

ILLINOIS POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD

MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING

June 27, 1972 - Suite 300, 309 West Washington Street, Chicago, Ill.

All Board Members were present.

The Board adopted the following opinions and orders by a vote of 5-0: The Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad, PCB 71-254, was ordered to cease and desist from emissions in excess of those permitted by the Rules and Regulations Governing the Control of Air Pollution and a \$350 penalty was imposed. Russell, Burdsall & Ward Bolt and Nut Company, PCB 71-369, was ordered to pay a \$40,000 penalty and \$13,449.96 for a fish kill caused by the discharge of cyanide, and agreed to avoid further violations of the Act. Godfrey Township Utility Board, PCB 72-68, was granted a variance allowing waste sources under construction as of June 27, 1972 on lots covered by existing sewer connection contracts to be connected to existing sewers tributary to Godfrey Township lagoons. Mr. Kissel concurs except that he would allow connections for those with connection contracts who have entered contracts for construction. Robert W. Graham, PCB 72-154, was granted a variance to discharge sewage into the Godfrey system. And a hearing will be held in Lewis & Clark Community College, PCB 72-246, concerning their petition to connect to the Godfrey system. Action in Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago, PCB 72-111 and 72-135, was set for June 29, 1972 (a special meeting the Board agreed to hold before their vacation). City of Rockford, PCB 72-115, was dismissed as moot. The Motion to Dismiss in Sanitary District of Elgin, PCB 72-211, was denied; Mr. Lawton agreed to prepare the opinion and order to that effect and request that the Agency present recommendations on the merits of the case. The Board adopted an opinion by Mr. Lawton in Downers Grove National Bank, PCB 72-195, explaining the order adopted on June 20, 1972. Mr. Dumelle will prepare an opinion and order in City of Olney, PCB 72-205, also set for decision on June 29.

The parties in Fansteel, Inc. & City of North Chicago, PCB 72-76, appeared before the Board for oral argument. The Board decided to wait for additional information as to the effect of the proposed agreement on effluent from the North Shore Sanitary District.

In those cases for discussion the following action was taken: Dr. Aldrich agreed to write an opinion and order in City of Chicago Heights, PCB 71-240, for decision at the next regular Board meeting (July 18, 1972), ordering the City to cease and desist open dumping and to pay a fine of \$2,500 for past violations, which the City agreed to in a stipulation submitted to the Board. Mr. Dumelle will draft an opinion and order in Housing Authority of Wabash County, PCB 72-74, set for action on June 29, 1972. Action will be taken on June 29, 1972, in Beloit Foundry, PCB 72-182, granting the company a variance until August 11, 1972; Mr. Kissel will prepare the order. In City of Carbondale, PCB 72-203, one of the copper sulfate cases, the Agency recommended that the variance be granted, but a hearing has been scheduled and action will be taken after the hearing. No action was taken in Griggsville Community School Unit #4, PCB 72-166, pending EPA recommendation. The Order in the matter of Codification of Regulations, R 72-10, was adopted by a vote of 5-0.

Mr. Kissel agreed to write a letter to the City of Lake Forest regarding coliform standards.

No Action was taken on the Motion to Modify in E.N. Maisel, PCB 71-285, and in City of Jacksonville, PCB 71-355, pending EPA recommendation. The Board voted 5-0 to request that the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago, PCB 72-110, submit additional information to substantiate their variance request, and to wait for EPA recommendation; Mr. Currie will prepare the order. The Motion to Strike in Frietsch, Swords, and Beuhler, PCB 72-124, the Answer to Complainant's Objections in Processing and Books, Inc., PCB 72-148, and the Motion to Dismiss in Procter & Gamble Manufacturing Company, Inc., PCB 72-210, will be taken with the cases. Pepper Valley Development, PCB 72-220, was dismissed by a vote of 5-0. A formal citizen complaint in Mrs. Paul C. Harper v. Peter Baker & Sons Company, PCB 72-231, was, at the complainant's request changed to an informal one and referred to the EPA, by a vote of 5-0.

Hearings were authorized in the following new cases: Joseph T. Enders v. Village of Glendale Heights, PCB 72-252; Olin Corporation, PCB 72-253; Grant Park High School District #6, PCB 72-261; and City of Beardstown, PCB 72-264, to be consolidated with Beardstown Sanitary District PCB 72-232. Hearings are mandatory in the following new enforcement cases: Ivy Hearnnes & Arthur Singleton, PCB 72-254; White Bros. Equipment Company, PCB 72-258; National By-Products, PCB 72-259; and Robert Deters et al, PCB 72-260.

Laclede Steel Company, PCB 72-249, 72-250, and 72-251, was consolidated with the Laclede Steel enforcement case, PCB 72-221, and a hearing was authorized. Reliance Quarry, Inc., PCB 72-262, was consolidated with the pending case, PCB 72-62, and a hearing authorized.

H. Arthur Juhrend et al, PCB 72-255, was dismissed as moot by a vote of 5-0. And in Patricia Hinse, d/b/a Aladdin Flower Shop, PCB 72-263, the Board voted 5-0 requesting that the parties submit additional information; Mr. Kissel will prepare the order.

The Board authorized the publication of a proposal to repeal regulations regarding transcript costs for enforcement cases by a vote of 5-0.

Mr. Lawton noted that hearings on additional Noise Regulations proposed by the Institute and Agency are mandatory.

At Mr. Dumelle's request the Board voted 5-0 to keep the record in #R72- , Air Quality Standards, open until August 1.
