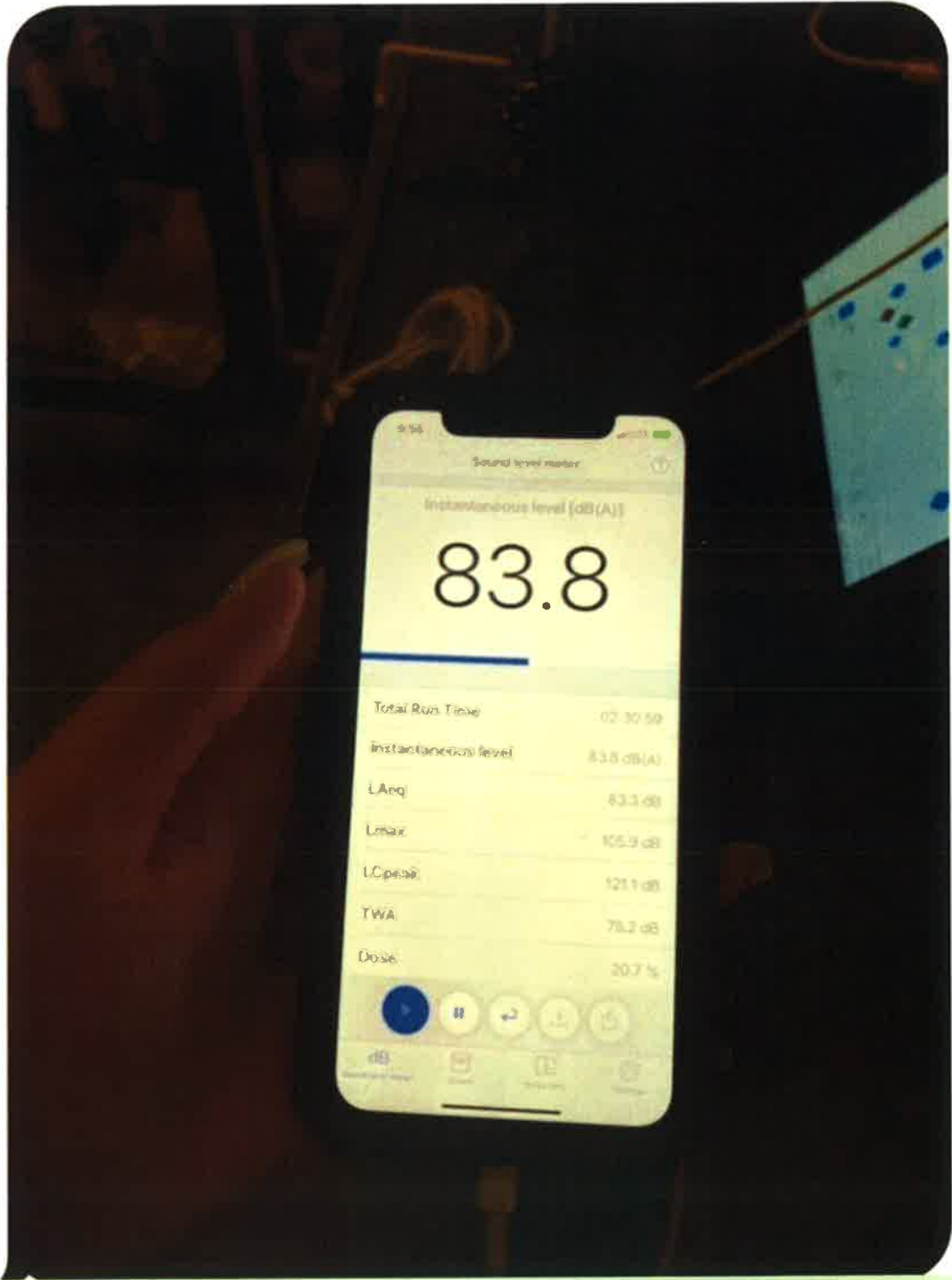

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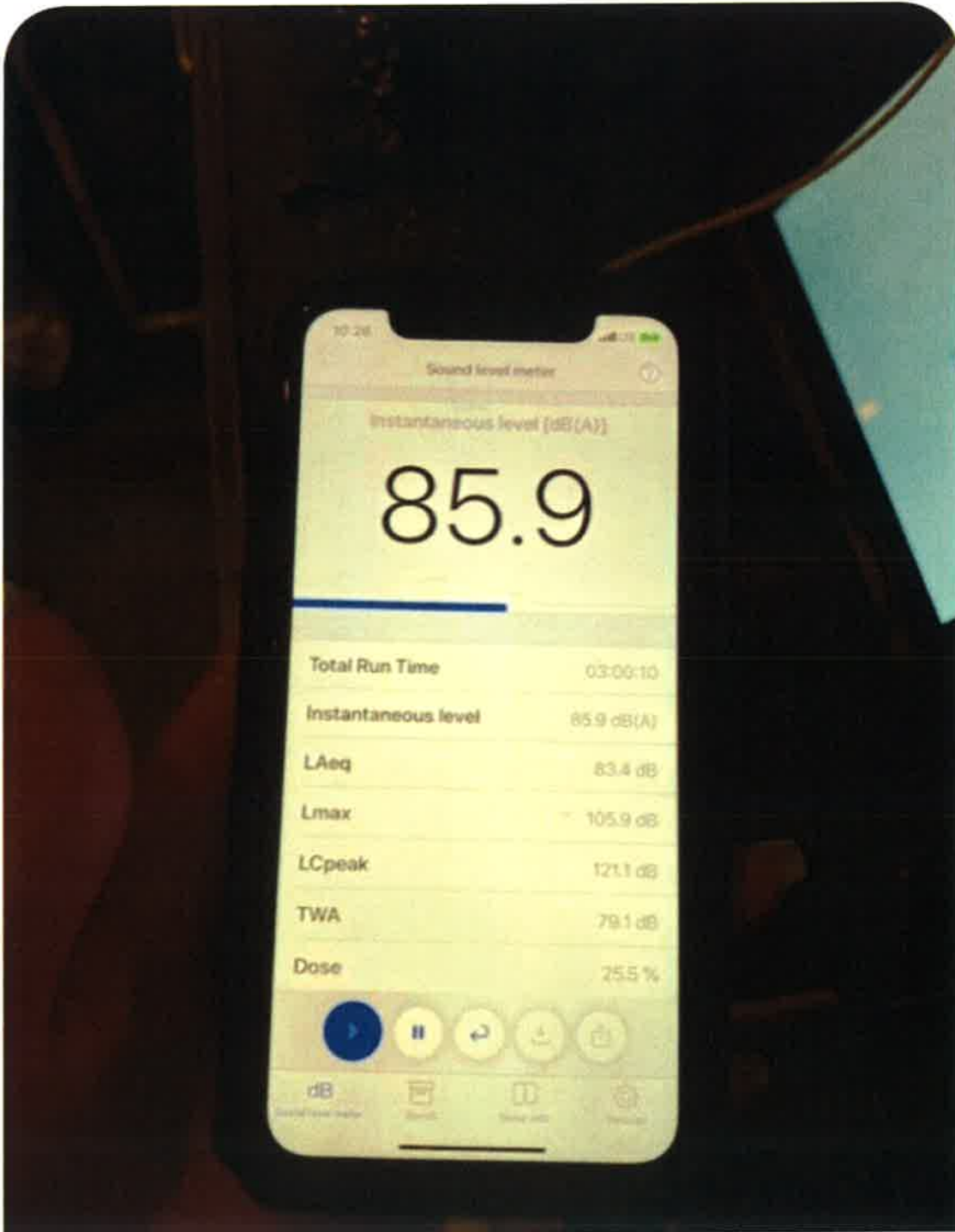

I've been trying to come up with ideas to reduce the noise in your home. Adding drywall or mass loaded vinyl to the inside of your wall would be a good sound blocker but would cover the brick and not look good. But I found a clear mass loaded vinyl product that could be applied to the brick while still seeing the brick. Not sure if this would look ok and it's rather expensive but would reduce the sound level.

