MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING DECEMBER 5, 1996 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS - 10:30 A.M.

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After calling the meeting to order, Chairman Manning welcomed members of the public and staff to the meeting, and announced the reappointment of Dr. Ronald C. Flemal to the Board and the Senate confirmation of newly appointed Board Member Kathleen M. Hennessey. Thereafter, the Clerk was asked for a roll call and all Board Members answered present.

Minutes of the November 21, 1996 Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 7-0.

In R97-13, Emission Reduction Market System Adoption of 35 Ill. Adm. Code 205 and Amendments to 35 Ill. Am. Code 106, an Order granting the Agency's motions for waiver of certain filing requirements and for expedited review consistent with the Board's resources and the large number of deadline driven regulatory proceedings that are currently being processed, and accepting the proposal for hearing, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. **(JY)**

In R97-15, Livestock Waste Regulations, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 506, a Proposed Rule, First Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (RCF)(CAM)(GTG)

In R97-16, Proportionate Share Liability, an Order opening the docket so that interested parties may file comments/proposals/recommendations with the Board until 4:30 p.m. March 31, 1997, was adopted by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)(KMH)(McF)

An Order granting the Agency's motion for an extension of time until 21 days after the petitioner files an amended petition to file its response, directing the petitioner to notify the Board if it does not intend to file an amended petition, advising the Agency that if the petitioner notifies the Board that it does not intend to file an amended petition, the Agency has 21 days from the date the petitioner notifies the Board to file its response, and noting that all future requests for extension of time should be directed to the hearing officer and filed with the Board, was adopted in #AS 97-3, Petition of Shell Wood River Refining Company for an Adjusted Standard from 35 III. Adm. Code 725.213 and 725.321, by a vote of 7-0. (JY)

An Order finding that the respondent violated Section 21(p)(4) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, and assessing a \$500.00 penalty, was adopted in #AC 97-30, County of Will v. James Henke, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order finding that the respondent violated Section 21(p)(1) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, and assessing a \$500.00 penalty, was adopted in #AC 97-31, County of Vermilion v. Emery Johnson, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order finding that the respondent violated Sections 21(p)(1) and 21(p)(6) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, and assessing a \$1,000.00 penalty, was adopted in #AC 97-32, County of Will v. Vito Caprio, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order finding that the respondent violated Section 21(p)(1) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, and assessing a \$500.00 penalty, was adopted in #AC 97-33, County of Macon v. David Scott, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

This Administrative Citation was accepted by the Board: #97-43, County of Jackson v. James Qualls.

An Order granting the Complainant's motion for leave to amend the complaint, was adopted in #94-373, People of the State of Illinois v. Wayne Berger and Berger Waste Management, Inc., by a vote of 7-0. (McF)

An Order granting the respondent's motion to file instanter a partial stipulation and proposal for settlement and an agreed motion to request relief from hearing requirement, and directing the Clerk of the Board to cause publication of the parties' request for relief from the hearing requirement, was adopted in #95-163, People of the State of Illinois v. Clark Refining and Marketing, Inc., by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order denying the respondents' motion for reconsideration, granting the respondents' motion for clarification of the Board's August 1, 1996 order, and advising the respondents that if they intend to file an answer to all allegations in the amended complaint, such answer is to be filed on or before December 23, 1996, to insure that the matter expeditiously proceeds to hearing, was adopted in #96-143, People of the State of Illinois v. Michel Grain Company, Inc., d/b/a Michel Grain Fertilizer, and Caryle Michel, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained and Board Member M. McFawn concurred. (CAM)

An Order granting the joint motion to stay the proceedings until February 3, 1997, to allow further negotiation of the currently pending stipulation and proposal for settlement, was adopted in #96-147, People of the State of Illinois v. Illinois Cement Company, by a vote of 6-0. Board Member K.M. Hennessey abstained. (CAM)

An Order directing the Clerk of the Board to cause publication of the required newspaper notice of the parties agreed motion to request relief from hearing requirement, was adopted in #96-260, People of the State of Illinois v. Pipe and Piling Supplies (U.S.A.), Ltd., by a vote of 7-0. (GTG)

An Order accepting the petitioner's amended petition for hearing, and directing the petitioner to submit to the Board and the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, within 14 days of the date of the entry of the entry of the Order, an estimate of the VOM emissions level at the proposed production rate of 800 pallets per month, was adopted in #97-58, W.R. Meadows, Inc. v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (McF)

An Order extending the 35-day appeal period, reserving the docket for any appeal which may be filed by the petitioner, noting that in the event that the petitioner fails to file an appeal on or before January 21, 1997, the Board will dismiss the docket as unnecessary, and advising the petitioner that a \$75.00 filing fee will be required at such time as the petitioner files a petition, was adopted in #97-91, Land and Lakes Company v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

Mandatory hearings will be held in these cases: ##97-92, People of the State of Illinois v. Victory G. Heuermann; 97-93, People of the State of Illinois v. Ashland, Inc., 97-95, People of the State of Illinois v. City of Sterling.

An Order accepting the matter for hearing, was adopted in #97-96, Shell Oil Company v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)

An Order extending the 35-day appeal period, reserving the docket for any appeal which may be filed by the petitioner, noting that in the event that the petitioner fails to file an appeal on or before January 21, 1997, the Board will dismiss the docket as unnecessary, and advising the petitioner that a \$75.00 filing fee will be required at such time as the petitioner files a petition, was adopted in #97-97, OK Service Center v. IEPA, by a vote of 7-0. (CAM)
