Ameren's old coal-fired power plants have been grandfathered in long enough. These plants' capital costs were paid off long ago, and the time is long past to keep issuing variances to evade State rules for mercury, SO₂, and NO_x emissions. The health impacts of these pollutants don't go away just because a permit is issued to a polluting facility. I drove down to attend the public hearing in Springfield yesterday, but was unable to speak because of the press of people seeking to address the Board on this issue. In fact, I could not find a seat in the hearing room and even had difficulty getting into the room because of huge number of people that Dynege and Ameren had bussed in to crowd the hearing room. Their action speaks loudly of their financial interests in the acquisition of permission to defy the Board's clear multi-pollution standard. Why you would even hear their request puzzles me, but I suspect that political pressure has been exerted, as indicated by the number of politicians you heard yesterday. Those who supported the corporate request seemed only concerned with the great financial loss that would follow shuttering of these ancient coal fired plants, while the health impact that underlies your 2006 Multi-pollutant Standard were ignored or deprecated as inconsequential. Actually, I do not favor shutting the plants down, I want their emissions cleaned up. If someone wants to purchase the plants on condition they can continue to pollute, I would say no, forget about it, but you have the legal authority and I do not.


However, I can urge you to deny this variance as a private citizen living far from the subject plants, for the reasons outlined below.

As a chemist I understand the many adverse effects of operating these facilities without cleaning their emissions. But as a husband and a father, I see the personal complications up close. Both my wife and one of my sons are asthmatics; and they have been are badly affected by emissions from these facilities, particularly sulfur oxides. So, granting permission to pollute in areas that have known serious pollution levels such as Dynege's Wood River Plant and Ameren's Edwards plant appears irresponsible to me.

The economic 'hardship' claimed by Dynege is clearly self-imposed and artificial. However, it is clear to me that addressing the actual economic hardship of the populace near these plants is best done by cleaning up these polluting plants. That requirement will create REAL jobs. The variance requested by these corporations seeks to maximize their corporate profits by continuing to dump chemicals into the commons. Those who pay for that practice are the workers and others who live in the commons.

In the end, I see no reasonable action but denial of this request.
