JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014).

FACTS

- That Ponderosa Land Trust is the current owner of a facility located at 305 ½ Carbon
 Street, Marion, Williamson County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois
 Environmental Protection Agency as Ponderosa Land Trust.
 - That said facility is designated with Site Code No. 1990555227.
 - That Respondent has owned said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on July 24, 2014, Garrison Gross and Phillip Pierce-Savoie of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Marion Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of the inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 8-19-14, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7012 0470 0001 3000 94/5

VIOLATIONS

Based upon direct observations made by Garrison Gross and Phillip Pierce-Savoie during the course of the July 24, 2014 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in litter, a violation of Section 21(p)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(1)(2014).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the open dumping of waste in a manner resulting in proliferation of disease vectors, a violation of Section 21(p)(5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/21(p)(5)(2014).
- (3) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2014).

CIVIL PENALTY

On March 20, 2014, the Board found Ponderosa Land Trust in violation of Sections 21(p)(1) and 55(k)(1)of the Act in AC 14-31.

Because this Administrative Citation addresses a second or subsequent violation of Sections 21(p)(1) and 55(k)(1) of the Act, pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5)

(2014), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for each violation for a total of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00). Additionally, pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2014), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the violation of Section 21(p)(5). The total civil penalty due is Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00). If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than October 7, 2014, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2014), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing, Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) statutory civil penalty.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2014), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondents' check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2014). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.



General Remarks: A Follow-Up Tire Storage Site Inspection was conducted on Thursday, July 24, 2014 at the Ponderosa Land Trust property. The inspection was conducted by Garrison Gross and Phillip Pierce-Savoie representing the Illinois EPA Bureau of Land. The site is located at 305 1/2 Carbon Street in Marion, Illinois and is immediately adjacent to a residential neighborhood. The inspection was performed as a follow-up to a previous inspection conducted on December 23, 2013. Weather conditions at the time of the inspection were partly cloudy skies, 71° F, with a moderate breeze. Surface conditions were dry. The inspection began at approximately 11:10 A.M. and ended at approximately 11:45 A.M.

<u>Inspection Findings</u>: Numerous tires were observed from Carbon Street. The tires were loaded on a utility trailer and were not being protected from accumulating water. We entered the site and attempted to make contact with someone at the garage building. It appeared that Crites Automotive had ceased doing business at the location. We knocked on the door but no one answered. We continued the inspection by walking and photographing the site.

Tire Storage / Tire Disposal:

Fifty (50) used / waste tires were observed on a utility trailer. The trailer did not have a license plate. The trailer was not displaying a registered tire transporter placard (photo 001). The serial number and tongue were also photographed (photos 010 and 011). The tires on the trailer were off rim and most of them had accumulated water (photo 002). No mosquito larvae were observed in the tires on the utility trailer.

Approximately ninety-five (95) used / waste tires were observed along the north side of the garage building and on a flatbed truck (004, 006 and 012). All of the tires observed in this area were off the rim and most of them had accumulated (photo 003). Numerous tires contained mosquito larvae and some adult Asian Tiger Mosquitoes were observed (photo 005). Although some of the tires on the flat-bed truck were covered with a tarp, they were still accumulating water due to rips and deterioration of the material. Used / waste tires were being stored closer than 25 feet to a building. It should also be noted that the used / waste tires were being stored less than 40 feet from an active railroad and railroad spur where railcars are staged. Approximately 1/2 pound of Abate larvicide was applied to the tires to control mosquito larvae.

The door to the building was unlocked and forty-seven (47) used / waste tires were being stored inside the garage (photo 016). Inspectors found approximately 192 tires located at the site. Used / waste tires are not being systematically removed from the site and are considered open dumped (litter).

Automotive Fluids: One 55-gallon drum was stored outside along the north side of the garage (photo 008). The drum was labeled as windshield solvent but upon inspection of the contents, it was determined that the fluid was used oil (photo 007). The drum contained approximately 25 gallons of used oil.


Other Wastes: A plastic truck bed liner was observed at the north end of the property. The bed liner contained televisions, computer monitors, plastic buckets, tires and carpeting (photo 009). The flatbed truck was considered waste because it did not have a current license plate and it did not appear to have been driven for several years (photo 013). Plate number (33 146 H) was dated June 1996. I opened the door to check for the serial number (photos 014 and 015). A wasp nest with live wasps was observed inside the cab which provided further evidence that the vehicle was not in use.

Additional Remarks: The license plate of the flatbed truck was searched by the Secretary of State. Plate number (33 146 H) is not on file in their computer database due to the age of the plate. Information concerning property ownership / control was obtained through tax records available from the Supervisor of Assessment's Office in Williamson County. Ponderosa Land Trust is listed as the property owner. Tax bills are mailed to Jim Reichert, TC, P.O. Box 1, Marion, Illinois 62959. The property contains four parcels: 06-13-351-001, 06-13-351-003, 06-13-351-004 and 06-13-351-005 (approximately 1.03 acres)


Inspection Site Sketch Date: July 24, 2014


