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ILLINOIS EPA'S RESPONSES TO BOARD QUESTIONS

NOW COMES the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, ("Illinois EPA" or "Agency") by and through its counsel, and hereby submits the Agency's responses to the Illinois Pollution Control Board's (Board) questions contained in its May 7, 2015, Order.

I. Documents Requested By the Board

The Board directed the Agency to submit a copy of the updated Large CAFO Inventory submitted to U.S. EPA. The Illinois EPA attaches this inventory as Exhibit 1.

The Board directed the Agency to indicate whether it has received from U.S. EPA a review of the Illinois EPA's plan, submitted to U.S. EPA on October 31, 2014, for maintaining the inventory. Illinois EPA has not received U.S. EPA's review.

The Board directed the Agency to submit a copy of the final plan to the Board whenever this plan is filed with U.S. EPA. Illinois EPA will file its final plan with the Board at the same time it files the final plan with U.S. EPA.

II. Requests for Comment from the Agency

A. Environmental Groups' Methodology

The Board asked the Agency to comment on whether the Agency concurs with the methodology used by the Environmental Groups in both analyzing data from the Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) and in identifying specific facilities using satellite images and other information. The Illinois EPA does not concur with the methodology used

by the Environmental Groups for the following reasons: (1) 1,000 animal units is not equivalent to a Large CAFO under Subtitle E; (2) one facility may have multiple construction approvals issued by the IDOA; (3) Large CAFOs are not determined by design capacity under Subtitle E; (4) the Environmental Groups do not consider inactive or abandoned sites; (5) the Environmental Groups do not consider common ownership, as defined under the Subtitle E regulations. The Agency believes its inventory is more accurate and its methodology is more efficient than the Environmental Groups'. In order to maintain a CAFO Inventory that is accurate, it is imperative that the Illinois EPA continue to follow its current procedures, including conducting an on-farm site visit, prior to adding or removing facilities from the CAFO inventory.

1. Animal Units

In their response to Agency comments, the Environmental Groups state “[A] facility that is 1,000 animal units or more would generally be considered a large CAFO by IEPA.” R12-23A, Environmental Groups' Response to Agency Comments at 6 (February 3, 2105). The Environmental Groups provide examples showing this commonality between the number of animals equaling 1,000 animal units under the Livestock Management Facilities Act (LMFA) and the number, size and type of animals required to meet the definition of a Large CAFO. The examples cited for swine weighing 55 pounds or more, dairy cattle, beef cattle, and turkeys in the Environmental Groups response demonstrates that 1,000 animal units, in a generic sense, equals the number of animals that would be defined as a Large CAFO.

The Environmental Groups' response also references data from the IDOA which indicates that since the LMFA became effective 516 facilities of 1,000 or more animal units

had been constructed and 34 more were under construction. The Environmental Groups' response suggests that based on the 550 (516 + 34) facilities identified in the LMFA data, there are many more Large CAFOs that have been constructed or under construction than have been identified in the Illinois EPA's CAFO Inventory.

Under the Board's Subtitle E regulations, Large CAFOs are based on the number, size and type of a specific animal species being confined, not on total animal units. Additionally, in the cases of chickens and ducks, the type of manure handling system (liquid handling versus non-liquid handling) also impacts the number of animals needed to be considered a Large CAFO. For example, if a facility houses 500 dairy cows and 800 cattle other than mature dairy cows or veal cows, the facility would not be considered a Large CAFO because the facility does not contain more than 700 dairy cows or 1000 cattle other than mature dairy cows or veal cows. Each animal species is evaluated individually. Once a facility is a CAFO for one species, it is a CAFO for all species. If a facility is not a Large CAFO for any one species, it will not be considered Large by adding all the species together.

Under the LMFA, however, this same facility has over 1,000 animal units because the number of all animals at a given facility is converted into animal units. When using animal units under the LMFA, a distinction is not made between the types of the species of animals confined. Unlike the definition of Large CAFO under Subtitle E, the LMFA data used by the Environmental Groups does not account for the number, size and type of animals within a given species and the type of manure handling system (liquid handling versus non-liquid handling) utilized at the facility. The Agency believes these details make

the Environmental Groups' methodology unreliable. The Illinois EPA will further illustrate this point in the following discussion of swine and poultry CAFOs.

