Minutes of Regular Board Meeting
May 3, 1973 Chicago, Illinois

All Board Members were present.

The Board adopted an order in #71-106, Seegren, directing the Agency to issue a permit as per the order of the Appellate Court. Mr. Lawton will prepare the order which was adopted by a vote of 3-0; Mr. Henss was not present for the vote.

A motion to reconsider in #71-377, Freeman, was put over pending receipt of a response from the E.P.A.

Motion for rehearing in #72-52, 48 Insulations was put over pending receipt of response from the Respondent.

In #72-207, DuPage, motion for modification was granted 4-0, Mr. Lawton will prepare an order.

Motion to return exhibits in #72-429, Montebello was granted 4-0, Mr. Lawton will prepare an order.

In the matter of pending appeal in #72-459, Keystone, the Board determined it had no authority to act and Mr. Lawton will respond to the Office of the Attorney General.

The matter of #R72-19, proposal by Ill. Homebuilders on sewer bans was discussed and set for decision May 10, Mr. Dumelle to prepare an order.

A proposed final draft in #R72-4, Water Quality Standards Amendments was authorized for publication in the Board's Newsletter.

The Board adopted #R72-7, Air Quality Standards Revisions except for Rule 308 which was amended and authorized for publication of a proposed final draft in the Board's Newsletter. The vote was 3-0, Mr. Seaman did not participate in the discussion or vote.

In the matter of #R72-17, -18, Farm Grain Dryers, it was decided to go ahead with the hearing set for May 16 and publish a proposed final draft in the matter. Action was set for May 24 by the Board.

The Board then discussed the quotations received from court reporting firms for court reporting services and voted 4-0 to accept the quotation from the firm of Leon Golding & Associates for FY74. The Board authorized Mr. Lawton to enter into a contract on behalf of the Board pursuant to the terms of the quotation.
