MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING OCTOBER 21, 1993 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning announced the resignation of Board Member B. Forcade, who will become a partner with the law firm of Jenner & Block. All Board Members were present.

An opinion and order was adopted in #91-157, People of the State of Illinois v. The Grigoleit Company, by a vote of 6-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (JA)

An opinion and order was adopted in #92-90, Robetson-Ceco, by a vote of 7-0. (GTG)

An opinion and order was adopted in #93-108, Fiatallis North America, by a vote of 4-3. R.C. Flemal, B. Forcade, and C.A. Manning dissented. (MN)

An opinion and order was adopted in #93-157, People of the State of Illinois v. Lisle Park District and R.L. Smith Construction, Inc., by a vote of 6-1. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (CAM)

In R93-4, RCRA Update, USEPA Regulations (July 1, 1992 through December 31, 1992), a supplemental opinion was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (JA)

By a vote of 6-1, Respondent's motion for reconsideration of the hearing costs was granted, and upon reconsideration, the Board affirmed its assessment of the hearing costs in its July 22, 1993 Board Order, and ordered the Respondent to pay, within 30 days, the hearing costs incurred by the Board in #AC 92-33(B), Alexander Development Company. J. Theodore Meyer dissented. (CAM)
