A Proposed Rule, Second Notice Order was adopted in R83-36, Ford Motor Company, by a vote of 5-0.

A First Notice Order was adopted in R84-9, RCRA and UIC Update, by a vote of 5-0.

A Final Opinion was adopted in R84-10, RCRA Procedural Rules, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Forcade concurred.

An Order to correct the formula in R84-22A and B, Financial Assurance for Waste Disposal Facilities, was adopted by a vote of 5-0.

Request for stay was denied in #81-151, Dean Foods, by a vote of 5-0. Mr. Forcade will prepare an Order.
