Complainant seeks a substantial civil penalty against the Respondent in the sum of at

least \$200,000.00 and in support of such request states as follows:

TITLE XII Sec. 42 (h) in determining the appropriate civil penalty to be imposed under subdivisions (a), (b) (1), (b) (2), (b) (3), or (b) (5) of the Section, the Board is authorized to consider any matters of record in mitigation or aggravation of penalty including but no limited to the following factors:

(1) the duration and gravity of the violation;

Respondent operated an illegal solid waste management site without necessary permits and failed to comply with safety measures required by IEPA for approximately four years.

See Motion for Summary Judgment, Page 3, Paragraph 4.

Hazardous waste remained on the land for a period of between 13 and 18 years.

The volume of hazardous waste is substantial.

See Hearing Exhibits 4 and 13

The cost of remediation was in excess of \$600,000.00.

See Hearing Exhibits 1 and 2.

(2) the presence or absence of due diligence on the part of the violator in attempting to comply with the requirements of this Act and regulations thereunder or to secure relief therefrom as provided by this Act.

Respondent did nothing to determine compliance with law and maintains in the face of the Board's Summary Judgment opinion that he was not in violation.

(3) any economic benefits accrued by the violator because of delay in compliance with requirements.

Respondent saved more than \$110,000.00

Respondent collected at least \$220,317.88 for his illegal operations.

(4) the amount of monetary penalty which will serve to deter further violations by the violator and to otherwise aid in enhancing voluntary compliance with this Act by the violator and other persons similarly subject to the Act.

Respondent is recalcitrant and insists that he did nothing wrong. Therefore a substantial penalty will indicate to the Respondent that he must comply with the IEPA should he continue his metal reclaiming business, which he is currently doing.

Respondent claims to be without assets. Being judgment proof it is unlikely that he will actually pay any civil penalty imposed.

However the existence of a substantial judgment for civil penalties would deter him from securing financing necessary for continuing or expanding his illegal metal reclaiming business. It is also unlikely that the civil penalty judgment could be discharged in bankruptcy. This would further assure that Respondent will be deterred.

A civil penalty of at least \$200,000.00 would give a strong deterrent message to others like Respondent who chooses to ignore the IEPA.