I know Copperfire should be taking some action but this might be a way for you to reduce the annoyance. Let me know if you want to discuss

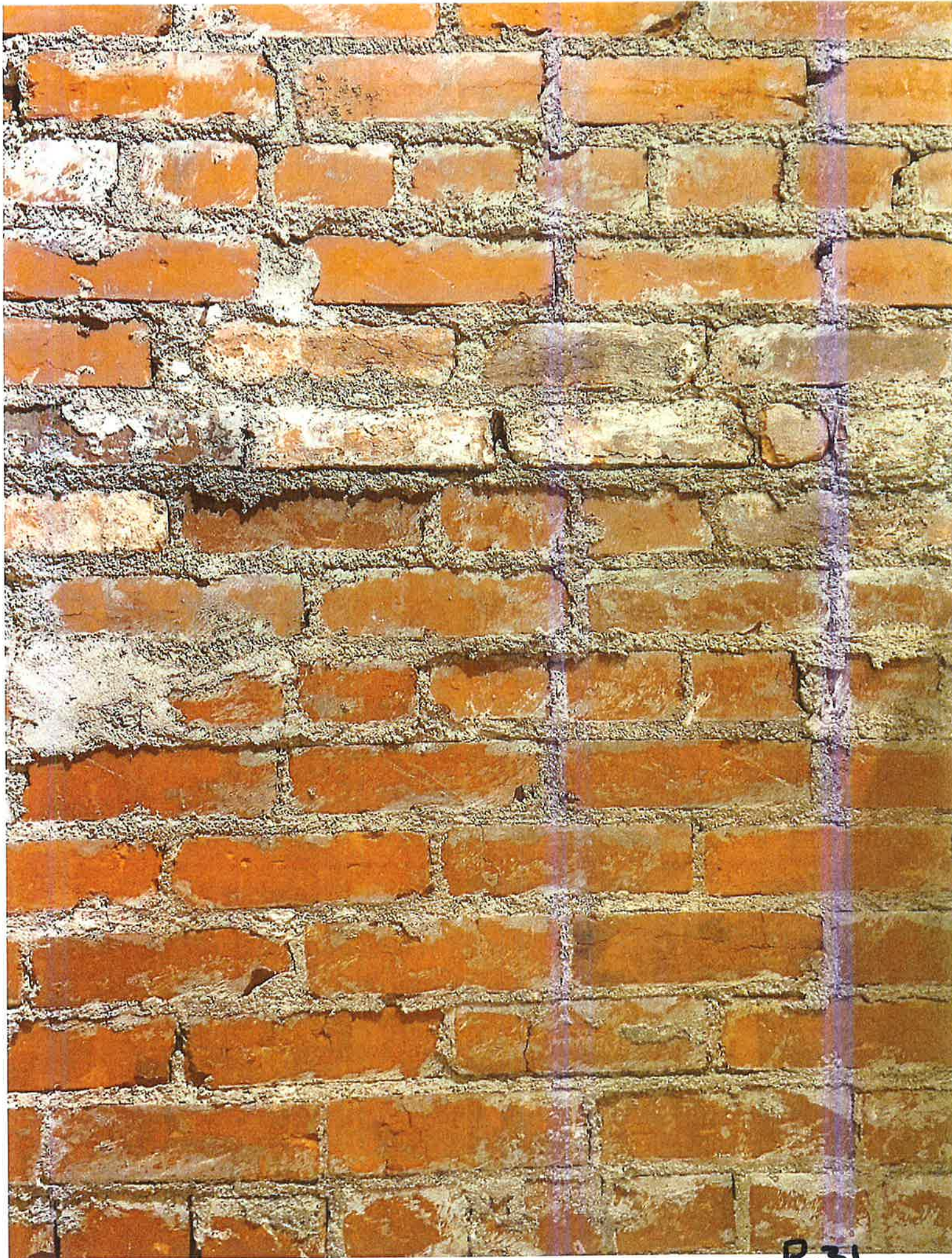

Here is one example for clear mlv. There are other sellers. It is heavy and expensive. You might be able to buy for less thru Kaskaskia. You can see that the Transmission loss is rated mid 20s.
I was surprised that I measured about the same levels on the corner of bedroom dresser as on dining room table. It's because I think your bedroom wall is at about back of bar where it is still loud since they have little sound absorption in there.
Might be worth putting some sheets up on bedroom brick wall and see if it helps
