CHAIR'S UPDATE

I write to highlight Board rulemaking activities from the fourth quarter of 2019. But first, as mentioned in my last update, 2020 will mark the 50th year of the Board and the statute that created it, the Environmental Protection Act. Both turn 50 on July 1, 2020. To commemorate this half-century milestone, the Board is planning a speakers' series for the spring and summer, culminating with the publication of a 50th anniversary report. When it is set, the schedule for the speakers' series will be posted on the Board's website (pcb.illinois.gov), as will the 50th anniversary report. Just look for this special logo:



During the fourth quarter of 2019, the Board proposed four sets of rule amendments for public comment. Summaries of each appear in the Rulemaking Update of this *Environmental Register*. First, on November 7, 2019, the Board proposed substantive amendments to its manifesting rules for transporting non-hazardous, special waste. <u>Amendments to Manifesting Requirements:</u> <u>Special Waste Hauling 35 Ill. Adm. Code 809</u>, docket R19-18 (Nov. 7, 2019). Second, on December 19, 2019, the Board proposed non-substantive amendments to its atomic radiation rules. <u>Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Subtitle I: Atomic Radiation</u>, docket R18-28 (Dec. 19, 2019). Third, on December 19, 2019, the Board proposed substantive amendments to its definition of "Class 4 etiologic agent" in the rules concerning potentially infectious medical waste. <u>Amendments to Definition of "Class 4 etiologic agent", 35 Ill. Adm. Code 1420.102</u>, docket R20-17 (Dec. 19, 2019). And, fourth, on December 19, 2019, the Board proposed "identical-in-substance" amendments to its primary drinking water rules. <u>SDWA Update</u>, <u>USEPA Amendments (July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018)</u>, docket R19-16 (Dec. 19, 2019).

Lastly, on December 17, 2019, the Board received a rulemaking proposal from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency: <u>Proposed New 35 Ill. Adm. Code 250 Ethylene Oxide</u> <u>Ambient Air Monitoring</u>, docket R20-18. The proposal was required by Public Act 101-22, which, effective June 21, 2019, amended the Environmental Protection Act. Stay tuned to the Board's meeting agendas—posted on the website—for upcoming action on this proposal.

RULEMAKING UPDATE

Board Proposes First-Notice Amendments to Rules for Non-Hazardous, Special Waste Manifests

On November 7, 2019, the Board proposed rule amendments for first-notice publication in the *Illinois Register. See* 43 Ill. Reg. 13361 (Nov. 22, 2019). The proposal would amend the Board's manifesting requirements for non-hazardous, special waste transportation (35 Ill. Adm. Code 809). The rulemaking was initiated by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA).

For transporting exclusively State-regulated, non-hazardous special waste in Illinois, current Board rules require using the comprehensive and widely-accepted Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). Complying with that requirement, however, is no longer economical or efficient. Under recent federal rule changes, USEPA now requires compliance with its new e-Manifest System whenever a Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest is used, even if it is used for transporting non-hazardous waste. The Board's rulemaking record established that compliance with the e-Manifest System imposes significant additional costs and administrative burdens. The Board found that these costs and burdens—for non-hazardous, special waste transportation—come with no added environmental benefit.

To alleviate the unintended and unnecessary economic and administrative burdens on transporting non-hazardous special waste in Illinois, the Board's proposed amendments would require a State manifest instead of USEPA's Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest. However, the State manifest, to be prescribed by IEPA, will be functionally identical to the Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest and therefore not diminish IEPA oversight of non-hazardous, special waste transportation.

The Board received public comments and held two hearings in this rulemaking. No additional hearings are currently scheduled. The rulemaking is captioned <u>Amendments to Manifesting</u> <u>Requirements: Special Waste Hauling 35 III. Adm. Code 809</u>, docket R19-18. Board Proposes Atomic Radiation Amendments for Public Comment

On December 19, 2019, the Board proposed non-substantive amendments to streamline and update its atomic radiation rules (35 Ill. Adm. Code 1000, 1010). The Board's atomic radiation rules protect against radiological air pollutants and prescribe standards for detecting and reporting unpermitted releases of radionuclides. The proposed amendments are part of the Board's broader review—started in 2016—to ensure that Board rules are current, clear, and concise.



