Our grandson didn't know where to put them so he set them there thinking we would be putting them on our vehicles but, a storm hit and they got frozen to the ground and buried for a while. I had to wait for a thaw to get stuff apart. So at the time weather along with health we couldn't get it done as we planned. Our grandson was working away from here so I couldn't ask for his help. The tires could draw any mosquitos or larve because it was winter and I knew as it thawed we would be putting them to use and they wouldn't be there.

The wood pill, as you call debris, from a remodel was cleaned up right after as it thawed, we put it as it thawed in the dumpster we have and also hauled to the county dump. Same thing, as the weather permitted, the wood was put there because we had a large snow storm or ice not sure which one at this time and the garbage man couldn't get down to dump us that week so after it was dumped we put what we could in the dumpster and what we couldn't we hauled to the landfill.

This was not an intentional act just a lot of things happened through out the year that led to the misshap.

I don't know what I can say except we only live on 1600. a month and 970. a month is our morgage, what's left we pay what bills we can. My husband is on a life support machine for his breathing or our electric would already be off. I don't know what more we can take, but as they say the good lord doesn't give you more then you can handle. If we loose this battle then our payments on the fine have to be VERY VERY low.
