENT

The purpose of this memorandum is to serve as the Narrative Re-Inspection Report Document of a reinspection conducted at the subject site by this author on September 23, 2011 from approximately 12:15 p.m. until 1:01 p.m., by this inspector. The re-inspection was conducted to follow-up the original site inspection conducted on March 27, 2009, also by this inspector. That initial site inspection resulted in the observation of apparent open dumping, as discussed in this author's Narrative Inspection Report Document to the Land Division File, dated May 7, 2009. Subsequently, the respondent was issued an Open Dump Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) from the Illinois EPA, dated May 8, 2009. Re-inspections were conducted on October 2, 2009, April 2, 2010, October 8, 2010, April 8, 2011 and the most recent September 23, 2011 re-inspection. Clean-up time extensions were provided after each reinspection prior to the September 23, 2011 re-inspection. In a letter to respondent site owner and operator Harold M. "Dean" Foster dated May 18, 2011, he was advised that if the site was not completely cleaned up by September 1, 2011, an Administrative Citation with a \$4,500 first offense penalty might be issued to him. The September 23, 2011 inspection revealed that the site was not completely cleaned up. During the April 8, 2011 site inspection, the site was found to have approximately 931 cubic yards of wastes still on it. During the September 23, 2011 inspection, that volume dropped only to approximately 795 cubic yards of wastes. Also, during the September 23, 2011 inspection, a previously cited violation of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act), Section 55(k)(1) (standing water in used tires), was not found and is therefore no longer alleged. However, evidence of open burning, that was not alleged during the previous inspection, was discovered during the current inspection. Therefore, apparent violations of the Act. Sections 9(a), 9(c) and 21(p)(3) are now alleged.

The respondent owns just over the entire southern half of the property on the block that is surrounded on the south by County Highway 8, on the west by Main Street, a.k.a. 430th Street, and on both the north and east by Hill Street, in Time, IL. This property has two inhabited mobile homes on it that the respondent owns. One mobile home on the eastern part of the property is where the respondent lives. The other, on the western side of the property is where the respondent's former spouse lives. The northeastern part of the block is reportedly not owned by the respondent, rather it was reportedly owned by a deceased man named Buchannan. However, the respondent reiterated on more than one occasion in the past that he had been using that lot for decades. The northeast portion of the block does not have a home on it, and an old small uninhabited mobile home has been removed. However, a large single-wide mobile home that is partially on that lot and partially on the respondent's property is still there. In the past, it was reportedly used for storage by the respondent. Although reduced by a small amount, approximately 795 cubic yards of openly dumped waste were found on most of the respondent's property and on the northeast lot, which the respondent has admitted dumping on for decades. As mentioned in previous inspection reports, upon

inquiry, the respondent is on record as stating that nobody had ever told him that he couldn't use the property.

The owner and operator, of the site is Harold M. "Dean" Foster, 42998 County Highway 8. Pittsfield (Time), 1L 62363. The legal and specific location of the site was presented in detail in the May 7, 2009 narrative, and therefore, will not be repeated herein. Mr. Foster's telephone number is: 217/285-6108.

Upon arrival at the site on the day of the most recent re-inspection, the weather was sunny, with an air temperature of approximately 65° F. Winds were northwesterly at approximately 15 mph. Surface soil conditions were mostly dry.

During the most recent re-inspection, 22 photographs were taken with a digital camera. They show the conditions at the site on the day of the re-inspection. From the re-inspection and the Digital Photographs, a partially computer generated, partially hand drawn sketch of the site was developed. It shows the basic layout of the site, as well as the approximate locations and directions of the inspection photographs. The digital camera provides a three-digit number to each photograph, i.e., 001, 002, etc. This is how the photographs are referred to in this narrative and on the Digital Photographs sheets. However, real numbers have been used on the sketch, i.e., 1, 2, etc. Copies of the Digital Photographs and the Site Sketch accompany this report.

The inspection photographs are described as follows:

Photo #s 001, 002 and 003 show the southern and southwest portions of the site from the southwest corner. Wastes visible include wood and metals. Photo #s 002 and 003 also show a small dumpster Mr. Foster has reported in the past is rented from Area Disposal. A dead cat can be seen in two of the photographs.

Photo # 001 shows an overview of the southwest area of the site from the intersection of County Highway 8 to the south and 430th Street to the west. Wood, gas cylinders, paper, plastics and metals were on the ground in the distance. A dead cat is in the lower right corner of the photograph. A two cubic yard Area Disposal dumpster is also shown.

Photo# 002 shows more of the overview discussed in the description for photo # 001. Wood, bricks, concrete, corrugated metal pipe and vehicles are shown, along with the Area Disposal dumpster and the dead cat, which are also visible in photo # 001.

Photo # 003 shows the third of three photos making up an overview of the south and southwest areas of the site. Photo #s 001 and 002 are also part of the overview. Most of this south area was void of wasres.

