MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING
JANUARY 11, 1990 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

All Board Members were present.

Board Member J. Anderson presented an Interim Order in #AC 88-76, -77, E & E Hauling. The Interim Order failed to carry by a vote of 3-4 with J. Anderson, R. Flemal and J. Marlin for it and J. Dumelle, B. Forcade, J. Theodore Meyer and M. Nardulli against it. The matter will be assigned to another Board Member.

An Interim Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-64, Gallagher Blacktop, by a vote of 6-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-138, Sam Dimaggio, by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #89-139, City of Chenoa, by a vote of 5-2. Messrs. J. Dumelle and B. Forcade dissented. (RF)

In R88-26, Safe Drinking Water Act Regulations, an Order granting an Agency motion to extend the public comment period in this matter for an additional 30 days from January 15 until February 15, 1990, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R88-26, Safe Drinking Water Act Regulations, an Order extending the time for adoption of the rules and directing that the reasons for the extension of time be published in the Illinois Register pursuant to Section 7.2 of the Environmental Protection Act, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R89-9, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (January 1, 1989 through June 30, 1989), an Order extending the time for adoption of the rules and directing that the reasons for the extension of time be published in the Illinois Register pursuant to Section 7.2 of the Environmental Protection Act, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R89-10, UST Update, USEPA Regulations (October 27, 1989 through June 30, 1989), an Order extending the time for adoption of the rules and directing that the reasons for the extension of time be published in the Illinois Register pursuant to Section 7.2 of the Environmental Protection Act, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

In R89-20, Pretreatment Corrections, an Order requesting comments directly from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), the Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) and the Attorney General before February 13, 1990, as to whether the Board ought to develop a proposal addressing the problems noted

in a letter dated October 24, 1989 (made Public Comment #1 in this docket) from the USEPA to the EPA together with a copy of a letter dated February 9, 1989 (referred to in the October 24, 1989 letter) addressing certain obstacles to approval of the pretreatment program, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint and dismiss the action in #AC 89-171, City of Paxton, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (MN)

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint and dismiss the action in #AC 89-214, Kenneth Pearson, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, the Board, on its own motion, adopted an Order advising the respondent in #AC 89-244, Ed Timmons, to disregard the Default Order entered in this case December 20, 1989 since the Board granted an Agency motion to dismiss the Administrative Citation the same day. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, Complainant's motion to amend the complaint in #AC 89-253, City of Freeport, was granted and the parties were advised that the Board will not enter a further Order in this case until the Respondent advises the Board as to whether it wishes to proceed with or withdraw its petition for review. (JM)

Agency motion to withdraw in #AC 89-271, Obediah Black, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

Agency motion to withdraw the complaint and dismiss the action in #AC 89-272, Central Illinois Tile Company, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JM)

By a vote of 7-0, Petitioner's motion to modify its permit in #85-137, Fred Jurcak, was granted and the Board directed the Agency to reissue Petitioner a permit, with a five-year duration, striking condition No. 8 and the "condominium condition" imposed November 29, 1989 effective the date the Agency reissues the NPDES permit. (MN)

By a vote of 7-0, an Agency motion for an extension of time to respond to Petitioner's motion to modify a May 9, 1986 Order in #85-212, Village of Morton, was granted until January 25, 1990. (RF)

The Board took no action on a joint motion for a general

continuance in #86-93, Jennison-Wright, since the Hearing Officer had already ruled on the motion.

An Order directing the Hearing Officer to set a reasonable discovery period and then proceed to hearing without further delay was adopted in #86-210, Hillview Farms, by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

So as to remain apprised of the proceedings in #87-105, Bloomington and Normal Sanitary District, an Order requesting the parties to file another status report on March 1, 1990 was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

By a vote of 7-0, the Board, on its own motion, dismissed the proceedings in #87-142, Indian Refining Company, for want of prosecution. (BF)

Petitioner's motion for an extension of its variance from December 31, 1989 until February 28, 1990 in #88-69, Scott Air Force Base, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (JD)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss its permit appeal in #88-189, Century Resources, was granted by a vote of 7-0. (BF)

In #88-191, Testor Corporation, these actions were taken by a vote of 5-2: petitioner's motion for clarification of the Board's findings on Condition 1 of its closure plan was granted; petitioner's motion for reconsideration of the findings on the applicability of Part 725 was granted only for purposes of clarification of the Board's November 2, 1989 decision; petitioner's motion to supplement its motion for reconsideration was denied; and the Agency's motion for reconsideration was denied.
