Dear IPCB Clerk Therriault,

Coal combustion produces dangerous coal ash waste that contains mercury, arsenic, lead and other health-threatening pollutants that are leaching into our water supplies. These deadly pollutants increase severe health risks including cancer, neurological disorders, birth defects, reproductive failure, asthma and other serious illnesses. We need the proposed rules for regulating coal combustion waste in Illinois to be implemented now! I urge the Board to not stay the coal ash rulemaking proceeding.

The federal coal ash rules are clear, legally effective, and in force. However, the Illinois rules add important additional protections that the federal rules do not contain.

The federal coal ash rules do not address compliance with Illinois groundwater or surface water quality standards. The Board should adopt state coal ash rules as soon as possible, to help ensure corrective actions or closures comply with state groundwater and surface water quality standards.

The federal rules do not govern coal ash impoundments located at now-shuttered power generating facilities. Illinois waters are threatened by several of these 'legacy' coal ash waste pits, and the state rules would provide a roadmap to address those problems.

The state rule is also an important opportunity to include financial assurances, as recommended by the Illinois Attorney General's office, to ensure the state isn't left to cover cleanup and closure costs.

I urge the Board decline to stay the coal ash rulemaking proceeding.