According to the LMFA data, Illinois has 473 swine facilities with than 1,000 animal units. The LMFA data, however, lacks sufficient information to determine whether these "large" facilities meet the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E. Some of the swine facilities identified with 1,000 or more animal units could be swine finishing operations where all of the confined swine weigh 55 pounds or more, and these facilities would meet the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E. Some of the swine facilities, however, could be sow farms that confine sows and their litters (piglets) and may potentially also confine nursery pigs being raised as future replacement sows. The piglets and nursery pigs weigh less than 55 pounds. To determine if these facilities meet the definition of Large CAFO under Subtitle E, the Agency must know the number of swine weighing 55 pounds or more and the number of swine weighing less than 55 pounds. This information is not provided by the LMFA data. It is not uncommon for a sow farm to confine less than 2,500 swine weighing 55 pounds or more, and confine enough swine weighing less than 55 pounds to provide a total of 1,000 or more animal units, but not meet the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E. Therefore, the Agency cannot assume that when the LMFA reports a facility confining 1,000 or more animal units of swine, this facility is a Large CAFO. As a result, the Illinois EPA believes the Environmental Groups use of the LMFA data is unreliable.

According to the LMFA data, Illinois has 12 poultry facilities identified as having 1,000 animal units or more. Unfortunately, this LMFA data lacks sufficient detail to allow the Agency to determine whether these 12 facilities meet the definition of a Large CAFO

under Subtitle E. A facility with a liquid manure handling system is considered a Large CAFO under Subtitle E if it has 30,000 or more hens. If the facility, however, has a dry manure handling system, the facility must have 82,000 or more hens to be considered a Large CAFO. The LMFA data does not make this distinction. Additionally, it is possible for a poultry facility to have both a liquid waste handling system and dry waste handling system; under the LMFA the total animal units served by these two systems would be added together, potentially totaling total over 1,000 or animal units. Under Subtitle E, these chickens would not be added together in determining whether the facility is a Large CAFO.

Therefore, when evaluating the LMFA data, the Agency cannot assume a facility confining 1,000 or more animal units meets the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E.

2. Multiple Construction Approvals

The LMFA data indicates that 550 Notices of Intent to Construct have been approved for facilities having 1,000 or more animal units (516 with construction completed and 34 under construction). Using the LMFA data, the Environmental Groups assert there are 550 large facilities each with separate locations that have been constructed in Illinois. The Illinois EPA does not believe this to be true. There have been 550 approvals, including approvals for the replacement of old structures taken out of service and for the expansion of structures at existing locations. Multiple construction approvals have been issued for numerous existing locations as the expansion or replacement of structures at those locations occurs. Some locations have multiple structures on one site. The animals confined at these locations where multiple LMFA construction approvals have been issued generally meet the definition of a single Large CAFO under Subtitle E. In other words, each construction approval issued

under LMFA does not equal a single Large CAFO. The Agency believes the Environmental Groups methodology of counting each construction approval as a separate facility is unreliable. In doing so, the Environmental Groups have over-calculated the number of potential Large CAFOs. The Agency believes the number of Large CAFOs is significantly less than the 550 facilities claimed by the Environmental Groups through the use of the LMFA data.

3. Design Capacity vs Actual Capacity

The LMFA requirements are based on the design capacity (the maximum number of animal units) that the livestock waste handling facility will serve. The definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E is based on the number of animals actually being confined. After construction, some of the facilities identified in the LMFA data as having 1,000 or more animal units may not be operated in a manner that actually confines as many animals as required to meet the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E, and therefore would not be included in the IEPA's CAFO Inventory.

4. Inactive or Abandoned Sites

A facility may have been constructed and identified in the LMFA data, but now, for whatever reason, may be inactive. Therefore, such a facility does not meet the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E since animals are not actually being confined; these sites would not be included in the Illinois EPA's CAFO Inventory.

5. Common Ownership Issues

The definition of common ownership for livestock waste management facilities and livestock waste handling facilities found in the LMFA requirements is different than the common ownership definition for animal feeding operations found in Subtitle E. Under the

LMFA, livestock waste management facilities and livestock waste handling facilities that have common ownership and are not separated by a minimum distance of a quarter (1/4) of a mile are considered single livestock management or livestock waste handling facilities. Under Subtitle E, Section 501.225 provides that two or animal feeding operations under common ownership are deemed to be a single animal feeding operation if they are adjacent to each other, or if they utilize a common area or system for the disposal of wastes. 35 Ill. Adm. Code 501.225(b).

Consequently, livestock waste management and/or livestock management facilities may be considered a single facility under Subtitle E, but multiple facilities under LMFA. For example, two facilities greater than a quarter (1/4) of a mile apart that constitute two separate facilities under the LMFA are considered a single animal feeding operation under Subtitle E if these two facilities share a common area or system for the disposal of waste. As a result, fewer facilities could potentially be found in Illinois EPA's CAFO Inventory than identified in the LMFA data.

