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RECOMMENDATION

NOW COMES the ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (“Illinois EPA”), through its attorneys, and pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.204 of the ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD’S (“Board”) procedural regulations, files the Illinois EPA’s Recommendation in the above-referenced request for tax certification of pollution control facilities. The Illinois EPA recommends **issuance** of a tax certification covering the subject matter of the request. In support thereof, the Illinois EPA states as follows:

1. On or about October 14, 2010, the Illinois EPA received an application and supporting information from WRB REFINING, LLC, (“WRB Refining”) concerning the proposed tax certification of certain air emission sources and/or equipment located at its Wood River petroleum refinery in Madison County, Illinois. A copy of the application is attached hereto. **[Exhibit A]**.

4. The subject matter of this request consists of a truck washing facility to address pollution from particulate matter caused by departing coke trucks. The semi-trucks used to load out coke from the refinery tend to gather coke fines on their tires and exterior siding, which can be deposited or blown off during transport and result in the release of particulate matter. The installation of a new Coker Truck Washing facility will prevent this air pollution by allowing the tires, exterior framework and siding of all coke trucks to be washed off prior to leaving the property. Wastewater from the process will be directed to an oily water process system and solids from the washing are to be recovered in the on-site wastewater treatment plant.

5. Section 11-10 of the Property Tax Code, 35 ILCS 200/11-10 (2002), defines “pollution control facilities” as:

“any system, method, construction, device or appliance appurtenant thereto, or any portion of any building or equipment, that is designed, constructed, installed or operated for the primary purpose of: (a) eliminating, preventing, or reducing air or water pollution... or (b) treating, pretreating, modifying or disposing of any potential solid, liquid, gaseous pollutant which if released without treatment, pretreatment, modification or disposal might be harmful, detrimental or offensive to human, plant or animal life, or to property.”

6. Pollution control facilities are entitled to preferential tax treatment, as provided by 35 ILCS 200/11-5 (2002).

7. Based on information in the application and the underlying purpose of the Coker Truck Washing facility to prevent, eliminate or reduce air pollution, it is the Illinois EPA’s engineering judgment that the various systems, constructions, devices and/or buildings or equipment from the project relating to air pollution control may be considered as “pollution control facilities” in accordance with the statutory definition and consistent with the Board’s regulations at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.200. **[Exhibit B]**.

8. Because the substantive components of the application for the Coker Truck Washing facility satisfies the aforementioned criteria, the Illinois EPA recommends that the Board **issue** the applicant's requested tax certification.



Project: Coker Truck Washing for Particulates Project

Section D – Pollution Control Facility Description

As the semi-trucks are loaded with coke, coke fines are expected to accumulate on the tires and wheels and on the exterior of the truck. If unabated, this material would fall off the truck during transportation which is a violation of environmental regulations. Smaller coker fines would be blown off the trucks resulting in particulate air pollution.

The Wood River Refinery is installing a Coker Truck Washing facility to prevent air pollution due to coker fines accumulating on the exterior of the coke transport trucks and then being blown off during transportation. For the sole purpose of preventing air pollution, a truck washing station has been installed to wash the wheels, sides, and under-carriage of the trucks. Every truck will be required to go through this washing system to ensure that the trucks are clean before they leave the refinery. The spent water from this system will be sent through the oily water process sewer system to clean the water. The washed solids will then be recovered in the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

This Pollution Control Facility was installed for the sole purpose of preventing air pollution due to coke particulates.

This Agency received a request on October 14, 2010, from WRB Refining, LLC, for an Illinois EPA recommendation regarding tax certification of air pollution control facilities pursuant to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 125.204. I offer the following recommendation:

The air pollution control facilities in this request include the following:

Coker Truck Washing, which installs a new truck washing facility at the refinery for washing coke fines from the coke trucks, thereby reducing particulate matter emissions that might otherwise be deposited or blown off the trucks during transport. Because the primary purpose of this system is to reduce or prevent air pollution, it can be certified as a pollution control facility.

This facility is located at 900 South Central Avenue, Roxana  
The property identification number is Part of 19-1-08-35-00-000-001

Based on the information included in this submittal, it is my engineering judgment that the proposed facility may be considered "Pollution Control Facilities" under 35 IAC 125.200(a), with the primary purpose of eliminating, preventing, or reducing air pollution, or as otherwise provided in this section, and therefore eligible for tax certification from the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Therefore, it is my recommendation that the Board issue the requested tax certification for this facility.
