JURISDICTION

This Administrative Citation is issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by Section 31.1 of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010).

FACTS

- 1. That Gale Hinze, individually, and d/b/a Ag Fab, LLC is the current owner and operator ("Respondent") of a facility located at the southwest corner of 100 E. Road and 850 Avenue North in Neponset Township, Bureau County, Illinois. The property is commonly known to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency as Neponset Township/Ag Fab LLC.
 - 2. That said facility is designated with Site Code No. 0118170001.
 - 3. That Respondent has owned and operated said facility at all times pertinent hereto.
- 4. That on April 26, 2013, Donna Shehane of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's ("Illinois EPA") Rockford Regional Office inspected the above-described facility. A copy of her inspection report setting forth the results of said inspection is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. That on 6-12-13, Illinois EPA sent this Administrative Citation via Certified Mail No. 7012 0470 0001 2998 5782

<u>VIOLATIONS</u>

Based upon direct observations made by Donna Shehane during the course of her April 26, 2013 inspection of the above-named facility, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has determined that Respondent has violated the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (hereinafter, the "Act") as follows:

- (1) That Respondent caused or allowed water to accumulate in used or waste tires, a violation of Section 55(k)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(1) (2010).
- (2) That Respondent caused or allowed the transportation of used or waste tires in violation of the registration and vehicle placarding requirements adopted by

 Board, a violation of Section 55(k)(4) of the Act, 415 ILCS 55(k)(4) (2010).

CIVIL PENALTY

Pursuant to Section 42(b)(4-5) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/42(b)(4-5) (2010), Respondent is subject to a civil penalty of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each of the violations identified above, for a total of <u>Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)</u>. If Respondent elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board, the statutory civil penalty specified above shall be due and payable no later than <u>July 5, 2013</u>, unless otherwise provided by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board.

If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation by petitioning the Illinois Pollution Control Board in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1 (2010), and if the Illinois Pollution Control Board issues a finding of violation as alleged herein, after an adjudicatory hearing,

Respondent shall be assessed the associated hearing costs incurred by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Those hearing costs shall be assessed in addition to the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500.00) statutory civil penalty for each violation.

Pursuant to Section 31.1(d)(1) of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31.1(d)(1) (2010), if Respondent fails to petition or elects not to petition the Illinois Pollution Control Board for review of this Administrative Citation within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service, the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall adopt a final order, which shall include this Administrative Citation and findings of violation as alleged herein, and shall impose the statutory civil penalty specified above.

When payment is made, Respondent's check shall be made payable to the Illinois Environmental Protection Trust Fund and mailed to the attention of Fiscal Services, Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Along with payment, Respondent shall complete and return the enclosed Remittance Form to ensure proper documentation of payment.

If any civil penalty and/or hearing costs are not paid within the time prescribed by order of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, interest on said penalty and/or hearing costs shall be assessed against the Respondent from the date payment is due up to and including the date that payment is received. The Office of the Illinois Attorney General may be requested to initiate proceedings against Respondent in Circuit Court to collect said penalty and/or hearing costs, plus any interest accrued.

PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING THIS ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION

Respondent has the right to contest this Administrative Citation pursuant to and in accordance with Section 31.1 of the Act, 415 ILCS 5/31/1 (2010). If Respondent elects to contest this Administrative Citation, then Respondent shall file a signed Petition for Review, including a Notice of Filing, Certificate of Service, and Notice of Appearance, with the Clerk of the Illinois Pollution Control Board, State of Illinois Center, 100 West Randolph, Suite 11-500, Chicago, Illinois 60601. A copy of said Petition for Review shall be filed with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Division of Legal Counsel at 1021 North Grand Avenue East, P.O. Box 19276, Springfield, Illinois 62794-9276. Section 31.1 of the Act provides that any Petition for Review shall be filed within thirty-five (35) days of the date of service of this Administrative Citation or the Illinois Pollution Control Board shall enter a default judgment against the Respondent.

NARRATIVE INSPECTION REPORT DOCUMENT

On April 26, 2013 I (Donna Shehane) conducted a follow-up inspection at a property located at the southwest corner of 100 E Road and 850 Avenue N in Neponset Township. The weather at the time of this inspection was 66 °F with southwest winds @ 10 mph and clear skies. The purpose of this inspection was to verify compliance with the [Illinois] Environmental Protection Act and 35 Illinois Administrative Code regulations Part 848: Used Tire Regulations. A Used Tire Administrative Citation Warning Notice for a prior inspection on April 4, 2013 had set a deadline for removal of all tires by April 22, 2013.

I arrived on site at approximately 12:30 pm and observed the used or waste tires still on the property (See photos # 1 and # 2). There was no one present on site. I walked around the piles and noted water accumulation in many of the tires (See photos # 5, # 6, # 7, and # 8). The piles were photographed toward the west in photo # 9. I estimated approximately 4,000 used or waste tires on site during this inspection.

I spoke to Mr. Gale Hinze of Ag Fab, LLC who stated that he was working with Liberty Tire Recycling to have the used or waste tires removed as soon as possible. However, as of May 7, 2013 the used or waste tires have not been removed per telephone conversation with "Randy" of Liberty Tire, Savage, and MN. The off-rim used or waste tires have been on the property a minimum of 33 days.


Prior to removal of the used or waste tires, I had spoken with Mr. Gale Hinze regarding the requirement to register as a tire transporter and display a valid Agency-issued placard when hauling 20 or more used or waste tires. The proper forms were sent to his office. However, they were not submitted and witnesses confirm the used or waste tires were loaded onto Ag Fab LLC vehicles without valid placards.

The Ag Fab LLC site was found to be out of compliance at the time of this inspection. Apparent violations noted:

- 1. Section 55(k)(1) of the [Illinois] Environmental Protection Act ("Act").
- 2. Section 55(k)(4) of the Act.
