

Board Adopts Technical Corrections to Volatile Organic Material Emissions Regulations

On December 16, 2010, the Illinois Pollution Control Board adopted amendments to its air regulations addressing emission of volatile organic material (VOM). The rulemaking is docketed as In the Matter of: Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) for Volatile Organic Material Emissions From Group II Consumer & Commercial Products: Proposed Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 211, 218, and 219, R10-08(A). This rulemaking resulted from an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) motion seeking to correct a technical error in recently-adopted rules. The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) on December 14, 2010, issued a Certificate of No Objection.
