**MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING
JULY 9, 1992 CHICAGO, ILLINOIS**

All Board Members were present save Dr. G. Tanner Girard who was on vacation.

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #91-193, Park Crematory, Inc., by a vote of 5-0. J. Anderson abstained. (BF)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #92-42, Burwell Oil Service, by a vote of 4-2. R.C. Flemal and B. Forcade dissented. (MN)

An Opinion and Order was adopted in #92-49, Bernard Miller, by a vote of 6-0. (JTM)

In R89-14(C), Groundwater Quality Standards, a Proposed Rule, Second Notice, Opinion and Order was adopted by a vote of 6-0. (RCF)

A Default Order was adopted in this Administrative Citation by a vote of 6-0. #92-39, Leslie Norman Fred, Sr..

An Order granting Petitioner leave to file its completed demonstration instantaneously with fewer than nine copies of the attachments and duplicated on other than recycled paper, ordering Petitioner to submit a written filing that expressly requests or waives a public hearing no later than the date upon which its response to the Agency's recommendation is due, advising Petitioner that its notice of newspaper publication is due on or before July 6, 1992, advising the Agency that its recommendation is due on or before July 25, 1992, advising the parties that the Board will delay accepting the petition until the Petitioner has filed the notice of publication, and that the Board will defer setting the matter for hearing until 21 days after publication of the newspaper notice of filing and after the parties have completed their respective filings, was adopted in #AS 91-10, Cabot Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Petitioner's motion to substitute a corrected Attachment #5, the affidavit of Joseph N. Brewster to the amended petition and response to the Agency's variance recommendation, was granted in #90-27, Shell Oil Company, by a vote of 6-0 (JA)

An Order directing the hearing officer to schedule the matter for hearing on or before July 24 and to complete the hearing on or before August 24, 1992, and further directing the hearing officer to defer the hearing and order the filing of a status report if an appropriate waiver is filed on or before July 24, 1992, was adopted in #90-214, Quantum Chemical Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

An Order directing the parties to file an updated status report on or before September 15, 1992 in the event that no hearing has been scheduled in the matter at that time, was adopted in #90-244, General Electric Company, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

Agency motion to file the Record Instantly was granted in #91-38, American Waste Processing, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

An Order directing the parties to file an updated status report on or before October 1, 1992, was adopted in #91-71, Douglas Furniture, by a vote of 5-0. B. Forcade abstained. (JCM)

An Order directing the parties to file an updated status report on or before August 10, 1992, was adopted in #91-94, Safety-Kleen Corporation, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

Agency motion for leave to appear for Carol F. Barry, was granted in #91-206, Clayton Chemical Company, by a vote of 6-0. (JA)

Petitioner's motion to withdraw its appeal was granted in #91-250, Pekin Energy Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Complainants' motion to withdraw its emergency motion to dismiss with leave to reinstate was granted in #92-26, Dale & Deborah Dettlaff, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Petitioner's motion to dismiss was granted in #92-28, CSX Transportation, by a vote of 6-0. (MN)

Petitioner's motion for voluntary withdrawal of its appeal was granted in #92-43, Safety-Kleen, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

Agency motion to extend the time to file the Record was granted until August 31, 1992 in #92-61, Ethyl Petroleum Additives, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

Agency motion to extend the time to file the Agency's Recommendation was granted until August 14, 1992 in #92-78, Amoco Chemical Company, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

Respondent's agreed motion for an extension of time in which to answer the complaint was referred to the hearing officer for disposition.

representatives of respondents by the three attorneys from the firm of Karanganis & White, was construed by the Board as also withdrawing the July 7, 1992 motion to dismiss or stay, and held for duplicitous/frivolous determination, **Order by J. Theodore Meyer**; 92-92, North Shore Sanitary District v. EPA, additional information requested, **Order by B. Forcade**; 92-94, Marsco Manufacturing Company v. EPA, accepted for hearing, **Order by B. Forcade**; 92-95, People of the State of Illinois v. Simplex, Inc., hearing mandatory.

In other new cases these actions were taken by a vote of 5-1: 92-98, Reichhold Chemicals, Inc. v. EPA, accepted for hearing, B. Forcade dissented, **Order by M. Nardulli**; 92-99, A.B. Dick Company, accepted for hearing, B. Forcade dissented, **Order by J. Anderson**.

A provisional variance was granted in new case #92-100, United States Postal Service v. EPA, by a vote of 6-0. (JCM)

These Administrative Citations were accepted by the Board: #92-50, Logan County Health Department v. Lincoln/Logan Landfill, Inc.; 92-51, EPA v. John McCullum and Nina J. McCullum; 92-52, Logan County Health Department v. Lincoln/Logan Landfill, Inc.; 92-53, Sangamon County v. Illinois Central Railroad Company.

Because a Petition for Review was filed, this Administrative Citation will be set for hearing: #92-41, Lakewood Homes & Development Company.

This amended Adjusted Standard was accepted by the Board: #AS 92-3, Jefferson Smurfit Corporation.

In new Adjusted Standards these actions were taken by a vote of 6-0: #92-5, Petition of D & L Landfill, Inc. and D & L Disposal, Inc., accepted for hearing and Petitioner directed to address certain questions and issues at hearing, **Order by J. Anderson**; 92-7, Petition of Illinois Power Company (Vermilion Power Station), Petitioner's motion for waiver of present submission of verifying affidavits denied and held to July 30 for possible consideration, **Order by J. Anderson**.

Minutes of the June 23, 1992 Meeting were approved by a vote of 6-0.

Minutes of the June 26, 1992 Special Board Meeting were approved by a vote of 4-0. R.C. Flemal and J.C. Marlin abstained.


Petitioner's motion to withdraw its petition for review was granted in #90-198, Commonwealth Edison Company, by a vote of 6-0. (BF)

An Order denying an agreed motion to continue the hearing, but authorizing the hearing officer to continue the hearing in the event an appropriate waiver of the Board's decision date is

received, was adopted in #91-18, Illinois Central Railroad (Centralia Facility), by a vote of 6-0. JCM)

All other matters not disposed of as listed were ordered held to July 30, 1992 for possible consideration.
