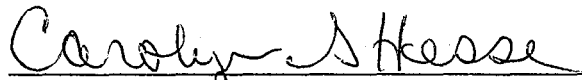

**PETITION FOR REVIEW OF ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL
PROTECTION AGENCY DECISIONS**

Robert and Tony Thompson, by their attorney, Carolyn S. Hesse of Barnes & Thornburg, pursuant to the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/1 *et. seq.* (the "Act") and 35 Illinois Administrative Code Section 105.400 *et. seq.*, hereby appeals certain decisions by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (the "Agency").

1. Robert and Tony Thompson ("Thompson") are the owners of property located at 4th and Jefferson, Cairo, Alexander County, Illinois. The site had underground storage tanks (USTs) on the property, which stored gasoline.
2. LUST Incident Number 20020882 was obtained following a site investigation and LPC #0030055050 was assigned.
3. On September 18, 2003, the Agency received Thompson's complete request for reimbursement of costs from the Illinois Underground Storage Tank Fund (the "Request") for the period from June 1, 2002 to November 30, 2002 in the amount of \$30,711.89.

4. The Agency denied certain costs in the Request in a letter dated October 17, 2003, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
5. Thompson is appealing this October 17, 2003 denial because the Agency denied certain costs by claiming that the owner/operator failed to demonstrate that the costs were reasonable.
6. Thompson disagrees with the Agency's decision and believes that the costs submitted for reimbursement are reasonable corrective action costs and are the types of costs that are eligible for reimbursement under the Act and implementing regulations.
7. The Agency's letter denying reimbursement, Exhibit A, provides no further explanation of the Agency's reasons or bases for denial that could aid Petitioner in setting forth its grounds of appeal. Nevertheless, the Agency's denial is a final decision that Petitioner must appeal to the Board in order to preserve and enforce Petitioner's right to reimbursement under the UST Fund.
8. On December 1, 2003, the parties timely filed a joint notice to extend the appeal deadline. On December 4, 2003, the Board filed an order extending the appeal deadline until February 20, 2003, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B. Pursuant to the Board's December 4, 2003 order, this appeal is timely filed.

WHEREFORE, Robert and Tony Thompson respectfully requests that the Board enter an order that will provide that they be reimbursed from the UST Fund for their submitted costs and for their attorneys' fees and costs in bringing this appeal.

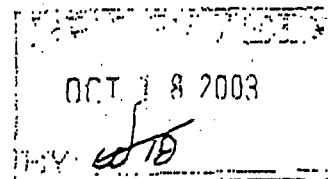

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has completed the review of your application for payment from the Underground Storage Tank Fund for the above-referenced LUST incident pursuant to Section 57.8(a) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act), and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 732, Subpart F. This information is dated April 17, 2003 and was received by the Agency on September 18, 2003. The application for payment covers the period from June 1, 2002 to November 30, 2002. The amount requested is \$30,711.89.

The deductible amount to be assessed on this claim is \$10,000.00, which is being deducted from this payment. In addition to the deductible, there are costs from this claim that are not being paid. Listed in Attachment A are the costs that are not being paid and the reasons these costs are not being paid.

On September 18, 2003, the Agency received your complete application for payment for this claim. As a result of the Agency's review of this application for payment, a voucher for \$19,426.64 will be prepared for submission to the Comptroller's Office for payment as funds become available based upon the date the Agency received your complete request for payment of this application for payment. 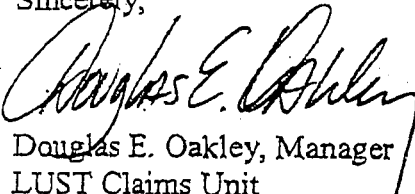

Dear John:

On October 17, 2003, the Agency issued a letter with respect to the above referenced LUST Incident regarding the payment, in part, of costs for which reimbursement was requested.

The letter was received on October 18, 2003. The amount requested for reimbursement was \$30,711.89.

The letters were received by CW3M on behalf of Mr. Robert Thompson. Mr. Thompson's facility is located in Alexander County, Illinois. A copy of the letter is attached. CW3M believes that, based upon discussions with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and for other reasons, that we will be able to resolve the issues raised in the IEPA letters. However, we believe that we will not be able to resolve these issues by the deadline for filing an appeal of these issues to the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Thus, this is a request for a 90 day extension pursuant to the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, Section 40(a)(1) and 35 IAC 105.406 to allow us the needed time to continue these discussions and to try to resolve the issues.

On November 18, 2003, we discussed this request for a time extension and agreed to such a time extension. If for any reason the Agency will not seek the 90 day extension, please notify

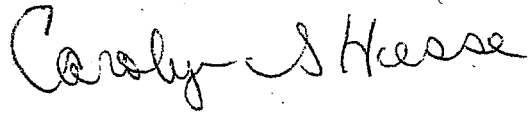

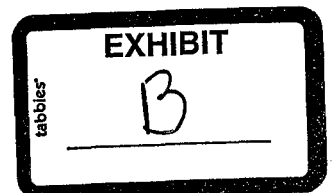

**REQUEST FOR NINETY DAY EXTENSION
OF APPEAL PERIOD**

NOW COMES the Respondent, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (“Illinois EPA”), by one of its attorneys, John J. Kim, Assistant Counsel and Special Assistant Attorney General, and, pursuant to Section 40(a)(1) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/40(a)(1)) and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 105.208, hereby requests that the Illinois Pollution Control Board (“Board”) grant an extension of the thirty-five (35) day period for petitioning for a hearing to February 20, 2004, or any other date not more than a total of one hundred twenty-five (125) days from the date of service of the Illinois EPA’s final decision. In support thereof, the Illinois EPA respectfully states as follows:

1. On October 17, 2003, the Illinois EPA issued a final decision to the Petitioners.
(Exhibit A)
2. On November 19, 2003, the Petitioners made a written request to the Illinois EPA for an extension of time by which to file a petition for review, asking the Illinois EPA join in requesting that the Board extend the thirty-five day period for filing a petition to ninety days. The Petitioners represented that the final decision was received on October 18, 2003. (Exhibit B)

3. The additional time requested by the parties may eliminate the need for a hearing in this matter or, in the alternative, allow the parties to identify issues and limit the scope of any hearing that may be necessary to resolve this matter.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated above, the parties request that the Board, in the interest of administrative and judicial economy, grant this request for a ninety-day extension of the thirty-five day period for petitioning for a hearing.

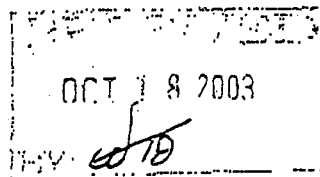

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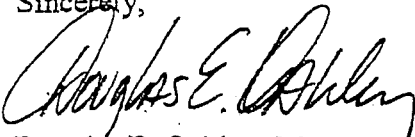

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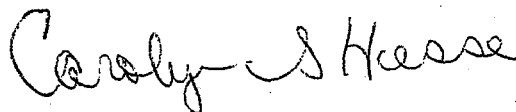
