#### **JURISDICTION**

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

#### **FACTS**

- 1. That Robert & Tia Mixer are the current owners ("Respondent's") of a facility located immediately northwest of the intersection of Illinois Route 104 and E 1600<sup>th</sup> Street east of Quincy, Adams County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Gilmer Township/Mixer.
- 2. That said facility is an open dump operating without an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Operating Permit and is designated with Site Code No. 0018085007.
  - 3. That Respondent's have owned said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on February 4, 2013, Mark Weber of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Springfield Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of his inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 3-21-13, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7012 0470 0001 2998 5225.

#### **VIOLATIONS**

Based upon direct observations made by Mark Weber during the course of his February 4, 2013 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent's have violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

(1) That Respondent's caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1) (2010).

#### CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent's are subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)</u>. If Respondent's elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>April 18, 2013</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent's elect to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent's shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each

violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent's fail to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent's shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent's from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent's in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

### PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent's have the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent's elect to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent's shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent's.

On February 4, 2013 Mr. Mark Weber, Division of Land Pollution Control/Field Operations Section (DLPC/FOS) - Springfield Regional Office (SRO), conducted a re-inspection of the Mixer site in rural Adams County. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) SRO received an anonymous complaint on December 9, 2011 indicating that the property owner had been open dumping and open burning wastes on the site. As a result of the complaint the initial IEPA inspection of the Mixer site was conducted on December 14, 2011.

The description for the parcel is provided as the South Half (S1/2) of the Southeast Quarter (SE1/4) of Section Thirty-three (33), except the West Twenty (20) acres thereof, in Township One (1) South, Range Seven (7) West of the Fourth Principal Meridian, Adams County, Illinois. The legal description was derived from a 2007 warranty deed obtained by the IEPA inspector from the Adams County Recorder's Office. Robert M. and Tia R. Mixer are listed on the deed as the owners of the property. The property is located immediately northwest of the intersection of Illinois Route 104 and E 1600<sup>th</sup> Street. Mr. Mixer provided a mailing address to the inspector of 15604 Highway 104 Quincy, Illinois at the time of the inspection. Please refer to the attached aerial photograph for a depiction of the site location.

Open dumped wastes identified during the December 14, 2011 complaint inspection included dimensional lumber & pallets, automotive parts, plastics, mixed metals, paper, and glass. The open dumped wastes were scattered throughout the property. An inactive open burn area was also identified. The total volume of open dumped waste was estimated at 50 cubic yards. Approximately 50 off and on rim used tires were located onsite as well.

As a result of the complaint inspection an Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) dated January 20, 2012 was sent to the Mixers. Violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act cited in the ACWN included Sections 9(a), 9(c), 21(a), 21(d)(1), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 55(a)(1). Apparent violation of the Regulations, 35 Illinois Administrative Code (IAC) sections 812.101(a), 722.111, and 808.121 were also cited. The Mixers were given a deadline of March 31, 2012 to remove

all wastes from their property per the conditions of the ACWN. To date the Mixers have not provided the SRO with any receipts or manifests documenting the proper identification, disposal, or recycling of wastes from their property per the conditions of the ACWN.

#### February 4, 2013 Re-Inspection

The IEPA inspector arrived at the Mixer site at approximately 0945 hours on February 4, 2013. The temperature was approximately 40° Fahrenheit. Skies were partly sunny with a 10 mile per hour northwest wind. Site soil conditions were dry. There was no site representative present for the re-inspection, but Mr. Mixer owns and operates Mixer Blow-In Insulation from this location. There is no physical office or warehouse on-site.

Open dumped solid wastes observed during the re-inspection included dimensional lumber & pallets, mixed metals, plastics, liquid propane cylinders, lead acid batteries, paper, and cellulose insulation. The wastes are open dumped at various locations on-site. While much of the cellulose insulation is contained in plastic bags there is some scattered throughout the property. It does appear that the open burning of waste on-site has been discontinued. While some of the wastes observed during the complaint inspection have been removed, other wastes have been brought on-site. The total volume of open dumped wastes remains at 50 cubic yards. In addition to the open dumped wastes there are at least 50 used tires both on and off the rim located on-site. The off rim tires had been placed underneath a semi-trailer parked on the property.

During the initial complaint inspection IEPA personnel documented three 55-gallon drums on-site as well. When questioned about the drums Mr. Mixer indicated that they contained water which is hauled to job sites where insulation is blown in. None of the drums were placarded but one was marked "used oil". These drums were not present during the re-inspection. The responsible party was required per the conditions of the ACWN to identify the contents of the drums. If the contents meet the definition of a waste, a determination will need to be made if they are defined as hazardous or special waste per the requirements of 35 IAC 722.111 and 808.121. As mentioned earlier in this report there has been no waste characterization submitted by the responsible party.

This inspector also observed a plastic tub filled with what appeared to be a mixture of water and used oil. A used oil drip pan type of container was partially submerged within the tub itself. The mixture of water and used oil has been allowed to spill over the side of the tub and has plainly stained the soil underneath. Per the conditions of 35 IAC Section 739.122 which pertains specifically to used oil storage, the generator is required to contain the used oil in such a manner that it may not leak. Also the container used to store the used oil must be clearly marked with the words "Used Oil." Please refer to the attached photographs taken during the February 4, 2013 inspection for a depiction of site conditions as they existed at that time.

Photographs #1 provides a view of pallets, a large vinyl tarp, and dimensional lumber open dumped at the Mixer site.

Photograph #2 gives a view of blown in insulation stored on-site

Photograph #3 depicts the off rim used tires at the site. They have been placed under a semi-trailer. It did not appear that water had accumulated in any of the tires.

Photograph #4 depicts a significant pile of pallets at the Mixer site.

Photograph #5 shows pallets, plastics, insulation, and mixed metals open dumped on-site. On rim used tractor tires are also visible.

Photograph #6 is of used oil spilled at the Mixer site. The staining of site soil is clearly evident.

Photograph #7 depicts a farm implement and a vehicle abandoned at the Mixer site.

Photograph #8 shows more of the pallets and mixed metals open dumped on-site.

Photograph #9 is of plastics, mixed metals, and dimensional lumber open dumped onsite.

Photograph #10 is of even more pallets at the site and a trailer without current registration. The door to the trailer had a lock on it. It is likely used for site storage.

Photograph #11 shows plastic bags emptied of insulation and open dumped on-site.

Photograph #12 provides a view of the former open burn area at the Mixer site.


Photograph #13 is of two 100 lb. liquid propane cylinders located on-site.

Photograph #14 depicts a lead acid battery.

The February 4, 2013 re-inspection was conducted in order to determine if violations of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act cited in January 20, 2012 Administrative Citation Warning Notice (ACWN) persist at the Mixer site. Based upon observations made during the inspection it was determined that while some violations were addressed other do indeed persist at the site including some new violations. Violations of the Act include Sections: 21(a), 21(d)(1), 21(d)(2), 21(e), 21(p)(1), 21(p)(3), and 55(a)(1). Apparent violations of the Regulations, 35 IAC Sections 722.111, 739.122(b)(2), 739.122(c)(1), 808.121, and 812.101 were observed as well. Refer to the attached Open Dump Checklist for additional information.

The IEPA inspector left the Mixer site around 1010 hours and proceeded to conduct other inspections in Adams County, Illinois.






