MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING
April 13, 1972 Chicago, Illinois

Mr. Aldrich was not present.

At 3:00 p.m. the Board reconvened to continue the meeting held over from April 11, 1972.

Mr. Currie called the meeting to order and asked for a vote in the matter of #R71-23, Emission Standards. The Emission Standards and accompanying opinion, both amended by the addition of a proviso incorporating the temporary restraining order entered in Roth-Adam v. Pollution Control Board, were adopted by a vote of 4-0.

Mr. Kissel and Mr. Lawton said that the Judge in the Cook County Circuit Court, in a direct statement to them, said that the Board could adopt the proposed Emission Standards, #R71-23, with the exception of the regulation concerning coal bans for Chicago Major Metropolitan Area.

The Board directed the Clerk to file the Emission Standards with the Secretary of State's office on an emergency basis asking that they become effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State. The reason for the emergency basis being that the State of Illinois had exceeded the time limit for adopting air standards as ordered by the Federal Government under the Clean Air Act.

The meeting was adjourned.
