AFTERNOON SESSION

Mrs. Anderson presented a draft Order in new case #86-60, Illinois Department of Transportation, City of Lake Forest. Motion to ammend by B. Forcade lost by a 3-3 vote with B. Forcade, J. Dumelle and R. Flemal for it and J. Anderson, J. Theodore Meyer and W. Nega against; J. Marlin abstained. A last filing by the City received during the noon recess was considered prior to a vote being taken. An Order, authorizing the Chairman to sign the permit document, was adopted by a vote of 5-1 with J. Marlin abstaining, B. Forcade dissenting and J. Dumelle, R. Flemal and J. Theodore Meyer concurring. After the vote, the riparian owners made an additional filing, having been apparently unaware of the City's noon filing until the meeting reconvened. The Board on its own motion by a 5-1 vote; Mr. Dumelle dissented, reopened the case to consider the owner's latest filing. Board readopted its Order, all Members voting as they did initially. (JA)
