LETTER OF EXPLANATION

To whom it may concern:

With regard to the administrative citations that I am being accused of I would like

to further explain the circumstances in which they arose and the steps that I have taken

after to the fact to remedy the alleged violations.

With regard to the bricks and concrete that had wood in them, I have since

separated out all of the wood from the pile and taken the wood to be properly disposed

of at a landfill. I will admit that there was wood in the pile and that I had failed to

separate the wood from the bricks and concrete in a timely manner. I keep the bricks

for use as landscaping around my property as well as for any repairs of my buildings.

With regard to the load that your inspector, Mr. Mullins, referred to as litter, I have

since separated this load and removed the iron and metal to be salvaged and taken all

wood to be properly disposed of at a landfill. The load was placed on my property the

day before Mr. Mullins arrived to inspect the property. It was a load of items taken from

my elderly mother's home in Fisher. I agree that I should have separated the load and

taken each portion to its correct destination from the start. I did not have time to sort it at

her house due to the imminent sale of her home.
