The original agreement included new clean air standards for mercury, sulfur dioxide (SO2) and nitrous oxide (NOx), which create acid rain and smog, as well as many health-related problems. Ameren committed to a schedule for reducing its SO2 and NOx pollution in return for more time to make its mercury pollution reductions.

The state upheld its side of the deal, but now Ameren is trying to stall cleaning up its coal plants like it promised to. Please reject the company's request for a variance and hold the company to the standard passed in 2006. The agreement to reduce mercury pollution is vital in protecting public health and the environment through Illinois and the Midwest. This is critical for my health, our environment and the Midwest's future.
