JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

FACTS

1. That Industrial Demolition, Inc. is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 21193 Sunrise View Lane, Staunton, Macoupin County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Staunton/Industrial Demolition, Inc.
2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 1171050009.
3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
4. That on November 28, 2012, Mark Weber of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 1-14-13, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7010 2780 0002 1167 5744.

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Mark Weber during the course of his November 28, 2012 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2010).

- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in open burning, a violation of Section 21(p)(3) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(3) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00). If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than February 15, 2013, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois

Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondents check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS
ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

Affiant, Mark J. Weber, being first duly sworn, voluntarily deposes and states as follows:



On November 28, 2012 Mr. Mark Weber, Division of Land Pollution Control/Field Operations Section (DLPC/FOS) - Springfield Regional Office (SRO), conducted a re-inspection of the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site in Macoupin County. The SRO had conducted the initial inspection on March 23, 2010 after receiving a complaint indicating the owner/operator had been burning railroad ties on-site. The Industrial Demolition, Inc. site is located at 21193 Sunrise View Lane approximately 1 mile northeast of Staunton, Illinois and immediately east of Interstate 55.

Legally and specifically the property is located in Section Numbered Twenty-two (22) in the Township Number Seven (7) North, Range Number Six (6) West of the Third Principal Meridian, in Macoupin County and State of Illinois. The legal description was derived from a Warranty Deed filed on October 23, 1995 with the Macoupin County Recorder's Office. The owner on the October 25, 1995 deed is listed as Industrial Demolition, Inc. Mr. Robert Sanvi has been identified as President of Industrial Demolition, Inc. A mailing address for Industrial Demolition, Inc. is provided as 2846 Shady Pine Staunton, Illinois, 62088. Please refer to that attached Corporation File Detail Report.

Site History

It is important to note that the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site has been subject to a couple of IEPA inspections during its operational history. This initial IEPA inspection of the site was conducted on December 24, 1994. An IEPA inspector observed and photo documented the open burning of waste on-site while in the area on a separate site inspection. As a result of that inspection Mr. Sanvi was sent an Administrative Warning Notice (AWN) which ordered him to discontinue all open dumping and open burning and open burning. A re-inspection was conducted on March 1, 1995 and all violations were considered resolved as a result thereof.

Another complaint was received by the SRO on August 25, 1998 regarding the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site. The complaint alleged that railroad ties were being burned on-site. As a result of the complaint the SRO conducted a site inspection on October 21, 1998. The IEPA inspector did not observe any violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act at the site at that time.

As mentioned earlier in this report a complaint inspection of Industrial Demolition, Inc. was conducted on March 23, 2010. While the IEPA inspector was unable to document that

wastes were being open burned on-site as indicated by the complainant, a significant volume of open dumped waste was observed and documented. As a result of the 2010 complaint inspection an Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) dated April 22, 2010 was sent to the responsible party. Very little correspondence was forthcoming from the responsible party following the issuance of the ACWN. A single letter requesting a deadline extension to complete site clean-up was received by the SRO on May 25, 2010. The responsible party was given an extension until August 31, 2010 to complete site clean-up.

On November 17, 2011 the IEPA conducted a re-inspection of the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site. At the time of the November 2011 re-inspection the IEPA inspector was able to gain access to the property. It appeared that some of the open dumped wastes documented during the 2010 complaint inspection had been removed. As a result of the 2011 re-inspection Mr. Sanvi was given until February 29, 2012 to complete site clean-up. In May of 2012 the responsible party submitted to the SRO waste hauling receipts indicating that at least some of the open dumped wastes had been removed.

November 28, 2012 Re-Inspection

The November 28, 2012 IEPA re-inspection of the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site took place between 1050 and 1130 hours. The temperature was approximately 45° Fahrenheit. Skies were mostly sunny with no wind. Soil conditions were dry. Neither the property owner nor a site representative was present for the re-inspection. There was a sign near the entrance to the facility indicating that the entire property and/or business were for sale.

Upon entering the property it was immediately evident that some open dumped wastes have been removed. Railroad ties remain on-site but the volume is less than observed during the 2010 and 2011 inspections. There was a sign hanging on the fence near the entrance to the facility indicating that railroad ties were for sale. However, two significant piles of rotting railroad ties were again observed. It appears that the railroad ties that are in good enough condition to have resale value have been neatly stacked at a separate location on-site from the rotting ties. All of the used tires documented during the 2010 complaint inspection appear to have been removed or at least properly stored. However, there has been no documentation forthcoming from the responsible party that the used tires have been properly managed.

A significant difference from the previous inspections was the evidence of an inactive open burn area on-site. Based upon the partially burned material it appears that landscape waste was the primary waste being burned at this location. Illinois law allows for landscape waste generated on-site to be open burned at the same location in which it was generated. However, the IEPA inspector also observed and documented some metals and partially melted plastic in this location.

Aside from the remaining railroad ties there also remains a significant volume of scrap metal located on-site. There are various scrap metal piles located throughout the property. Most of the piles of scrap metal appear to be segregated by the type of metal they are composed of. Previously there were two separate piles composed of lengths of plastics or rubber tubing located on-site as well. These waste piles were initially thought to be composed of corrugated tubing during the 2010 complaint inspection. Upon closer observation it appears the tubing was likely insulated fire hose cut into short sections. Regardless, all of the tubing has been removed from the ground.

During the November 2011 three above ground storage tanks (ASTs) located along the eastern fence line were observed and documented. It appears that the ASTs have been removed. No receipts have been provided by the responsible party pertaining to the sale, disposal, or scrapping of the ASTs. A pile of demolition debris composed of broken concrete remains on-site as well. The total volume of open dumped waste that remains on-site is estimated at 200 cubic yards. Please refer to the attached photographs for depictions of site conditions as they appeared during the November 28, 2012 inspection.

Photograph #1 is of a large pile of rotting railroad ties that remains on-site.

Photograph #2 provides a close up of the same pile of railroad ties in photo #1.

Photograph #3 provides a view of 5 gallon buckets of transmission fluid.

Photograph #4 shows the former location of a pile of insulated rubber hose.

Photograph #5 is of a roll off box at the location of the pile of insulated rubber hose.

Photograph #6 depicts insulated rubber hose and other wastes that have been placed in the roll off box.

Photograph #7 shows piles of segregated scrap metals located on-site.

Photograph #8 is of short sections of black plastic tubing and some valves.

Photograph #9 depicts an inactive open burn location at the site. It appears that at least a small volume of plastics and metals were burned at this location.

Photograph #10 is of another pile of rotting railroad ties located on-site.

Photograph #11 provides a view of stacked railroad ties. It appears that these ties may have some resale value given their condition.

Photograph #12 is of a large pile of mixed metals.

Based upon observations made during the November 28, 2012 re-inspection it is apparent that violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act persist at the Industrial Demolition site. The violations of the Act which persist include Sections: 9(a), 9(c), 21(a), 21(d)(1), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 21(p)(7) as well as an apparent violation of the Regulations, 35 IAC Section 812.101(a). Refer to the attached Open Dump Checklist for additional information.

The IEPA inspector left the Industrial Demolition, Inc. site around 1130 hours and proceeded to conduct another site inspection in the area.






