Driving in the winter in Illinois brings a whole new set of challenges. Snow, sleet, and ice can make driving hazardous, limiting visibility and control while driving. It is no wonder that there are so many **car accidents** during these cold months, causing not only damage to thousands of vehicles,



but also causing serious injuries and fatalities.

Weather Impacts On Driving Accidents

According to the Federal Highway Administration, 1.5 million motor vehicle accidents are attributed to weather each year. These crashes lead to over 7,000 deaths and an estimated 629,000 others are injured. These accidents are not necessarily caused by the weather, however, they happen when there are poor conditions that can impact safety. The FHWA estimates the following conditions cause the most crashes:

Wet pavement. The most dangerous weather-related road conditions involve wet pavement. Rain, melted snow, and ice all contribute to slick, wet roads. 75% of weather-related accidents happen on wet pavement. **Ice.** More than 13% of weather-related crashes are due to ice, which causes over 190,000 crashes and over 62,000 injuries.

Snow/Sleet/Slush. Sleet, slush, and snow are present in over 390,000 crashes each year, with over 118,000 injuries and almost 1500 deaths.

These conditions make it difficult to stop and control vehicles, even those equipped with 4-wheel or all-wheel drive. When coupled with the normal causes of accidents such as distraction, **speeding**, and reckless driving, these accidents can become even more deadly.

Driving Safely In Chicago's Winter Weather

Anyone who has spent a winter in Chicago or anywhere in Illinois knows that the roads can become slick and difficult to drive on through the winter months. Ice, snow and wet pavement cause stopping distances to increase and can attribute to sliding, fish-tailing and other losses of control. In addition, snow, sleet, and fog can make it difficult to see, increasing the odds of an accident. To stay safe and prevent accidents, OSHA suggests following the three "P's" of winter driving safety: prepare, protect and prevent.

Prepare for driving. Make sure your vehicle is prepared for winter driving. Use winter tires, have your vehicle maintained and allow extra driving time for trips in poor conditions.

Protect yourself. Always use your seat belt and bring water, blankets, and food for long trips and in case you get stuck in a storm.

Prevent crashes. Use extra precaution when driving in winter weather conditions. Slow down and pay attention to the road. Do not talk or text on your phone, don't drink alcohol before driving and increase the distance between your vehicle and the one you are following.
