ORDER OF THE BOARD:

On February 15, 1996, ESG Watts, Inc. filed a petition for review of permit regarding its facility located in Rock Island County, Illinois. This matter is accepted for hearing.


The hearing must be scheduled and completed in a timely manner. The Board will assign a hearing officer to conduct hearings consistent with this order, and the Clerk of the Board shall promptly issue appropriate directions to that assigned hearing officer.

The assigned hearing officer shall inform the Clerk of the Board of the time and location of the hearing at least 40 days in advance of hearing so that public notice of hearing may be published. After hearing, the hearing officer shall submit an exhibit list, a statement regarding credibility of witnesses and all actual exhibits to the Board within five days of the hearing. Any briefing schedule shall provide for final filings as expeditiously as possible and, in time-limited cases, no later than 30 days prior to the decision due date, which is the final regularly scheduled Board meeting date on or before the statutory or deferred decision deadline. Absent any future waivers of the decision deadline, the statutory decision deadline is now June 14, 1996 (120 days from February 15, 1996); the Board meeting immediately preceding the due date is scheduled for June 6, 1996.

If after appropriate consultation with the parties, the parties fail to provide an acceptable hearing date or if, after an attempt the hearing officer is unable to consult with the parties, the hearing officer shall unilaterally set a hearing date in conformance with the schedule above. The hearing officer and the parties are encouraged to expedite this proceeding as much as possible. The Board notes that Board rules (35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.102) require the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) to file the entire Agency record of the permit application within 14 days of notice of the petition.
