

A complete description of the subjects and issues involved: The amendments to Part 310 are a single segment of a larger rulemaking that also affects 35 Ill. Adm. Code 307, which is covered by a separate notice in this issue of the *Illinois Register*. To save space, a more detailed description of the subjects and issues involved in the larger rulemaking is in this *Illinois Register* only in the answer to question 5 in the Notice of Proposed Amendments for 35 Ill. Adm. Code 307. A comprehensive description is contained in the Board's opinion and order of April 15, 2004, proposing amendments in docket R04-18 for public comment, which opinion and order is available from the address below. As is explained in that opinion, the Board will receive public comment on the proposed amendments for 45 days from the date they appear in the *Illinois Register* before proceeding to adopt amendments based on this proposal.

Specifically, the segment of the amendments involved in Part 310 implements the federal July 21, 2003 new methods for microbiological analysis of water and wastewater and the September 19, 2003 corrections to the July 21, 2003 new methods. Further, the Board uses this opportunity to update the incorporation of two federal statutes by reference to include the latest versions of those statutes. Those two statutes are the Clean Water Act and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

Tables appear in the Board's opinion and order of April 15, 2004 in docket R04-18 that list numerous corrections and amendments that are not based on current federal amendments. The tables contain deviations from the literal text of the federal amendments underlying these amendments, as well as corrections and clarifications that the Board made in the base text involved. 




