I would like to request that Midwest Generation's request for temporary relief PC# 8519 from the state's regulation on air emissions

I'm an employee at the Powerton station that Midwest Generation owns. As an employee I'm treated very kindly by management, they are generous and respectful. Senior Management from Edison International are also very humble and seem sincere.

I'm no dummy, I do realize that fossil fuels such as coal are probably not the healthiest option for people. I believe when providing energy we should consider costs, availability and health factors.

The environmental groups such as the Sierra Club are good at protests, but offer no solutions for clean power. How many of the environmental group's members would be willing to give up air conditioning, heat, transportation, and other luxuries in their protest for ~~all~~ closing coal-fired plants.

The energy market works on supply and demand like any other business. If the Sierra Club could eliminate the demand for electricity every energy business in the country would close. Also, no coal-fired

units are slated to close, to comply with Federal Air regulations and the weak economy.

The middle class is suffering and any increase in the cost of electricity would be harmful to the middle class. In the industry many coal energy companies have entered into bankruptcy, <sup>because</sup> ~~but~~ of the record low costs of electricity.
