Decision in #72-386, Evanston, motion to adopt H.O. orders was put over to October 31, 1972.

In #72-321, International Harvester, the Board adopted an interim order by a vote of 5-0 authorizing another hearing. Petitioner agreed to file a waiver.

Petitioner's request to withdraw variance petition in #72-356, Hawley, was granted by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Currie said he would prepare the order.

Mr. Dumelle was not present for the afternoon session.

The Board voted 4-0 to allow sewer hook-up in #72-368, 377, Cinnamon Creek, on condition the proposed holding tank is acceptable to EPA. Mr. Currie will prepare the order and an opinion for adoption Oct. 31.

#72-320, Central Soya, was authorized for hearing 4-0 if petitioner filed a waiver. Mr. Currie said he would prepare the order.

A motion to stay issuance of an order in #72-356, White Bros., was withdrawn.

In #71-44, USI, a further hearing was authorized, Mr. Lawton to supply an order.

Discussion of R72-11, Proposed Open Burning Amendments was held. The Board voted 4-0 to publish a proposed final draft in the next newsletter.

The Board also decided to publish a proposal in R72-5, Solid Waste Regulation submitted by the Agency.
