JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by 415 ILCS 5/1 et. seq., specifically 415 ILCS 5/31.1.

FACTS

- 1. The Respondent, Christopher Will, is the present owner and occupant and in control and possession of a facility located in the County of Jackson, State of Illinois.
- 2. The facility is an open dump, operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit, and designated with the Site Code # 077 812 5014. The facility is known to the Agency as the Pomona/Christopher Will site.
- 3. The Respondent has owned, occupied, controlled and/or operated the facility at all material times hereto.
- 4. On December 18, 2012, Don Terry, Field Inspector, Jackson County Health Department, inspected the facility. A true and correct copy of the inspection report, along with Mr. Terry's affidavit, are attached and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.

VIOLATIONS

On the basis of Field Inspector, Don Terry's, direct observations, he has determined that the Respondent has caused or allowed open dumping at the above described facility in a manner that resulted in the following violations:

That on December 18, 2102, an on-site inspection of the facility disclosed the following:

- 1. The Respondent has caused or allowed litter at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1).
- 2. The Respondent has caused or allowed scavenging at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(2).
- 3. The Respondent has caused or allowed open burning at the facility in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3).
- 4. The Respondent has caused or allowed, at the facility, the deposition of general construction or demolition debris; or clean construction or demolition debris in violation of 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(7).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than March 1, 2013, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1, and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the civil penalty fine stated above.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, checks shall be made payable in equal amounts (50% of total penalty each) to:

- (1) County of Jackson, c/o Jackson County Treasurer, Jackson County Courthouse, Murphsyboro, Illinois 62966; and
- (2) Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276.

Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Forms with payments to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Complainant may either initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court or other debt collection actions to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

You have the right to contest this Citation, pursuant to 415 ILCS 5/31.1. If you elect to contest this Citation, you must file a Petition For Review with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board. A copy of the Petition For Review shall be filed with Daniel Brenner, Assistant State's Attorney, Jackson County Courthouse, Third Floor, Murphysboro, Il 62966 YOUR PETITION FOR REVIEW MUST BE FILED WITHIN 35 DAYS OF THE DATE OF SERVICE OF THE PRESENT CITATION ON YOU. YOUR PETITION MUST STATE THE REASON(S) YOU BELIEVE THE PRESENT MATTER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED. IF YOU FAIL TO FILE YOUR PETITION AND STATE THE REASONS THE PRESENT MATER SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED, A DEFAULT ORDER AGAINST YOU WILL BE ENTERED BY THE POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD.

GENERAL REMARKS

During the stated date and time, I conducted an inspection of the site listed above. This inspection was made as a follow up to a complaint received by the Jackson County Health Department. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were: Sunny with strong, gusting winds and a temperature of approximately 53°F. I was accompanied on this inspection by Kyle Scerena of the Jackson County Health Department. According to the Jackson County Assessor's Office, the site owner is Christopher Will. During the inspection a truck labeled "C Will Construction" was observed (Photo #4, Site Sketch) which would seem to confirm that Mr. Will owns the site.

I arrived at the site and parked in the driveway just west of the residence. I went to the west-facing door of the residence and knocked several times with no one responding. I called out in a loud voice "health department" several times with no one responding.

From a location near the west side of the residence, I looked south and observed piles of material lying along the west side of a shed (Photo #1, Site Sketch-Shed A). Since the material in this area was not being protected for future use and was being stored in an "unsightly" manner, it was considered waste. The waste I observed in this area consisted of, but was not limited to: waste tires, scrap metal, plastic containers, PVC pipe and metal gas cylinders. South of the waste lying along "Shed A" I observed more open dumped waste.

I continued walking south along the drive way while calling out in a loud voice "health department," still with no one responding. As I continued walking south along the driveway I observed, from various locations, more open dumped waste. The waste I observed consisted of, but was not limited to: waste tires, scrap metal and a refrigerator (Photos #2 & #3, Site Sketch-Area A), a boat, dimensional lumber, a riding lawn mower, scrap metal and fiberglass insulation (Photo #5, Site Sketch).

