## **Board Proposes First Notice Amendments to its Water Pollution Rules**

On November 5, 2015, the Board adopted an opinion and order proposing water pollution rule amendments for first-notice publication in the *Illinois Register*. The proposal will amend Part 309 of the Board's water pollution rules. Specifically, the proposal will amend the Board's water pollution rules for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits and state water permits.

The proposal revises the process for administratively continuing an NPDES permit after its expiration date. Under the proposed Part 309, a permit holder can submit a permit renewal application less than 180 days prior to expiration of the existing permit with permission of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The proposal clarifies existing exemptions to state permit requirements, adds new exemptions, and adds a lifetime permit provision for certain discharge sources, among other procedural revisions aimed at streamlining the permitting process.