Photo # 004 shows metals, gas cylinders, wood and concrete chunks in an area measuring approximately  $25^{\circ} \times 15^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 005 shows a close-up of part of the area shown in photo # 002. Here, the wood, corrugated metal pipe, concrete blocks and metals can be more clearly seen. This area measured approximately  $25^{\circ} \times 12^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 006 shows metals, used tires on-rims, wood and plastics located in front of, or just south of, the partial shed used for storage. This partial shed appears to be starting to fall apart, and is leaning forward on the right side in this photograph.

Photo # 007 shows wood, used tires on-rims, metals, plastics, toys, a fire extinguisher, gas cylinders, plastics and glass in an area measuring approximately 12° x 10° x 2°, just north and northwest of the dilapidated partial shed shown in photo # 006.

Photo # 008 shows north of the dilapidated shed shown in photo # 006, wood, used tires on-rims, metals, an air compressor, wood pallets, and an open-blue metal 55-gallon drum filled with metals on the north side of the path between those wastes and the partial shed, measuring 20° x 10° x 5°. The fire extinguisher shown in photo # 007 is also visible.

Photo # 009 shows an un-inhabited junk mobile home measuring approximately 14' x 70' x 9'.

Photo # 010 shows part of an old roof measuring  $10^{\circ} \times 10^{\circ} \times 1^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 011 shows used tires on-rims, shingles, plastic jugs and wood, measuring approximately  $12^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ , just SF of Mr. Foster's home.

Photo # 012 shows metals, used tires on-rims and wood on the far east side of the south side of the property. The wastes here measured approximately  $10^{\circ} \times 10^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 013 shows corrugated tin barely visible to the left and more clearly visible to the right, measured together approximately  $15^{\circ} \times 5^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 014 shows wood, used tires on-rims, tarps and plastics, north of the fence that is north of Mr. Foster's mobile home. This area of wastes measured approximately  $60^{\circ} \times 5^{\circ} \times 3^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 015 shows more tires off-rims, metals and wood wastes. This area measured 201 x 201 x 21, and did not include the landscape wastes in the right foreground, because Mr. Foster sells cut wood for firewood.

Photo # 016 shows two piles of wood, metals and used tires on-rims. The one in the background measured approximately  $12^{\circ} \times 10^{\circ} \times 3^{\circ}$ . The one in the foreground measured approximately  $15^{\circ} \times 8^{\circ} \times 3^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 017 shows used tires on-rims, wood and metals measured approximately 35' x 30' x 2'.

Photo # 018 shows demolition waste, wood and used tires on-rims measured approximately 35" x 20" x 3".

Photo # 019 shows springs, metals, plastic fibers and ashes were observed in this recent open burning area measured approximately  $20^{\circ} \times 12^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ}$ .

Photo # 020 shows the opposite side of the junk mobile home shown in photo # 009.

Photo # 021 shows metals, used tires on-rims, conduits, a lawn mower, black cable, concrete blocks and wood wastes measured approximately 351 x 351 x 21.

Photo # 022 shows a continuation of the open dumped wastes shown in photo # 021. Metals, a plastic drum, a used tire on-rim and a gas cylinder were observed. The total area was provided in the description of photo # 021.

During the inspection, all of the apparent violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) and of the regulations. Title 35, Illinois Administrative Code, Subtifle G (35 LA.C.) that were observed during

the April 8, 2011 re-inspection, were again observed during the re-inspection on September, 23, 2011, except standing water in used tires was no longer observed or alleged, but open burning was observed and is now alleged. The current apparent violations of the Act are Sections: 9(a), 9(c), 21(a), 21(d)(1), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), 21(p)(7) and 55(a)(1). An apparent violation of the regulations, 35 I.A.C., is Section 812.101(a). More information can be obtained from the Open Dump Inspection Checklist, which accompanies this report.

#### Other Comments

It now appears there are approximately 795 cubic yards of waste on-site, which is less than the 931 cubic yards observed during the April 8, 2011 re-inspection and considerably less than then the 5.064 cubic yards observed during the original site inspection on March 27, 2009. However, the same amount of wastes were observed during the October 8, 2010 and April 8, 2011 re-inspections, and the 795 cubic yards observed during the September 23, 2011 re-inspection shows a reduction of only 136 cubic yards since October 8, 2010. Mr. Foster did submit metals and landfill receipts for wastes removed in July. August and September, 2011, which far surpasses this 136 cubic yard removal estimate. However, the 795 cubic yard estimate of remaining wastes on-site was carefully calculated. Therefore, either some wastes were missed during previous calculations, or else additional wastes were added between the last two inspections, making up the difference between the receipt totals and the inspector estimates. It is suspected that the former prevails, i.e., some waste volume was missed during previous calculations.




