JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

FACTS

- 1. That Raben Tire Company, Inc. is the owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at 709 South Commercial Street, Harrisburg, Saline County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Harrisburg/Raben Tire Co.
 - That said facility is designated with Site Code No. 1650200020.
 - That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on July 17, 2013, Phillip Pierce-Savoie of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of the inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 5. That on 8-26-13, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Phillip Pierce-Savoie during the course of the July 17, 2013 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

(1) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used/waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>September 30, 2013</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elect not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative

Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

General Remarks

This inspection was made as a follow up to the October 12, 2012 inspection by this office and to respond to mosquito complaints that had been brought to the attention of this office. The inspection began at approximately 9:35am and concluded around 10:15am. It was ~80°F and sunny at the time of the inspection, and the ground conditions were normal. Eleven (11) pictures were taken of the facility.

After entering the facility and displaying my credentials I was directed to Mr. Shannon Bryan, Retail Store Manager. He attempted to locate the tire disposal records for the calendar year and the most recent ST-8 form, but these records are apparently no longer stored on site. The "Do Not Landfill Tires" sign was posted and visible from the customer service desk.

Used passenger and truck tires are stored in one of two box trailers. Tires are laced in these trailers, so there can potentially be over 1,200 passenger tires and 300 truck tires on this site. These trailers are removed for disposal as they are filled. This facility does not retain used tires for resale.

After inquiring about the paperwork I then viewed the tire disposal trailers and surroundings. Mr. Bryan accompanied me. The trailers were partially filled, and no passenger or truck tires were observed to be holding water There were recyclable tire carcasses on an open top trailer near the truck tire disposal trailer, but there were found to be dry. We then moved two one of the two grave pads where off-the-road (OTR) tires are stored. While attempts have been made to prevent these tires from accumulating water using blue poly tarps, water and mosquito larva were observed in both new and used tires. The storage pad I observed held about 75 new OTR tires and about 25 used OTR tires. Some of these tires were stored on a trailer with a tire hauler registration sticker that expired on 4-30-13. There was another tire storage pad that I noticed had barrel stacks that were covered with blue poly tarps. The tarps had shredded off some of these stack.

Inspection Findings:

This facility is a registered full tire storage site. Current regulations in the State of Illinois require that ALL used and/or waste tires must be stored in such a manner that none can accumulate water at any time. This includes the large industrial and agricultural (OTR) tires. Attempts to use blue poly tarps to prevent the OTR tires from accumulating water have not been successful based on water and mosquito larva observed in tires.


Additional Remarks:

This site is a registered Tire Storage Site, and the fee was entered at paid on March 6, 2013. It is advisable to retain copies of the current and previous quarter disposal records and ST-8 form. While the IEPA does not regulate new tire storage, the discovery of mosquito larva in the new OTR tires is a public health concern, and should be addressed.

Summary of Violations:

Failure to prevent the accumulation of water in used/waste tires
Used tires stored outside of a building and allowed to accumulate water are considered to be open dumped
Open dumped tires constitute litter

Used tires holding water allowing vectors (mosquitoes) to propagate and proliferate
