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Page 3 1 HEARING OFFICER KLEIN: Good morning. 2 name is Martin Enrique Klein. I am the hearing 3 officer for this rulemaking. Welcome to the Illinois Pollution 4 5 Control Board. This rulemaking is entitled, Amendments to 35 Illinois Administrative Code, 6 7 Subtitle M, Biological Materials, for Docket Number R18-29. 8 9 Also with the board present here today are Carrie Zalewski, board member and lead board 10 member in this docket, and I believe I saw Anand 11 12 Rao, who is the chief scientist with the 13 technical unit. 14 MS. ZALEWSKI: And Danny Pauley just walked 15 in as well. 16 HEARING OFFICER KLEIN: And Daniel Pauley, 17 who is a staff attorney with the Board. 18 First, I will announce that at the 19 front of the hearing room here in Chicago and in 20 Springfield we have placed sign-up sheets for 2.1 providing spoken public comments. Anyone 22 wishing to provide a public comment may sign up 23 and be given an opportunity to speak. Anyone 24 wishing to provide testimony will be sworn in

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prior to being provided the opportunity.

2.1

Today's hearing is governed by the Board of Procedural Rules. All information that is relevant and that is not repetitious or privileged will be admitted to the record. Any questions posed today by the Board and staff are intended solely to help develop a clear and concise record.

A little background about this rulemaking before we begin. The Board's potentially infectious medical waste rule is addressed definitions, prohibitions, permitting, and the minimum standards for the treatment, packaging, storage, transportation, and disposal of potentially infectious medical waste.

The Board's proposed rules, amendments in this rulemaking are meant to remove legalese and redundant and superfluous language as well as reorganize some provisions for clarity. The amendments also make additions consistent with amendments to the act and change citations and statutory language to comply with the style requirements of the Illinois Administrative Code.

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The Board adopted proposed amendments for a public comment in this rulemaking on May 10, 2018, without submitting it to first notice publication. On the same day, the Board requested an economic impact study from the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity by letter. As of this date, the Board has not received a response from the DCEO.

The Board invited comments and scheduled two hearings on the proposal by video conference in Chicago and in Springfield. The hearings are to address the merits and economic impacts of the proposal.

The Board held its first hearing on September 11, 2018. Today, the Board is hosting its second hearing that, if necessary, will continue tomorrow.

Notice of the hearings were published on August 1, 2018, in The State Journal-Register of Springfield and the Chicago Sun-Times.

On July 30th, a hearing officer ordered directed participants who intended to testify at today's hearing to pre-file that testimony by October 3rd and that any questions of that

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Page 6 1 testimony be pre-filed by October 10th. 2 No pre-filed testimony or questions 3 were filed, nor has anyone notified the Board 4 prior to today of their intent to provide 5 testimony. 6 At this time, I will ask if anyone, 7 either in Springfield or Chicago, wishes to 8 provide public comments. 9 MS. ZALEWSKI: We have someone here who 10 signed in. 11 HEARING OFFICER KLEIN: Great. Do you wish 12 to provide comments or testimony? 13 MS. ZALEWSKI: Do you want to move so he can 14 see? 15 No, I can see. HEARING OFFICER KLEIN: MS. SIMAGA: I'm not used to this. 16 17 I apologize, I'm not sure what the difference would be. But we don't have -- I'm 18 19 with Stericycle. My name is Cara Simaga. 2.0 attended -- I had coworkers that attended the 2.1 first hearing. And we just want to be here in 22 support of the rules and let you guys know that 23 we are following and watching. And we actually 24 would look forward to additional changes in the

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1 future.

I know now is probably not the time because you just opened it up, right, you are looking at the definitions and reorganizing and un-italicizing, and things like that, thus making it easier to read, which is awesome.

Great first start.

But we would like to see and suggest in the future, you know, other things and different -- maybe a reorganization and, you know, some updates and that type of thing. And, again, I understand this is really not the place for that, but we just, again, wanted to be here and let you guys know that we support what you are doing so far and that, you know, we look forward to working with you guys and the Illinois EPA in the future for potentially more changes.

So I don't know if you have questions.

Again, I'm not sure if it's supposed to be testimony or comment, but, again, we just wanted to be here and, again, you know, support you guys.

MS. ZALEWSKI: We appreciate you coming out and saying that you are in support. I think

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Page 8 1 that's the most important, to hear that you have 2 read the rules --3 MS. SIMAGA: Absolutely. 4 MS. ZALEWSKI: -- and the changes and that we 5 didn't make any mistakes or that there's any other inadvertent errors. So that's what we're 6 7 excited to hear. So thank you for that. 8 MS. SIMAGA: Yeah, yeah. 9 So, and I think we have a lot of 10 experience -- I don't know if you are familiar with Stericycle. We are probably one of the --11 12 we probably are the largest provider of medical 13 waste disposal services in the country. So it's 14 what we do. 15 It's what we started doing. We do a 16 lot more. We do hazardous waste and other types 17 of waste management as well. We have an 18 incinerator in Clinton, Illinois, for medical 19 waste which the agency has permitted and that 20 type of thing. 2.1 But -- and everything is going great, 22 but, you know, just over the years, things have 23 changed and there has been new circumstances 24 with, you know, let's say, Ebola, for example,

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Page 9 1 with that -- management of that waste. 2 rules don't have a lot in there to, kind of, 3 help with that at this time, and so we would 4 have suggestions, perhaps, with that in 5 reorganizing a little bit. Maybe to make it 6 easier for the generators, the hospitals and 7 healthcare facilities to, kind of, better 8 understand and better be able to follow the 9 rules. We do this nationwide. I mean, I have 10 11 worked with a lot of states on this type of thing, and so we have a lot of ideas and just --12 13 we've been there and so we are glad to help. 14 And, you know, again, everything looks good so 15 far, but potentially we would suggest some more 16 movement in the future and would love to be a 17 part of that. 18 MS. ZALEWSKI: Thank you. 19 HEARING OFFICER KLEIN: Great. 20 All right. Is there anyone else who 2.1 has -- there is no one that's here in 22 Springfield that signed up for public comment. 23 Is there anyone else in Chicago? 24 All right. Hearing none, let's take a