South of the waste in the area labeled "A" on the site sketch I observed a large waste pile (Photos #6 -#11, Site Sketch-Area B). The waste in this area consisted of, but was not limited to: scrap metal, a metal fuel tank, bicycle, metal sinks, plastic containers, electrical wiring, dimensional lumber, waste tires, metal conduit, metal roofing, insulation, a computer tower, porcelain fixtures, and a plastic tarpaulin (Photos #6 - #10, Site Sketch-Area B).

I also observed in the area labeled "B" on the site sketch, a metal barrel that was cut in half and was charred (Photo #11, Site Sketch-Area B). I observed that the area inside the barrel and the ground around it was charred, which indicated that open burning had occurred at this location. I also observed short strands of charred, metal wire on the ground around this metal barrel, which indicated that the wire had been subjected to open burning.

From my location near the metal barrel, I looked to the southeast and observed a damaged mobile home and waste open dumped on the ground near it. The ground in the area around the damaged mobile home was bare of vegetation and appeared as if it had been recently disturbed and graded. The area with the disturbed soil sloped downward toward what appeared to be an intermittent stream or natural gully. I walked toward the area of disturbed soil and observed, more closely, the damaged mobile home and the waste piles (Photos #12 & #13, Site Sketch). The waste in this area consisted of, but was not limited to: cardboard boxes, plastic caulk tubes, ash, dimensional lumber, plastic and other materials not readily identifiable (Photos #12 & #13, Site Sketch).

To the east I observed a waste pile that was giving off grey-white smoke near the edge of the intermittent stream (Photo #14, Site Sketch). I walked to the edge of the intermittent stream and observed waste had been dumped in it (Photos #15 & #16, Site Sketch-Area C). The waste I observed open dumped into the intermittent stream consisted of, but was not limited to: dimensional lumber, tar roofing shingles (different colors), insulation, paper, a plastic gas container, ash, broken glass, garbage and soil that had been pushed on top of the waste (Photos #15 & #16, Site Sketch-Area C). Looking south along the upper edge of the intermittent stream I observed waste that included, but was not limited to: ash, dimensional lumber, concrete blocks, plywood, plastic clothes hangers, wooden pallets, ash and plastic items (Photos #17 & #18, Site Sketch-Area C). Some of the waste in this area continued to give of the grey-white smoke, indicating that open burning had recently occurred at this location. Also, I observed a ridge of soil along the upper edge of the intermittent stream which would seem to indicate that soil was being pushed out onto the waste in an effort to cover it (Photo #17 & #18, Site Sketch-Area C).

At the time of the inspection, the materials listed as waste in the above narrative were either not in use, not useable in their current condition, or were not stored in such a way as to protect any future use. Also, at the time of the inspection, the items that were listed as waste were unorganized, unlabeled and stored in an unsightly manner.

The total volume of waste observed was approximately in excess of 300 cubic yards.

My inspection ended at approximately 12:33 p.m.

Item #6(21)(d)(1): Conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation: Without a permit: At the time of the inspection, the Jackson County Health Department (Department) had not received from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) documentation that Mr. Will had received a permit from the Agency to conduct a waste-storage, waste-treatment or waste-disposal operation.

Item #6(21)(d)(2): Conduct any waste-storage, waste-treatment, or waste-disposal operation: In violation of any regulations or standards adopted by the Board: During the inspection, violations of regulations or standards adopted by the Board regarding the operation of a waste-storage, waste-treatment or waste-disposal site were observed. One such violation was of 811.107(k) that prohibits uncontrolled litter at the site. During the inspection, the open dumping of waste that resulted in litter was observed.

<u>Item #7(21)(e)</u>: Dispose, treat, store, or abandon any waste, or transport any waste into the State at/to sites not meeting requirements of the Act: At the time of the inspection, waste that had been transported to this site from another site and which had been disposed, treated, stored or abandoned was observed. Also, at the time of the inspection, this site did not meet the requirements of the Act for landfills in Illinois.