6. Satellite Imagery

Google Earth imagery can be used to verify the existence of a facility identified in LMFA's data as having 1,000 animal units or more. However, such imagery cannot be used to definitively determine whether the mere existence of such a facility meets the definition of a Large CAFO under Subtitle E. As previously stated, the definition of a Large CAFO is dependent on the number, size and type of animals within a given species being confined and for some species the type of manure handling system (liquid handling versus non-liquid handling) utilized. The number of animals actually being confined cannot be determined by aerial imagery or air plane fly-overs and must be verified by direct contact with the facility,

such as during a site visit. In addition, determining whether a facility is actively confining livestock or is inactive may not be possible by using aerial imagery or fly-overs. These limitations are especially true in the case of the total confinement buildings utilized in the production of swine, chickens, turkeys, etc.

The Agency is aware of an instance where U.S. EPA personnel completed a fly-over of a swine facility, and based on their observations, U.S. EPA suspected the facility to be a Large CAFO. Upon completing a site visit at the swine facility after the fly-over, U.S. EPA personnel determined the swine farm confined a total of only 600 swine and did not meet the definition of a large CAFO under Subtitle E. A number of the buildings suspected from the air to confine swine actually were used for the storage of farm machinery utilized in crop production. Aerial imagery may be used to help prioritize those facilities needing on-farm site visits to determine whether the facilities meet the definition of a Large CAFO, but cannot be used independently to populate a CAFO inventory.

7. Illinois EPA's Inventory

The Illinois EPA's CAFO inventory process produces an inventory which more accurately reflects the true number of Large CAFOs found in the State than the Environmental Groups methodology, and does so in a more efficient manner. Under Illinois EPA's process, explained in the December 3, 2014, Response to Board Questions, the Agency reviews all the available information on animal feeding operations. In addition to LMFA data and aerial imagery, the Agency considers citizen complaints and/or inquires, facility contacts, inspection reports, NPDES permit application files (CAFO applications and Stormwater NOIs), Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) information, surface water section stream surveys, and Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Response

Center Incident reports. The Illinois EPA performs an in-depth review of the information collected from all of these sources. This review prevents duplication of CAFOs and the accidental inclusion of non-CAFOs on the Illinois EPA's inventory. Most importantly, the Agency's process includes field verification through inspections. Based on the inspections, Illinois EPA will include, remove, or amend the information in the CAFO inventory. During the inspections, the Agency gains more complete information about the animal feeding operations than provided in the methodology suggested by the Environmental Groups. Not only does the Agency monitor the number of Large CAFOs through inspections, it also evaluates compliance with Subtitle E and the Clean Water Act, and the need for the CAFOs to obtain NPDES Permit coverage. The Illinois EPA believes its CAFO inventory process is much more efficient and accurate than the Environmental Groups'.

8. Conclusion

The Environmental Groups' methodologies have many shortcomings which the Agency described above. The Environmental Groups claim there are many more Large CAFOs in Illinois than reported by Illinois EPA. Illinois EPA disagrees with the Environmental Groups and believes its inventory closely reflects the actual number of Large CAFOs in Illinois. The inherent shortcomings of the Environmental Groups' methodologies only reinforce the need to follow the procedures employed by Illinois EPA personnel in order to add or remove facilities from the inventory. Now that the Agency has developed and fine-tuned its sophisticated method of maintaining the CAFO Inventory, it does not believe the Environmental Groups' methodology or a registration program through a Board regulation is necessary.

B. Proposed Section 501.505(c)(2)

The Board asked the Agency to comment on whether the Agency suggests deleting proposed Section 501.505(c)(2) or (c)(3). The Agency believes that county, township, section and quarter section information is adequate to locate potential CAFOs. The Illinois EPA can find a CAFO to conduct an inspection with this information. At the inspection, the Agency will be able to obtain the CAFO's street address and latitude and longitude location. The Agency believes the Board should strike all of Section 501.505(c)(2) should it proceed to First Notice.

C. Large CAFOs Existing before 1996

The Board asked the Agency to comment on how the Agency will identify Large CAFOs existing before 1996 that have not submitted any of the four construction documents used for the database.

The Agency has many avenues to collect information about pre-1996 Large CAFOs. First, the Agency has been regulating CAFOs since the 1970s and has institutional knowledge about animal feeding operations across the State. Second, the Agency has performed inspections of animal feeding operations since 1972, and has kept a record of these inspections (between 1986 and 1996, the Agency inspected approximately 225 facilities a year). Third, the Agency has a historic database that was used, along with inspection and livestock summaries, by the Illinois EPA when it first formulated the current CAFO inventory. Fourth, the Illinois EPA will collect information on pre-1996 dairy facilities that are currently active from the IDPH. Fifth, older facilities that expand or

replace older structures must obtain LMFA construction approval. Finally, the Agency receives numerous citizen complaints (over 200 in 2011) on CAFOs. Illinois EPA does not believe its inventory is deficient because the LMFA database does not predate 1996.