The Board invited public comment on the proposed amendments without submitting them to first-notice publication in the *Illinois Register*. The Board also indicated that it would hold two public hearings on the proposal. The rulemaking is captioned <u>Amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code Subtitle I: Atomic Radiation</u>, docket R18-28. For Public Comment, Board Proposes Amendments to "Class 4 Etiologic Agent" Definition

On December 19, 2019, the Board proposed amendments to update the definition of "Class 4 etiologic agent" in its regulations on potentially infectious medical waste or "PIMW." Under the Environmental Protection Act, the Board must adopt rules that are "identical in substance" to the listing of etiologic agents identified as Class 4 in the Centers for Disease Control's "Classification of Etiological Agents on the Basis of Hazard, 1974," as amended. Four Class 4 etiologic agents were recently added to that listing: Guanarito virus; Sabia; Ebola Virus; and Equine Morbillivirus. The Board therefore proposed adding those four agents to the viral agent list within its definition of "Class 4 etiologic agent."

The Board invited public comment on the proposal and directed the Clerk to cause publication of the proposed amendments in the *Illinois Register*. The Board also indicated that it would hold two public hearings on the proposal. The rulemaking is captioned <u>Amendments to Definition of</u> "Class 4 etiologic agent", 35 Ill. Adm. Board Proposes "Identical-in-Substance" Amendments to Drinking Water Rules

On December 19, 2019, the Board proposed—for public comment—amendments to Illinois' primary drinking water regulations at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 611. The proposed amendments are "identical in substance" to rule amendments adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) during the second half of 2018. Specifically, on October 12, 2018, USEPA approved new alternative test procedures (ATPs) for demonstrating compliance with the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations. USEPA corrected the ATPs on October 31, 2018.

In addition to the revisions prompted by USEPA's new ATPs, the Board found more amendments necessary. For example, to aid in understanding the rules and facilitate future amendments, the Board renamed analytical methods and simplified their incorporations by reference. The Board also corrected rules that were revised most recently in <u>Public Water</u> Supplies: Proposed New 35 III. Adm. Code 604 and Amendments to 35 III. Adm. Code 601, 602, 607, and 611, R18-17 (July 25, 2019). Finally, the Board found that unavoidable delay required extending the deadline for completing the amendments—from October 31, 2019 to March 31, 2020.

Restricted Status/Critical Review

The Environmental Protection Act prohibits the Agency from issuing a construction permit that will cause or extend a violation. A construction permit to expand the distribution system cannot be granted when a water supply has a maximum contaminant level or treatment technique violation, an inadequate source of raw water supply, inadequate treatment plant capacity, finished water storage or distribution system pressure. A Restricted Status List is published quarterly in the Illinois Pollution Control Board Environmental Register to notify those persons considering expansion of a water supply distribution system of that status before large sums of money have been spent on items such as land acquisition, financing and engineering fees. A companion Critical Review List is published concurrently with the Restricted Status List and has the water supplies that are approaching a point where the supply could be placed on Restricted Status. A permit application from a supply on Critical Review will be examined carefully to ensure that the proposed construction will not cause a violation. Restricted Status and Critical Review are presented as a combined list with the status of the water supply denoted as either RS (Restricted Status) or CR (Critical Review). The current list reflects the status as of January 2, 2018. An asterisk, *, beside the water supply indicates public water supplies that have been added to the Restricted Status/Critical Review list since the previous publication.

Restricted Status List

The Restricted Status List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which are in violation of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

The Restricted Status List will include all Public Water Supplies for which the Agency has information indicating a violation of any of the following requirements: Finished water quality requirements of 35 III. Adm. Code, Part 604, Subparts B and C; maintenance of adequate pressure on all parts of the distribution system under all conditions of demand; meeting raw water quantity requirements of 35 III. Adm. Code 604.502; or maintenance of treatment facilities capable of providing water "assuredly adequate in quantity" as required by Section 18 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

A public water supply on the Restricted Status List will not be issued permits for water main extensions, except for certain limited situations, or unless the supply has been granted a variance from the Illinois Pollution Control Board for the violation, or from permit issuance requirements of Section 39 of the Act.

This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.

Critical Review List

The Critical Review List was developed to give additional notification to officials of public water supplies which may be close to being in violation of 35 III. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies, Chapter I or the Illinois Environmental Protection Act. A supply will be placed on the Critical Review List when Agency records indicate that it is approaching any of the violations that would place it on the Restricted Status List. This list is continually being revised as new information becomes available, and therefore, specific inquiries as to the status of any public water supply should be directed to the Division of Public Water Supplies for final determination.
